TYLER COUNTY COMMISSIONER'S COURT  
REGULAR MEETING  
JANUARY 12, 1981

The Regular Meeting of the Commissioner's Court met on Monday January 12, 1981 at 9:00 A.M. All members being present. The meeting was opened with prayer by J.P. Pct. #1 John Spanhanks.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to accept the low Bid of Thomas Fortenberry, Woodville, Texas 75979 for the Elevator to be placed in the County Courthouse. The amount of this Bid was \$83,595.75. The other bidder was Richard Defee, Inc. of Livingston, Texas 77351. Commissioners Lowe, Riley and Odom all voted yes and Commissioner Mahan voted no. Bids attached. Commissioner Mahan made a motion to study the project and table this for 30 days, but his motion did not receive a second, and therefore it died.

A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Mahan to table until the next regular meeting in February the request of Miss Melinda Stryker, for foster children. All voted yes and none no. She is requested to furnish a list of these children. A copy of bill is attached.

Commissioner Riley made a motion which was seconded by Commissioner Odom to adopt four Resolutions, which would benefit Tyler County. These Resolutions were to be given to State Officials in Austin, Texas this week. All voted yes and none no. See attached.

A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to approve of the Bonds for the newly elected Officials. The total was eleven (11). All voted yes and none no. See Bonds attached.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Riley to approve of the purchasing of a Typewriter for the District Clerk's Office. Two Bids were submitted. The approval of the I B M was accepted. All voted yes and none no. See bids attached.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Mahan to advertise for Bids on a Mini-Bus for the County. Bids to be opened at the Regular Meeting of Commissioners Court in February. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Odom made a motion which was seconded by Commissioner Mahan to table the selection of the Grievance Committee until Friday January 16, 1981. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Odom to Table the appointment of the County Historical Survey Commission, until Friday Jan. 16, 1981. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Odom to set January, April, July and October as Terms of Court for 1981. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Mahan to table the setting of holidays for the County Courthouse Employees, for 1981, until Friday, January 16, 1981. All voted yes and none no.

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A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Mahan to advertise for Bids on 1 Motor Grader for Pct. #4, with a Caterpillar 112E Trade-in for down payment, which may be seen at Pct. #4 Barn. Bids to be opened February 9, 1981 at 10:00 A.M. All voted yes and none no. Bid and specifications attached.

A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Riley to approve of paying Bills as submitted by County Auditor, Ann Fondren. All voted yes and none no. See attached.

A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Riley to increase the monthly payments to the Tyler County Fireman's Association from \$25.00 to \$50.00 for each department, of the County. Two additional departments, Ivanhoe VFD and Wildwood VFD have been added to the list which brings to a total of nine. All voted yes and none no. Request attached.

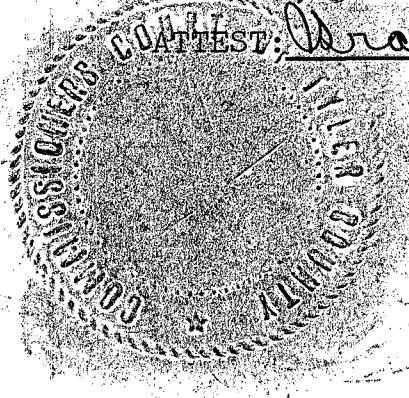

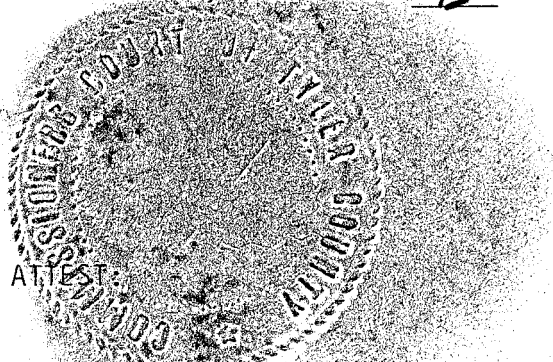

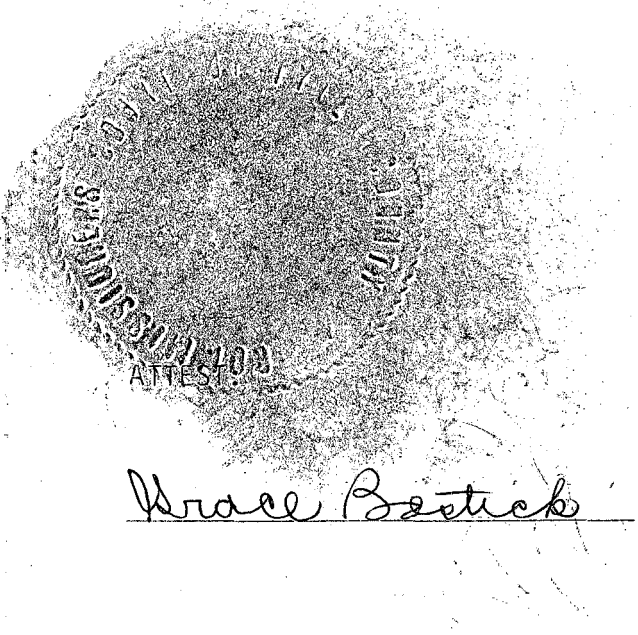

WHEREAS, the increased cost of operation and maintenance of County road precincts have placed an additional financial burden on the Counties and,

