After calling the meeting to order, Judge Blanchette stated "it is the practice of the court to exercise an invocation followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag. Anyone who may not be comfortable with the practice may wish to step out into the hall and rejoin once the portion of the agenda begins with public comments." Commissioner Blacksher delivered the invocation and then led the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

CONSENT AGENDA:

A motion was made by Commissioner Marshall and seconded by Commissioner Blacksher to receive the minutes of July 11, 2022. Commissioner Blacksher, Commissioner Sturrock, Commissioner Marshall and Commissioner Hudson all voted yes and none voted no.

Monthly Reports: were approved on August 8, 2022

RESOLUTIONS/PROCLAMATIONS/ORDERS: none

CONSIDER/APPROVE/INFORMATIONAL:

Item I.- Martin Gonzales, District Engineer with Texas Department of Transportation, introduced the deputy district engineer, Dave Collins, area engineer and Jay Castleberry, maintenance supervisor. Commissioner Sturrock thanked Jay Castleberry (maintenance supervisor) for a good working relationship and assistance. Commissioner Marshall inquired about FM255 closure causing heavy traffic on a county road. The reply was that weather had delayed the completion and re-opening of the highway. Commissioner Hudson inquired about FM2992. The reply was that it "is on the list". Judge Blanchette expressed his thanks for assistance in a traffic light.

Budget Amendment/Line-Item Transfers were not presented.

A motion was made by Commissioner Marshall and seconded by Commissioner Blacksher to approve accounts payable/county bills. Commissioner Blacksher, Commissioner Sturrock, Commissioner Marshall and Commissioner Hudson all voted yes, and none voted no.

Commissioner Blacksher motioned to approve the "Order of Election" for the November 8, 2022 Local Option Election to prevent cattle from running at large in Precinct #1, as required by Article XVI, Section 65 of the Texas Constitution. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Sturrock. Commissioner Blacksher, Commissioner Sturrock, Commissioner Marshall and Commissioner Hudson all voted yes, and none voted no. SEE ATTACHED

A motion was made by Commissioner Hudson to approve a Texas Department of Emergency Management Liaison Officer for Tyler County; and to support coordination of programs and resources with Tyler County at no cost to the County. Commissioner Sturrock seconded the motion. Commissioner Sturrock explained this action is to support having a state salaried liaison officer, if one becomes available, to assist the County Judge and Ken Jobe. Commissioner Blacksher, Commissioner Sturrock, Commissioner Marshall and Commissioner Hudson all voted yes, and none voted no.

Commissioner Marshall motioned to approve the yearly renewal for Mobile Texas additional license for full-time user with Kologik for Constable Precinct 3. Commissioner Sturrock seconded the motion. Commissioner Blacksher, Commissioner Sturrock, Commissioner Marshall and Commissioner Hudson all voted yes, and none voted no. SEE ATTACHED

A motion was made by Commissioner Marshall to approve the yearly maintenance renewal with Tyler Technologies for County Treasurer and County Auditor's financial software. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hudson. Commissioner Blacksher, Commissioner Sturrock, Commissioner Marshall and Commissioner Hudson all voted yes, and none voted no. SEE ATTACHED

A motion was made by Commissioner Blacksher to assist the Tyler County Firefighters Association with a radio equipment purchase. Commissioner Sturrock seconded the motion. Judge Blanchette reported the cost for coax cable was approximately \$5600 and that \$4100-\$4600 in funds were available from emergency management budget. Commissioner Sturrock stated that if the Emergency Management Budget gets low due to this action, he would be for reimbursing the funds. Commissioner Blacksher, Commissioner Sturrock, Commissioner Marshall and Commissioner Hudson all voted yes, and none voted no. SEE ATTACHED

Commissioner Blacksher motioned to enter into a Voluntary Contribution Agreement with Tyler County Fireman's Association to fund the Association's tower rental to be paid out of radio tower rental line-item. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Marshall. The cost will be \$1680 to SHECO. Commissioner Blacksher, Commissioner Sturrock, Commissioner Marshall and Commissioner Hudson all voted yes, and none voted no. SEE ATTACHED

Judge Blanchette motioned to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding between Texas Emergency Management Assistance Team, EMC Ken Jobe and Tyler County to allow the Emergency Management Coordinator to become a member of the Disaster Recovery Task Force. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Sturrock. This would give Ken Jobe the authority to assist in disasters in other parts of Texas, according to his skill set. Commissioner Blacksher, Commissioner Sturrock, Commissioner Marshall and Commissioner Hudson all voted yes, and none voted no.

COMMENTS BY COURT MEMBERS PERTAINING TO MATTERS OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT: Judge Blanchette- appreciative of the amount of rain received recently, lifted the burn ban. Commissioner Marshall stated he had asked the County Auditor to figure salaries at a \$3000 increase for each employee versus the previous proposed \$2000 considering "how everything has gone up"; also, changing the salary base of the county judge to the same as the commissioners and use it toward these salary increases.

