Jim Haralson spoke to the Court on Solid Waste Disposal Program and his report is amde a part of the minutes.

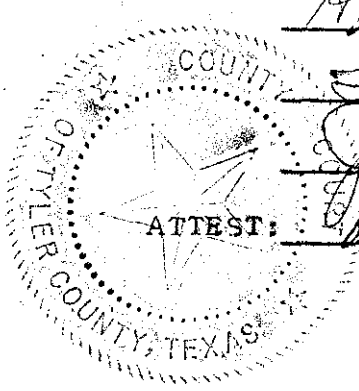
A report from George P. Bane Company was also made a part of the minutes.







Judge Tom D. Mann and I went to Austin on February 24, 1972 for an appointment with the engineers of the Department of Health and the Water Quality Board to get definite clarification of the type soil these two agencies require a county wide solid waste landfill be placed in; as the basic aims of the two, at least in Tyler County soil, could be practically considered in conflict. This appointment had been arranged by J. C. Davis, Assistant General.


We met in the Water Quality Board office from about 9:30 until 11:15 A. M. with Mr. Jodie Gaither and Mr. Robert G. Makela, Engineers for the WQB and Mr. David L. Houston, Engineer for the Health Department. After having Tyler County conditions as to "tight clay", sandy clay and shallow sub-surface ground water explained to them by Judge Mann and I to the best of our abilities, they, in consensus, agreed that the Department of Health aims, i. e. to minimize flies, rodents, mosquitoes, odors, etc., should be paramount, but with care taken to locate the land fill as far as practical from existing shallow wells and ground water seeps or baygalls.

After lunch, from about 1:00 until 2:00 P. M., we met with Mr. T. C. Davis in the Attorney General's office and after having the county's problem fully explained to him, he assured us there was no way for the County to finance the solid waste program except by raising the tax assessment base from its present 15% of market value. He suggested that the equipment be bought out of the road and bridge fund, the land and fixed property out of the permanent improvements fund and the operating expense out of the general fund, and that the tax increase be divided among the three funds to this end; in lieu of this the full court can consolidate the four constitutional funds.

The County solid waste disposal act H. B. 727 of the 62nd Legislature, effective August 30, 1971 gives the county authority to do just about anything they want to on the solid waste problem. It just does not tell how to finance it. We were given a copy of the Department of Health Act by Mr. Houston of the Department of Health. It must have been this Department's bill because no one else we talked to had ever heard of it.


