

The Commissioners' Court engaged the firms of William C. Key & Company and John S. Eppes, Certified Public Accountants, to conduct an audit of County records for the year 1977. This audit was done in compliance with generally accepted accounting procedures and the auditors' opinion is included in this report.

General Governmental Functions

Payroll budgetary accounts of all funds were over-expended due to a change in payroll dates. This will correct itself in 1978 when accounts will be considerably less than budget estimates.

Note 1 - Delinquent Taxes

Tyler County delinquent tax records are maintained and posted on a year by year basis with no cumulation of data or cumulative totals being maintained. Payments of delinquent taxes are posted to the individual taxpayer's record, in the year affected, upon receipt; however, total delinquent taxes for that year are not adjusted by payments received; therefore, total delinquent tax amounts are unavailable as of December 31, 1977.

Note 3 - Warrants Payable

As of December 31, 1977 the warrant payable for Precinct #III front end loader, due December 1, 1977, in the amount of \$11,500.00 had not been paid. The funds with which to pay this item were designated and available.

Note 4 - General Fund

At December 31, 1977, the General Fund balance was a deficit of \$6,697.35. The deficit resulted from non-recognition of distribution to the appropriate funds of the Trust and Agency Fund account titled "Undivided Funds - Treasurer", which totaled \$115,000.00 at December 31, 1977.

Note 5 - Road and Bridge I

Expenditures exceeded revenues by \$7,982.56 for the year ended December 31, 1977; however, the on hand balance as of January 1, 1977 amounted to \$21,134.13.

Note 6 - General Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Accounting

The County's records and accounts are kept on a modified cash basis in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles for governmental agencies as set forth in "The Information Guide on County Government".

(b) Capital Assets

The County has instituted the policy of capitalizing all expenditures for assets which have useful lives that extend beyond a single accounting period. Depreciation is not provided for in the County records.

COMMENTARY

DECEMBER 31, 1977

OPERATING FUNDS

GENERAL FUND (Page 11)

The General Fund is a Constitutional fund, and is utilized to account for County revenues and expenditures except where a separate fund is required for legal reasons.

The General Fund provides all the revenue for the general administration of the County Government!

ROAD AND BRIDGE FUNDS (Page 22)

The Road and Bridge Fund is a Constitutional fund established to account for current funds used for the purpose of constructing and maintaining roads and bridges.

The area of the County is divided into four precincts, and each precinct is provided with a separate budget, administered by the County Commissioner elected from the precinct.

A County Special Tax of 30c is levied for the purpose of construction and maintenance of County roads. This tax is distributed to the four precincts as follows:

Precinct	I	12.40%
Precinct	II	21.65
Precinct	III	33.05
Precinct	IV	32.90

The percentages were derived by the number of bridges and total miles in each precinct.

The Special Road and Bridge tax is currently levied at 10c. It is distributed according to the valuation in each precinct.

AIRPORT MAINTENANCE (Page 29)

No tax is being levied for the maintenance of the airport. Some delinquent taxes are still being received into the fund. The main sources of income are easement rights and hanger fees.

However, on January 30, 1978 the Commissioners Court entered into an agreement with ABC Aviation, Inc. to lease the airport to said firm. Maintenance of the airport will be the responsibility of the ABC Aviation.

DEBT SERVICE FUNDS

PERMANENT IMPROVEMENT INTEREST AND SINKING FUND (Page 34)

On May 15, 1962, warrants were issued by Tyler County in the amount of \$125,000.00 for the improvement, repair and equipment additions to the existing courthouse and jail buildings. A tax is levied each year to repay the warrants due.

RIGHT-OF-WAY INTEREST AND SINKING FUND (Page 35)

On July 1, 1959, warrants in the amount of \$325,000.00 were issued by Tyler County for the purchase of right-of-way. A tax is levied each year to collect the necessary funds to pay this indebtedness.

SOLID WASTE INTEREST AND SINKING FUND (Page 36)

On June 11, 1972, warrants in the amount of \$109,165.00 were issued by Tyler County for the purpose of purchasing equipment and supplies for a county-wide Solid Waste system. No tax was levied. It is funded by a portion of the Constitutional 80¢ fund. During the year 1977, 2.26% of the 80¢ fund was set aside for the payment of Solid Waste warrants.

SPECIAL REVENUE FUNDS

LIBRARY FUND (Page 37)

A \$5.00 fee is levied on all civil, probate and divorce cases filed in the District and County Clerks' offices to be utilized for the purchase of equipment and books for a Law Library.

1976 HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT FUND (Page 43)

A \$100,000.00 grant was obtained by the Commissioners' Court for the construction and improvement of a particular road in Precinct III.

1977 HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT FUND (Page 43)

\$240,000.00 was obtained by the Commissioners' Court for the construction and improvement of a particular road in Precinct IV. This grant also calls for the replacement of a bridge.