EXECUTIVE SESSION was not held

A motion was made by Commissioner Marshall and seconded Commissioner Sturrock that the meeting be adjourned. Commissioners Blacksher, Sturrock, Marshall and Hudson voted yes and none no.

LEASE AGREEMENT RADIO TOWER LEASE

THE STATE OF TEXAS COUNTY OF POLK

> In consideration of the covenants herein contained between Tyler County Fireman's Association herein referred to as Tyler County Fireman's Association, and SAM HOUSTON ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE, INC., herein referred to as Sam Houston Electric or SHECO, the parties mutually agree as follows:

- A. Sam Houston Electric hereby grants non-exclusive permission to Tyler County Fireman's Association to install, repair, maintain and operate radio communications equipment described in table 1 below, and utilize the antenna support structure systems (known as "tower") owned and operated at the location by Sam Houston Electric in connection with Sam Houston Electric's existing radio equipment. Sam Houston Electric will make available to Tyler County Fireman's Association the following:
 - Space on a suitable tower for the mounting of listed antenna systems for (1) Tyler County Fireman's Association 's Radio communications system and space for all necessary transmission lines.
 - Access to the tower site and tower. (2)
 - Electric power supply is included in the monthly rate. (3)
 - (4) Tower space requirements are shown in table 1.
- B. Rental space for a total of ONE (1) antennas/dishes and associated hardware at SHECO's Woodville tower site. The monthly rate charged for this is \$140 per antenna for a total of \$140 per month.

Should the Lease be terminated as herein provided, other than by lapse of time, all obligations to pay rent under the terms of this Lease shall be made only to the date of such termination.



- Lease will be for a term of sixty (60) months, commencing on August 1, 2022 and C. expiring July 31, 2027. Either party shall have the right for any reason to cancel and terminate this Lease by giving written notice ninety (90) days prior to cancellation.
- D. It is further understood and agreed that Tyler County Fireman's Association 's equipment, its installation, maintenance, and operation will in no way damage the building or tower structure or interfere with the maintenance of Sam Houston Electric's facility, including the tower structure and tower lighting system. In such event, this Lease may, at Sam Houston Electric's option, terminate by giving Tyler County Fireman's Association ten (10) days prior written notice thereof.
- Ε. Tyler County Fireman's Association agrees to take any necessary precautions, by the installation of protective equipment or otherwise, to protect all persons and property against injury or damage that may result from Tyler County Fireman's Association 's use of the tower. If, in Sam Houston Electric's judgment, Tyler County Fireman's Association has not taken such necessary precautions. Sam Houston Electric shall have the right by written notice to Tyler County Fireman's Association to terminate the permission herein granted by giving Tyler County Fireman's Association ten (10) days' notice thereof. Sam Houston Electric shall not be in any way responsible for any person or entity for the adequacy or inadequacy of such precautions of Tyler County Fireman's Association and in that regard, Tyler County Fireman's Association agrees to indemnify and to save and hold Sam Houston Electric harmless for all costs, expenses and liabilities resulting from such inadequate precautions or the negligent operation of Tyler County Fireman's Association 's equipment and other property.
- F. Tyler County Fireman's Association agrees to install radio equipment of a type and frequency which will not cause interference to the facility and does hereby agree to make no change in equipment of frequency without prior approval of Sam Houston Electric. In the event Tyler County Fireman's Association 's equipment causes interference. Tyler County Fireman's Association immediately take all steps necessary to correct and eliminate the interference. If said interference cannot be eliminated within a length of time, not to exceed thirty (30) days, Tyler County Fireman's Association agrees to remove its equipment from Sam Houston Electric's property and this lease shall then terminate without further obligation on either part except as may be specifically enumerated herein.
- G. Sam Houston Electric shall not be liable to Tyler County Fireman's Association for any interference or interruption to service of Tyler County Fireman's Association, regardless of whether such interference or interruption is caused by the negligence of Sam Houston Electric or by any other cause including, but not limited to, any interference with or interruption to the signals, messages and other communications and transmissions, or for interference with the operation of the equipment of Tyler County Fireman's Association, or for any damage or injury to such equipment.

