A Special Meeting of the Commissioner's Court met on Monday July 30, 1979, at 10:00 A.M. All members being present. The meeting was opened with prayer by Mr. E.C. Hardin of Colmesneil.

With representavies of the Tyler County Industrial Corp., concerning the need to resurface the County road, leading to the Levingston Shipbuilding, a motion was made by Commissioner Fowler and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to re-oil the Road upon notification from the Tyler County Industrial Corp. that someone else is responsible for the Topping. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Fowler to amend the Revenue Sharing Budget, and transfer \$5000.00 for meals for the Aged. The Ageing Committee will present the Bills to be paid. This amount of money in the Budget will not be needed for the designated purpose, this year. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Riley to table the discussion of unvaccinated, pets, includeing Dogs, until August 13, 1979. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Fowler and seconded by Commissioner Odom to reinstate the Rockland Voting Box No. 11, pending, until the field notes are presented, to the Court. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Fowler to extend Bids on three wooden Bridges until August 13, 1979. All voted yes and none no. These bridges were 1 for Pct. III and 2 for Pct. IV.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Fowler to accept the Bid of ~~two Typewriters~~ represented by Lufkin Typewriter & Cash Register Co. of Lufkin, Texas. The price of each is \$743.40, a total of \$1,486.80. These are Royal 5000F Electric. All voted yes and none no. See attached.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to advertise for Bids, to sell a used Caterpillar 71D-12 from Pct. #III. These Bids to be opened August 17, 1979. All voted yes and none no. This Caterpillar may be seen at Barn #III.

A motion was made by Commissioner Fowler and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to advertise for Bids on a Tandem Low-Boy, with a 5th Wheel, to have a 40,000 lb. carrying capacity. This is for Pct. #3. Bids to be opened August 17, 1979, at 10:00 A.M. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Riley made the motion which was seconded by Commissioner Lowe to ~~approve the Bond of~~ Laura Whiteley and Royce Weldon Whiteley, for the Tax Assessor-Collector of Chester Independent School District. All voted yes and none no. See attached.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Riley for the redistribution of special road and bridge funds. This is a 10¢ Tax. This is to be divided on % Basis according to the miles of each Road and the Bridges. Also re-check miles and bridges, and ask T.F.Pritchard to find the value for each Pct., with Budget to be Amended, after completion as needed. All voted yes and none no.

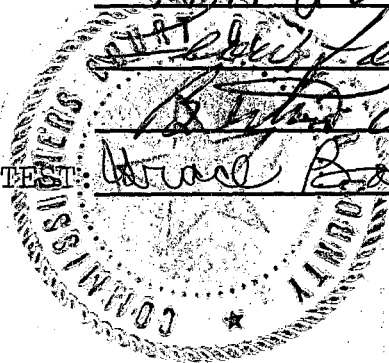
A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Riley to appoint Election Judges, as submitted. See attached. All voted yes and none no.
