All voted yes and none no.

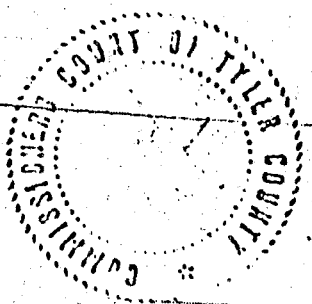

PAY PERIOD

Each official/supervisor has been advised regarding the department's effective dates for pay purposes, and will submit payrolls and time sheets as prescribed by the County Auditor's office.

OVER-TIME

No overtime for monthly employees will be allowed.

HOLIDAY OVER-TIME

Regular hourly employees who worked a forty (40) hour week shall be paid one and one-half times the regular rate of pay when a holiday falls on a regular scheduled work-day provided that person works their regular scheduled work-day before and after said holiday.
