RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Tyler County Commissioners' Court wholeheartedly supports the concept of locally governed community mental health and mental retardation services and works closely with the Deep East Texas MHMR Center;

AND WHEREAS, the Deep East Texas MHMR Center provides an important array of services for the mentally disabled citizens of Tyler County,

AND WHEREAS, the needs for services for the mentally disabled citizens of Tyler County exceed our Center's current capacity to clinically respond,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Tyler County Commissioners' Court perceives the need for a significant increase in state grant-in-aid funding for all community MHMR centers in fiscal years 1982 and 1983, to provide for adequate services at the community level and develop a balanced MHMR delivery system across the State,

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Tyler County Commissioners' Court recognizes that such increased funding is necessary to assist in maintaining those needed local services which are now being provided many community mental health and mental retardation centers such as the Deep East Texas MHMR Center.

5.6 Tollet Rooms. It is essential that an appropriate numbers of toilet rooms, in accordance with the nature and use of a specific building or facility, be made accessible to, and usable by, the physically handicapped.

5.6.1 Toilet rooms shall have space to allow traffic of individuals in wheelchairs, in accordance with 3.1, 3.2, and 3.3.

5.6.2 Toilet rooms shall have at least one toilet stall that-

- (1) Is 3 feet wide
- (2) Is at least 4 feet 8 inches, preferably 5 feet, deep
- (8) Has a door (where doors are used) that is 82 inches wide and swings out
- (4) Has handrails on each side, 33 inches high and parallel to the floor, 1½ inches in outside diament. th 1½ inches clearance between rail and wall, and fastened securely at ends and center
- (5) Hes a water closet with the seat 20 inches from the floor

Nors: The design and mounting of the water closet is of considerable importance. A well-mounted water closet with a sarrow understructure that recedes sharply is most desirable. If a floor-mounted water closet must be used, it should not have a front that is wide and perpendicular to the floor at the front of the seat. The bowl should be shallow at the front of the seat and turn backward more than downward to allow the individual in a wheelchair to get close to the water closet with the seat of the wheelchair.

5.6.3 Toilet rooms shall have lavatories with narrow aprons, which when mounted at standard height are uzable by individuals in wheelchairs; or shall have lavatories mounted higher, when particular designs demand, so that they are usable by individuals in wheelchairs.

Note: It is important that drain pipes and hot-water pipes under a lavatory be covered or insulated so that a wheelchair individual without senaction will not burn himself.

5.6.4 Some mirrors and shelves shall be provided above levatories at a height as low as possible and no higher than 60 inches above the floor, measured from the top of the shelf and the bottom of the mirror.

5.6.5 Toilet rooms for men shall have well-mounted urinals with the opening of the basin 19 inches from the floor, or shall have floor-mounted urinals that are on level with the main floor of the toilet room.

5.6.6 Toilet rooms shall have an appropriate number of towel rack towel dispensers, and other dispensers and d...al units mounted no higher than 40 lackes fro

5.7 Water Fountains. An appropriate numbers of water fountains or other water-dispensing means shall be accessible to, and usable by, the physically disabled.

5.7.1 Water fountains or coolors shall have upfront spouts and controls.

5.7.2 Water fountains or coolers shall be hand-operated or hand- and foot-operated. (See also American Standard Specifications for Drinking Fountains, Z4.2-1942.)

Nore 1: Conventional floor-mounted water coolers can be serviceable to individuals in wheelchairs if a small fountain is mounted on the side of the cooler 50 inches above the facer.

Note 2: Vell-mounted, hand-operated coolers of the letest dealen, manufactured by many companies, can serve the ablabodied and the physically disabled equally well when the cooler is mounted with the basin 36 inches from the floor.

Note 3: Fully recessed water fountains are not recommended.

Note 6: "Yeter fountains should not be set into an alcove unless the allies is wider than a wheelchair. (See 8.2.)

E.8 Public Telephones. An appropriate numbers of public telephones should be made accessible to, and usable by, the physically disabled.

Note: The conventional public telephone booth is not usable by most physically disabled individuals. There are many ways in which public tricphones can he made accessible and usable. It is recommended that architects and builders confer with the telephone company in the planning of the building or facility.

5.8.1 Such telephones should be placed so that the diel and the handret can be reached by individuals in wheelchairs, in accordance with 5.2.

5.8.2 An appropriate numbers of public telephones should be equipped for those with hearing disabilities and so identified with instructions for use.

Note: Such telephones can be used by everyone.

5.9 Elevators. In a multiple-story building, clavators are essential to the successful functioning of physically disabled individuals. They shall conform to the following requirements:

5.9.1 Elevators shall be accessible to, and usable by, the physically disabled on the level that they use to enter the building, and at all levels normally used by the general public.

5.9.2 Elevators shell allow for traffic by whool-chairs, in accordance with 3.1, 3.2, 8.3 and 5.3.

5.10 Controls. Switches and controls for light, heat, ventilation, windows, draperies, fire elarms, and all similar controls of frequent or essential use, chall be placed within the reach of individuals in wheel-chairs. (See 3.3.)
