BE IT KNOWN THAT I, Dolph Briscoe, Governor of the State of Texas, do hereby order a Special Election to be held throughout the State of Texas on Tuesday, April 22, 1975, and notice is hereby given to the people as required by law. The County Judge of each county is directed to cause said election to be held throughout the county on such date in the manner required by law.

Said SPECIAL ELECTION IS ORDERED for the purpose of adopting or rejecting the following proposed Constitutional Amendments submitted by the 64th Legislature of Texas at its Regular Session in 1975.

- No. 1. The constitutional amendment revising and consolidating provisions relating to state and local retirement systems and programs and providing for a maximum state contribution to state systems of ten percent of the aggregate compensation paid to individuals.
- No. 2. The constitutional amendment setting the salaries of members of the legislature at \$600 per month and setting a per diem of \$30 per day during legislative sessions and a mileage allowance at the same rate provided by law for state employees.