SPECIAL REVENUE FUNDS - CONTINUED

TRAFFIC ENGINEERING STUDY FUND (Page 47)

A study of traffic problems and problem-areas was made in Tyler County. Suggestions for solutions to problems were reported to the Commissioners' Court. A grant from the state was secured for this expense.

FEDERAL REVENUE SHARING FUNDS (Page 48)

This fund was established for the accounting of revenues received from the Federal Government under Public Law 92-512.

Entitlement payments are received quarterly and disbursements made monthly. While areas in which Revenue Sharing funds may be expended are broad, there are certain limitations. Tyler County used Revenue Sharing primarily for roads, financial administration and donations to non-profit, County-wide organizations.

ANTI-RECESSION FUND (Page 54)

Anti-Recession funds are provided by the Federal government and disbursed to local governmental agencies according to the unemployment rate in each county as compared with the unemployment rate in all other areas.

The new law calls for payment only through September 30, 1978. Only "basic services, customarily provided", may be funded by ARFA funds.

TRUST AND AGENCY FUNDS (Page 56)

These funds are established and maintained to act as clearing funds into which revenue from other funds or offices is placed for distribution to County funds or disbursements to outside agencies.

Those held for distribution to County funds are recognized as revenue when distributed. Distribution of the funds to outside agencies are primarily payroll deductions and fee collections for State agencies.

CAPITAL PROJECTS FUNDS (Page 58)

A Capital Projects Fund is a fund created to account for all resources used for the acquisition of designated fixed assets by a County, except those financed by special assessment or enterprise funds.

Thanks for hospitality and courtesies extended to me at our meeting to discuss planning of the County's proposed tax office addition.

At your request, we submit for approval this Proposal Letter for A/EPMS' services on your building program, defining Objectives, Procedures, Scope of Work, Owners Responsibilities, Commissions and Agreements and Schedules.

Objectives: Build an addition to the Tax Office in an appropriate location, sized to meet short term needs for additional office space with expansion capabilities to meet long term needs. The building addition shall be in aesthetic design harmony with the existing structure.

Procedures: To assist the County in reaching these Objectives in a logical and timely manner, we recommend a two step approach, using a standard A.I.A. Agreement.

Step 1: A/EPMS will provide all consulting, design and engineering services necessary to study the County's expansion problem, evaluate and determine likely one story solutions and recommend the suitable solution considering the County's overall design criteria. Also a construction budget and schedule will be recommended. Preliminary drawings and outline specifications will be presented to fully show the size, location, style, basic materials and systems proposed.

Page Two | March 6, 1978

Step 2: Upon the County's approval of Step 1 recommendations, A/EPMS will provide such further drawings and specifications to solicit bids and construct the facilities. Upon the County's approval of the final working drawings and specifications, A/EPMS will assist the Owner to solicit bids and award a contract for construction. A/EPMS will provide normal construction observation services.

Scope of Work; (Includes Owner's Responsibilities) The attached Scope of Work, dated March 6, 1978, outlines our recommendations for providing consulting, design and engineering services under Step 1. The approved Step 1 would serve as the scope of work for Step 2.

Commissions and Agreements: We estimate cost of A/EPMS services for Step 1 will be \$1300. to \$1350. and \$1750. to \$1800. for Step 2, including all supervision, engineering, insurance, taxes, expenses and A/EPMS' fee.

Schedule: We are prepared to start immediately after receiving items under Owner's Responsibilities. We anticipate completion of Step 1 within 4 to 5 weeks and Step 2 within 5 to 6 weeks after approval of Step 1.

We look forward to serving you on this interesting and challenging project.

SCOPE OF WORK FOR ADDITION TO TYLER COUNTY TAX OFFICE WOODVILLE, TEXAS

The Owner wants to build an addition to the Tax Office in an appropriate location to meet short term needs for additional office space with expansion capabilities to meet long term needs. The addition shall be in aesthetic harmony with the existing structure.

A/EPMS Responsibilities: A/EPMS shall provide all consulting, design and engineering services necessary to study the County's expansion 1) Study the proposed location of the addition to the east or south side of the County Tax building. Confirm such location to have good functional, practical, economical and aesthetic possibilities or propose a more suitable addition location. Schematic sketches of traffic, function and expansion for the Tax Office will be utilized and 2) Review County's short term and long term function and presented. design criteria for the Tax Office. Determine space and related needs for equipment and functions. Schematic plans and elevations will be done for a one story solution with recommendations for the best solution for Owner's approval. After approval, A/EPMS will do preliminary plans, elecations and other such drawings (of the solution approved) to clearly define the location; size, design style; basic materials; layout; basic systems of structure, mechanical and electrical equipment. Budget cost recommendations and schedule for Step 2 and the construction will be made.

Owners Responsibilities:

- 1. Owner will designate one representative through which A/EPMS will work.
- 2. Owner will consult, coordinate and cooperate with the work to be done by A/EPMS.
- 3. Owner will allow A/EPMS access to the premises during normal working hours.
- 4. Owner will expeditiously render decisions on matters presented by A/EPMS.
