The Regular Meeting of the Commissioners Court, met on Monday March 9, 1981 at 10:00 A.M. All members being present. The meeting opened with prayer by the County Judge, Mr Allen Sturrock.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Odom to reschedule, until March 27, 1981, at 10:00 A.M., the opening of Bids on the County Depository. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Odom to table the decision of Bids on a used car from the Sheriff's Department. The completion to be Friday March 13, 1981. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Riley to table the Bids on a Chain Link Fence for Pct. III, until Friday March 13, 1981, at 10:00 A.M. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Odom to approve the request of Paul Massart, who represents the County Firearms Association, to pay the monthly bills for a phone to be installed in the Sheriff's Office, for assistance of the Fire Department. The Association will pay for the installing. Mr. Massart will communicate with the Sheriff, for location. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Riley to table Bids to purchase a Tilt Trailer for Pct. # III, until Friday March 13, 1981 at 10:00 A.M. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Odom to reject the Bid of Kenneth Weeks, to buy a used Trailer, from Pct. III Commissioner, Mr. Mahan. All voted yes and none no. See Bid attached.

A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Riley to approve of transferring funds from one ageing Dept. to another of the Departments. The amount of \$4000.00. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to approve the County Treasurers monthly report, as submitted by County Treasurer Austin Fuller. All voted yes and none no. See attached.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Odom to approve the Monthly Report of the County Extension Office, as submitted. All voted yes and none no.

Since there were no Bids presented on Radios for the Commissioners, a motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Mahan to extend the time, until April 13, 1981. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Odom to table the discussion of Judge John Spanhanks on exterminating the courthouse. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Riley made the motion which was seconded by Commissioner Odom to consider the joining National Association of Counties, by working this into the 1982 Budget. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Riley to advertise for Bids on a 12F Motor Grader, to be sold separately, or with Trade-In on a new Grader. This 12F Motor Grader is located at the Barn of Pct. # III. Time Warrants to be issued for balance of payment on a new Motor Grader. All voted yes and none no. (April 13.)

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Riley to approve a policy; if a county employee is injured on the job, and is unable to work for some time, then he may have the option of taking sick leave, first, then his vacation time, and then Workman's Compensation. With this new policy, the counties only financial obligation to the employee would be to continue paying his health insurance. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Odom to approve a resolution concerning Court cost on County Crimmal cases, to be \$75.00 instead of prior cost of \$60.00. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Odom to study the possibility of Tyler County having their own probation office. This would have to be determined thru the State to decide if the case load in Tyler County was justified for a separate office. All voted yes and none no.

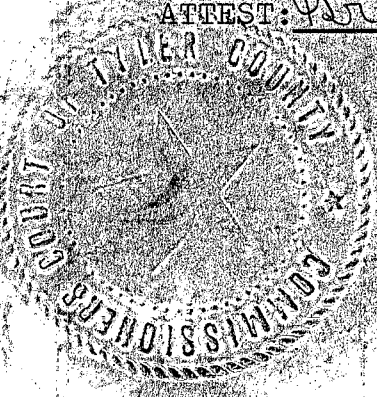
A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Lowe that, be it Resolved by the Commissioners Court of Tyler County, Texas, that it supports and endorses Senate Bill 321 by Senator Lloyd Bentson. This bill we feel will be a permanent solution to Revenue procedure 80-55. A copy of this Resolution is attached. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Riley to advertise for Bids to sell a used Back Hoe separately, or Bid as a Trade-in on a new Back Hoe. This used Back Hoe may be seen at Pct. # III County Barn. Bids will be taken on a new Back Hoe separately also. All voted yes and none no. Bids to be opened April 13, 1981, at 10:00 A.M.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Odom to table the discussion of Don Cole, until Friday March 13, 1981. All voted yes and none no.

There being no farther business, the meeting adjourned.

It coming to the attention of the Tyler County Commissioners Court of the damages that would be done to State and Local Governments if Internal Revenue procedure 80-55 was made effective the following Resolution was passed,

WHEREAS; The Tyler County Commissioners Court feels that Revenue procedure 80-55 reaches far beyond the intent of Congress, and

WHEREAS; This procedure would prohibit lending institutions from deducting the interest on accounts of State and Local Governments, that are secured by pledges of Tax exempt securities, and

WHEREAS; This procedure would greatly reduce the demand for municipal bonds at a time when the market is already depressed, and

WHEREAS; This procedure would cost the Tax payers of Tyler County double and triple the amount of interest now being paid on time warrants and bonds issued by it, and

WHEREAS; This procedure would cause banks to reduce the amount of interest paid on public deposits, and

WHEREAS; This is a major problem in Texas, since it has pledging requirements which are among the strictest in the nation, and

WHEREAS; The implementation of this procedure would cause an undue hardship and burden on the Tax payers of Tyler County, Texas.

NOW; Therefore, be it Resolved by the Commissioners Court of Tyler County, Texas, that it supports and endorses Senate Bill 321 by Senator Lloyd Bentson. This bill we feel will be a permanent solution to Revenue procedure 80-55.

Be it further Resolved that copies of this Resolution be sent to our U.S. Senators and Congressman

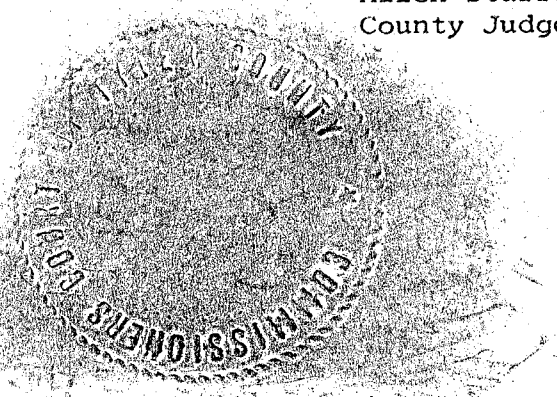
