





RE: Heritage Garden Village - Pickett House

Gentlemen:

Mr. and Mrs. Clyde E. Gray ("Grays") presently own and operate the Heritage Garden Village ("Village") and the Pickett House located in Tyler County, Texas. The Grays have expressed a sincere interest in transferring their ownership of the Village and Pickett House to a charitable, tax exempt foundation in order to perpetuate its existence and to provide the public continued access to the valuable history and culture of East Texas.

Subject to the approval by the tax counsel of the Grays and the execution of a definitive agreement by the foundation with the Grays, they are proposing to transfer and convey the Village and the Pickett House to the Tyler County Historical Foundation ("Foundation") upon the following basis:

- 1. The foundation will be at the time of the conveyance a duly qualified non-profit corporation existing under the laws of the State of Texas.
- 2. The foundation will obtain a ruling from the Internal Revenue Service that it is a charitable corporation and has tax exempt status.
- 3. The Village and approximately 6 1/2 acres comprising the Village (excluding the Pickett House), improvements, fixtures thereon, and exhibits owned by the Grays, will be donated to the foundation and the foundation will assume an SBA loan against the property in the approximate amount of \$36,457.85.
- 4. Fifty percent (50%) of the gross revenues from admissions to the Village shall be paid to Mrs. Gray until the date of her death. Such payments shall,

however, be not less than \$1,000.00 per month when averaged at the end of any calendar year. If at the end of any calendar year, total payments do not average \$1,000.00 per month, the foundation shall pay Mrs. Gray an additional sum of money so that the funds received from admission will equal \$1,000.00 per month when averaged at the end of any calendar year.

- 5. The Pickett House and the land upon which the Pickett House is constructed shall be donated ten years after the death of Mr. or Mrs. Gray, whichever date shall be latest. The Pickett House shall continue to have access to parking space at the Village until such time as donated to the foundation.
- 6. The foundation will maintain the grounds and buildings of the Village and keep them in good reapir and shall take measures to advertise the Village to the surrounding area and to the public in general in Texas. To the extent that it is feasible or possible, the foundation will improve the grounds and add to the extensive collection of artifacts now presently in the Village.
- 7. The foundation and the Grays will inventory the gift shop in the Village and arrive at a value of such inventory. The value of such inventory shall be reimbursed to the Grays as sale of the inventory is made to third parties by the foundation.
- 8. Acceptable arrangements shall be made in the definitive agreement in the event that the foundation is unable to perform, ceases to exist or no longer desires to maintain the Village or Pickett House.

The Grays and the foundation recognize that substantial planning and review will be necessary to accomplish the above. If the foundation desires to pursue this matter upon a general basis as set forth below, please execute this letter, indicating your approval, and return a copy for the Grays' files.
