A motion was made by Comm. Fowler and seconded by Comm. Parks that the County Judge be authorized an expenses account to feed various visitors and that the tickets of these be turned into the County. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Parks and seconded by Comm. Best that all approved bills be paid as authorized by the County Auditor. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Fowler and seconded by Comm. Best that the Tax Office take bids on a calculator. Comms. Parks, Best and Fowler voted yes, Comm. Jordan voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Fowler and seconded by Comm. Best that Comm. Parks be authorized a \$75.00 per month allowence for use of a Pickup. All voted yes, none voted no.
