Our original organizing group has grown to a present membership of over 100 members.



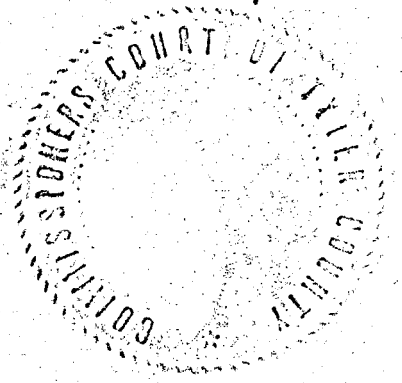


