The regular meeting of the Commissioner's Court for December 8, 1975, was opened with a prayer with all members present.

A motion was made by Commissioner Best and seconded by Commissioner Jordan to pay the regular County employees a \$50.00 Christmas bonus and employees on various programs connected with the County a \$25.00 bonus. All voted yes and none voted no.

Commissioner Parks made a motion which was seconded by Commissioner Belt to close the County Solid Waste Disposal Dump from Friday at 5:00 P.M. until Monday at 8:00 A.M. and publish this notice in the paper, noting the opening and closing schedule. Monday through Friday the Solid Waste Disposal Dump will be open from 8:00 A.M. until 5:00 P.M. and will be closed on the weekend. This order will become effective January 1, 1976. All voted yes and none voted no.

Commissioner Best made a motion to re-appoint Dr. John Q. Gilchrist as County Health Officer for Tyler County. Commissioner Parks seconded this motion. All voted yes and none voted no.

Commissioner Belt made the motion to approve the payment of the monthly bills as submitted and approved by the County Auditor. This was seconded by Commissioner Best. All voted yes and none voted no. See attached list.

A motion was made by Commissioner Belt and seconded by Commissioner Best to approve the County Treasurer's report for November, 1975. All voted yes and none voted no. See attached copy.

Commissioner Parks made a motion to approve the County Extension Service report. This was seconded by Commissioner Belt. All voted yes and none voted no.

Commissioner Best made a motion to authorize the Sheriff to take bids on building a locked room in the Sheriff's office in which to place evidence in Court cases. The bids will be acted upon at the next regular meeting of the Commissioner's Court. This was seconded by Commissioner Parks. All voted yes and none voted no.

Commissioner Best made a motion which was seconded by Commissioner Belt, to agree to participate with the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation on a Pavement Marking Demonstration Program. See attached resolution. All voted yes and none voted no.

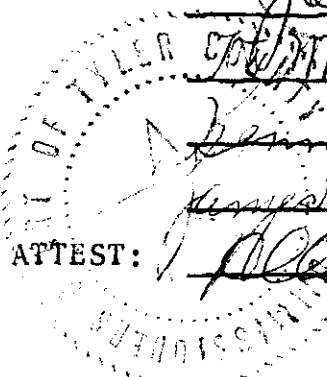
Commissioner Best made a motion to accept the bid of Moore Brothers Construction Co. of Lufkin in the amount of \$74,399.90 on the Airport Improvement Project. This will be done on the recommendations of the Texas Aeronautics Commission Engineers. This was seconded by Commissioner Belt. See attached copy of bid and bond. Discussion followed with former Governor Allen Shivers stating that he would pay 1/2 the cost of the County's part in the improvement project at the airport. All voted yes and none voted no.

Commissioner Parks made a motion that no target practice or shooting of any kind be allowed at the County Solid Waste Disposal Dump on the Jasper highway. This was seconded by Commissioner Best. All voted yes and none voted no.

Since there was no further business, the meeting adjourned.

A RESOLUTION

Authorizing a Pavement Marking Demonstration Project  
Between TYLER County and the State Department  
of Highways and Public Transportation:

WHEREAS, the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation has come before the TYLER County Commissioners Court asking that the county join with it in a program to promote better traffic safety on the county's roads, and;

WHEREAS, the Federal government has made funds available through the Federal Highway Administration to finance cooperative efforts between local and state governments for the purpose of developing and implementing projects which will aid in the better control of vehicular traffic on county roads, and;

WHEREAS, the Governor's Office of Traffic Safety, in conjunction with the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation has ascertained that there is a need to develop a demonstration program in the state in the area of pavement marking for traffic safety and control, and;

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of TYLER County is in agreement with the Governor's Office of Traffic Safety that development and implementation of a Pavement Marking Demonstration Program in the county would be beneficial and an improvement of the safety of county roads for its citizens through extensive striping, and;

WHEREAS, the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation agrees to finance a Pavement Marking Program for TYLER County from Federal Highway Administration funds received by the Governor's Office of Traffic Safety.

THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Commissioners Court of TYLER County agrees to join with the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation in developing and implementing a Pavement Marking Demonstration Program for the purpose of applying control safety striping on county roads.

#### Declaration of Type of Committee:

One purpose of the new designation of campaign treasurer is to require the declaration of the type of political committee. The new campaign treasurer designation must declare whether the political committee is a "specific purpose political committee" or a "general purpose political committee" as defined by the new Act.

#### Specific Purpose Political Committees:

A specific purpose political committee is one which only has as its principal purpose accepting contributions and/or which only has among its principal purposes making expenditures in support for or in opposition to candidates who are identifiable and for whom the office(s) to be sought are known and any political committee which only has among its principal purposes accepting contributions and/or which only has among its principal purposes making expenditures in support for or in opposition to measures which are identifiable.

If a political committee has as its principal purposes any of the following, it is not a specific purpose political committee:

- (1) accepting any contributions and/or making expenditures in support for or in opposition to candidates who are indefinite in identity or for whom the office(s) to be sought are unknown.
- (2) accepting any contributions and/or making any expenditures for or in opposition to measures which are indefinite in identity, or
- (3) accepting any contributions and/or making any expenditures in assisting office-holders who are not identified.

Even though some of its functions and purposes are of a definite or known character, such a committee is not a specific purpose political committee, but is a general purpose political committee.

#### Proper Place of Filings for Specific Purpose Political Committees:

The place of filing the designation of campaign treasurer for a specific purpose political committee varies in accordance with the following:

- (1) If the specific purpose political committee is involved in an election for a county office, as defined in the Act, or a county measure, campaign treasurer designation must be filed with the appropriate County Clerk or County Clerks, as the case may be.
- (2) If the specific purpose political committee is involved in an election for a statewide office, district office, as defined in the Act, or a statewide measure, campaign treasurer designation must be filed with the Secretary of State.
- (3) If the specific purpose political committee is involved in an election to a municipal office or an office of a political subdivision or a measure of a municipality or political subdivision, campaign treasurer shall be designated with the clerk or secretary of the municipality or political subdivision.

#### Change in Definitions of "District Office" and "County Office":

Please note that the definition of a District Office has been enlarged to encompass the offices of State Senator, State Representative and Member of the State Board of Education, even if the particular district is wholly contained within a single county. Such offices are no longer county offices. That is, candidates for such offices, together with any specific purpose political committee supporting such candidates, must file their designations of campaign treasurer with the Secretary of State rather than with the various County Clerks after September 1, 1975. Any other office filled by the voters of one county or part of one county is still defined as a County Office.

#### NOTIFICATIONS TO CANDIDATES AND POLITICAL COMMITTEES OF THEIR NEW REQUIREMENTS

The Secretary of State is attempting to notify the appropriate candidates and political committees currently on file with this office of the necessity to file a new designation of campaign treasurer with the Secretary of State after September 1, 1975 prior to the acceptance of any contribution or the making of any expenditure.