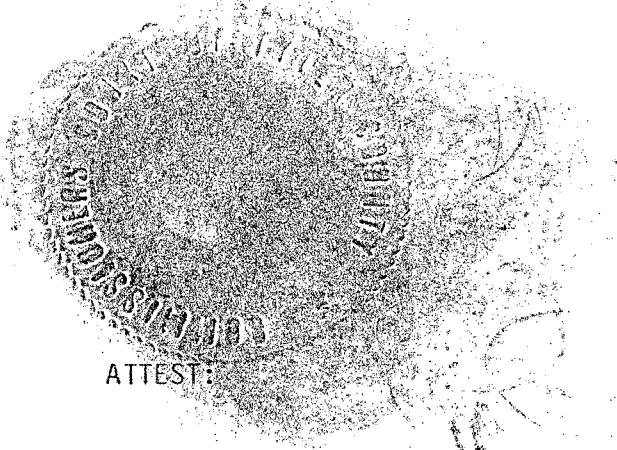
WHEREAS, in many cases TYLER County is unable to adequately maintain existing roads or construct new roads and,

This is needed to determine the basis for the payment of money to your county officers and until it is received, this department cannot pay either your county or your county officers any money.

The above request is provided for in TEX. REV. CIV. STAT. ANN., Art. 3912e, §2, which states the Commissioner's Court of each county in the State of Texas, at its first regular meeting in January of each year, shall determine if their precinct officers (excluding public weighers and registrars of vital statistics) shall be paid on a salary or fee basis. In counties having a population of less than twenty thousand (20,000) inhabitants according to the last federal census, the Commissioner's Court, by its order, determines whether its county officers (excluding county surveyors, registrars of vital statistics and notaries public) shall be compensated on a salary basis or on the basis of fees earned by them in the performance of their official duties. A certified copy of the said order should be mailed to the Comptroller of Public Accounts before January 31, 1981.



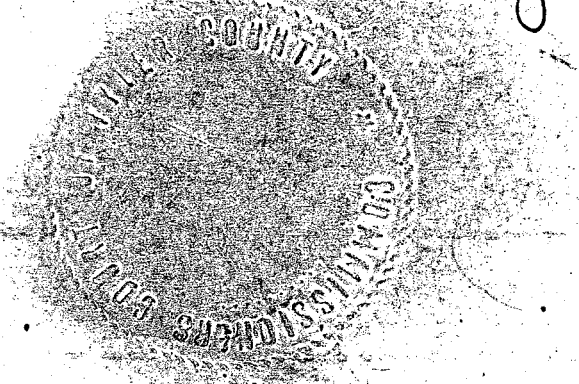

Sec. 2. (a) No county, acting through its Commissioners and no city in this state shall hereafter make any contract calling for the expenditure of payment of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000) or more out of any fund or funds of any city or county or subdivision of any county creating or imposing an obligation or liability of any nature or character upon such county or any subdivision of such county upon such city, without first submitting such proposed contract to competitive bids. Notice of the time and place when and where such contracts shall be let shall be published in such county (if concerning a county contract or contracts for such subdivision of such county) or such city, (if concerning a city contract), once a week for two consecutive weeks prior to the time set for letting such contract, the first publication to be at least fourteen (14) days prior to the time set for letting said contract; and said contract shall be let to the responsible bidder. The court and/or governing body shall have the right to reject any and all bids, and if the contract is for the construction of public works, then the successful bidder shall be required to furnish and sufficient bond in the full amount of the contract price to insure faithful performance of such contract, executed by some surety company authorized to do business in this state in accordance with the provisions of Article 5160, Revised Statutes of 1925, and the amendments

However, the city or county in making any contract calling for or requiring the expenditure of payment of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) or more and less than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) may, in lieu of the bond requirement, provide in the contract that no money will be paid to the contractor until completion and acceptance of the work by the city or county. If there is no newspaper published in such county, the notice of the letting of such contract by such county shall be given by causing notice thereof to be posted at the County Court House door for fourteen (14) days prior to the time of letting such contract. If there is no newspaper published in such city, then the notice of letting such contract shall be given by causing notice thereof to be posted at the City Hall for fourteen (14) days prior to the time of letting such contract. 