- H. Tyler County Fireman's Association shall exercise special precautions to avoid damage to facilities of Sam Houston Electric and Tyler County Fireman's Association hereby assumes all responsibility and agrees to make payment for any and all such damage so caused by Tyler County Fireman's Association, its contractors, or the employees of either, to property of Sam Houston Electric. Tyler County Fireman's Association shall make an immediate report to Sam Houston Electric of the occurrence of any such damage, and hereby agrees to reimburse Sam Houston Electric for the reasonable expense incurred in making necessary repairs or replacements.
- I. Tyler County Fireman's Association agrees to, at all times, indemnify, provide defense for, reimburse and hold harmless Sam Houston Electric, its predecessors, successors, subsidiaries and affiliates, now existing or those existing in the future. and their respective directors, officers, employees, agents and representatives from and against all suits, actions, causes of action or claims of any character, type or description brought or made for or on account of, and all losses and damages arising, directly or indirectly, from (a) damage or injury to property of Sam Houston Electric. (b) personal or bodily injuries or deaths of any person, including, but not limited to employees of Tyler County Fireman's Association, subcontractors (and their employees) of Tyler County Fireman's Association, or (c) any other type of injury or damage sustained by any person, any or all of which arise out of or result, directly or indirectly, from the negligent operations of Tyler County Fireman's Association, or its subcontractors, or the employees of either, or any other person or entity performing work of any kind on behalf of the Tyler County Fireman's Association. The specific acts or consequences of acts of Tyler County Fireman's Association falling within Tyler County Fireman's Association 's operation include, but are not limited to, installing, inspecting, and/or repairing Tyler County Fireman's Association 's equipment or the presence of Tyler County Fireman's Association 's subcontractors or employees of either, in the vicinity of Sam Houston Electric's facilities or equipment.

It is the intention of both parties to this agreement that the indemnification provided by Tyler County Fireman's Association to Sam Houston Electric in this article shall apply to the proportionate extent of Tyler County Fireman's Association's negligence, whether or not the losses, liability, claims, demands or suits covered hereunder arise in part from the concurring negligence of Sam Houston Electric, its predecessors, successors, subsidiaries and affiliates, now existing or those existing in the future, and their respective directors, officers, employees, agents or representatives. The provisions of this article are severable and invalidity or ineffectiveness, of such, of any word, phrase or sentence shall not impair the validity and effectiveness of all remaining words, phrases and sentences in this section.

- J. Sam Houston Electric will not grant a Lease to any other party for use of this property if such grant would in any way affect or interfere with Tyler County Fireman's Association's use of the property.
- K. Sam Houston Electric agrees to maintain the tower and equipment house in proper operating condition. Cost of lighting, painting and repair to Sam Houston Electric's property shall be borne by Sam Houston Electric. Tyler County Fireman's Association agrees to provide and maintain its property and equipment in satisfactory condition as to appearance and safety, and to make any repairs to Sam Houston Electric's property that Tyler County Fireman's Association has damaged.
- L. All installations and operation in connection with this tower, either by Sam Houston Electric or by Tyler County Fireman's Association, shall meet with all applicable Rules and Regulations of the Federal Communications Commission, Federal Aviation Authority, and Electrical codes of the city or Tyler County Fireman's Association and state concerned. Under this Lease, Sam Houston Electric assumes no responsibility of the licensing, operation and/or maintenance of Tyler County Fireman's Association 's radio equipment. Tyler County Fireman's Association has the responsibility of carrying out the terms of FCC License with respect to tower light observation and notification to FAA.
- M. Sam Houston Electric agrees that pre-approved Tyler County Fireman's Association personnel/contractors shall have access to the tower for the purpose of installing the radio equipment and, during the continuation of this Lease, free ingress and egress to said tower is hereby granted to Tyler County Fireman's Association for the purpose of maintenance and repair of its equipment. This ingress and egress shall be subject to the requirements of Sam Houston Electric as stated in the SITE ACCESS AGREEMENT. It is agreed, however, that only authorized engineers or employees of Tyler County Fireman's Association, FCC inspectors, or person under direct supervision will be permitted to enter said property.
- N. Sam Houston Electric shall be responsible for the declaration and payment of any applicable taxes or assessments against the property owned by Sam Houston Electric.
- O. It is agreed by and between the parties that Sam Houston Electric is not an insurer, that the payments of rental by Tyler County Fireman's Association herein provided are based solely on the value of the services and facilities provided in the Lease agreement. It is further agreed that Sam Houston Electric shall not be liable to Tyler County Fireman's Association for damages to Tyler County Fireman's Association 's property caused by acts of God, or other acts beyond the control of Sam Houston Electric although Sam Houston Electric shall exercise due diligence to restore services and facilities regardless of the nature of such cause.

- P. All obligations, as well as all rights and privileges contained herein shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto, their heirs, successors and assigns. However, Tyler County Fireman's Association shall not, in any event, assign this Lease without prior written approval of Sam Houston Electric. Sam Houston Electric acknowledges that Tyler County Fireman's Association 's interest in this Lease is automatically assigned as collateral to Tyler County Fireman's Association 's lender, the Rural Utilities Service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture.
- Q. Tyler County Fireman's Association is to make arrangements for installation of any control lines as may be required for operation of Tyler County Fireman's Association's radio equipment.
- R. In the event of Tyler County Fireman's Association 's default in the payment of rentals or Tyler County Fireman's Association 's failure to comply with any other provision of this Lease, Sam Houston Electric may at its option terminate this Lease upon three (3) days written notice to Tyler County Fireman's Association, and without affecting its right to sue or otherwise collect for all past due rentals and any other damages to which Sam Houston Electric may be lawfully entitled.
