At the Meeting of the Tyler County Commissioner's Court held on the above date and time, all members were present and the Meeting opened with a prayer.

A motion was made by Comm. Jordan and seconded by Comm. Parks to approve and accept the plat of Timberlake Subdivision off of the Hillister, Spurger Highway for filing purposes only, and it was designated as plat number 184. Mr. Kennedy from the Health Department approved the sanitation of the Subdivision. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Parks and seconded by Comm. Belt to approve the paying of the bills as submitted by the auditor's office. See the attached bills. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Best and seconded by Comm. Belt to set the salaries of 1975 for the County officials and employees the same as 1974. See the attached salary schedule. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Best and seconded by Comm. Belt to table the resolution concerning the radio equipment for the Sheriff's office with the Deep Eastex Council of Governments. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Jordan and seconded by Comm. Belt to approve the Amendment to the Tyler County 1974 budget. See the attached amendment. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Belt and seconded by Comm. Best to approve Hilda Coats as a part-time deputy in the District Clerk's office. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Parks and seconded by Comm. Belt to approve the monthly reports of the County Extension office. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Jordan and seconded by Comm. Belt to approve the \$3,000 Tax Exemption for persons 65 and over in the payment of County taxes. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Best and seconded by Comm. Belt to approve the bid of Lufkin Typewriter Company for two typewriters in the Tax Office, this being the lowest bid. See the attached bids. All voted yes, none voted no. This will be paid through the Revenue Fund.

The Meeting recessed until 9:00 A.M. Tuesday January 14.

The Tyler County Commissioner's Court reopened at 9:30 a.m. on January 14. All members were present and the Meeting opened with a prayer.

A motion was made by Comm. Best and seconded by Comm. Parks to set the number of employees for 1975 as the same as it was for 1974. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Parks and seconded by Comm. Best to set sick leave, vacation time and holidays the same as last year. The holidays are as follows:

A motion was made by Comm. Best and seconded by Comm. Jordan to set the fire department payments the same as last year and to add Dam B Fire Department to the list. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Parks and seconded by Comm. Jordan to issue a call for inventories of all offices and that this inventory be due the tenth of February 1975. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Parks and seconded by Comm. Belt to appoint the following election Judges and alternates for 1975. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Jordan and seconded by Comm. Parks to set the election hours for Tyler County and to open at 8:00 a.m. and to close at 7:00 p.m. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Parks and seconded by Comm. Belt that the County advertise for bids for gas, oil, and grease. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Jordan and seconded by Comm. Belt to appoint the following people on the Tyler County Grievance Committee as per list drawn from the 1974 Grand Jury List.

All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Parks and seconded by Comm. Jordan to renew the contract with Irene Amacker to feed the prisoners at the Tyler County jail at the same price as last year. All voted yes, none voted no. The City will be billed each month for their cost.

A motion was made by Comm. Best and seconded by Comm. Belt to authorize the Tax Collector to advertise the bids to prepare the tax roll. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Jordan and seconded by Comm. Belt to resolve that all elected officials of Tyler County be paid on a salary basis on 1975. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Jordan and seconded by Comm. Belt to allocate the first quarter Revenue check of \$42,274 and to use 10,500 dollars to operate the Tax Office for the first three months period and the

balance would be set aside in an interest, paying a fund for the construction of a jail. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Parks and seconded by Comm. Best to set the terms of the Tyler County Court as follows:
January terms, April term, July term, and the October term
All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Best and seconded by Comm. Jordan to appoint J.B. Coffman as chairman of the Tyler County Historical Committee and to allow him to appoint the various chairmen of the committee. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Jordan and seconded by Comm. Parks to table the consideration of insurance for the Courthouse for further study. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Jordan and seconded by Comm. Best to approve payment out of the Revenue Sharing of \$5,000 to the Tyler County 4-H Club as was previously allocated. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Jordan and seconded by Comm. Best to approve the application of the District and County Clerk's to attend the seminar at Texas A&M on February 25, 26, and 27 1975 and to pay their expenses. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Belt and seconded by Comm. Jordan to accept bids on the Stafford Lowden Company on distributive sheets for the County Treasurers office. See the attached bids. All voted yes, none voted no.

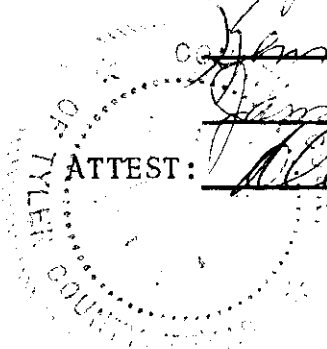
A motion was made by Comm. Belt and seconded by Comm. Jordan to set the regulations concerning hospitalization insurance as follows, that in order for a person to be eligible for insurance, they must be on the County payroll and if he is being paid by two counties, Tyler County must pay it's share of insurance based on the salary that is paid. For, Comm. Jordan, and Comm. Belt. Against, Comm. Parks, Comm. Best and Judge Mann. Motion lost.

A motion was made by Comm. Best and seconded by Comm. Parks to set the regulations concerning hospitalization insurance as follows, that in order for a person to be eligible for insurance, they must be on the County payroll and if he is being paid by two counties, Tyler County must pay it's share of insurance based on the salary that is paid. However, that the County School Superintendent be allowed on the County's insurance because his predecessor in office was on the County's hospitalization insurance. For, Comm. Parks, Best, Judge Mann. Against, Comm. Belt and Comm. Jordan. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Comm. Parks and seconded by Comm. Jordan that the County School Superintendent pay the cost of his own bond and that his office expenses not be paid by Tyler County. All voted yes, none voted no.

A motion was made by Comm. Best and seconded by Comm. Parks to set the automobile allowance for officials the same as last year and to put the Justice of the Peace, Pct. #1 on the list. All voted yes, none voted no.

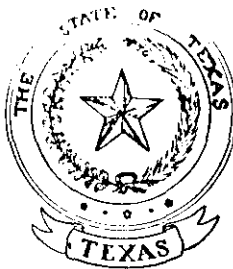



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
