A Special Meeting of the Commissioner's Court met on Friday September 25, 1981 at 10:00 A.M. All members being present. The meeting was opened with prayer by Rev. Latta.

A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Riley to raise the quoto of \$50.00 to \$100.00 per month for each Fire Dept. thru out the County, beginning in January, 1982. The Court pledges to study for other assistance. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Odom to amend the monthly bills to be paid as submitted by County Auditor Ann Nichol. All voted yes and none no. See attached.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Riley to advertize for Bids on a Portable Building for Pct. #3. Bids to be opened Oct. 12, 1981. All voted yes and none no. See Specifications attached.

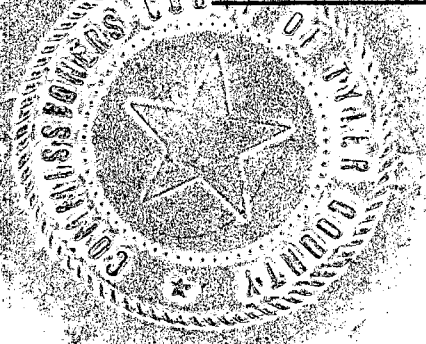
A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Riley to advertize for Bids on CB Radios; to sell one or all. Bids to be opened October 12, 1981. Pct. #3. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Mahan to give Commissioner Odom permission to negotiate to buy a used Pickup, for Pct. #4. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to approve the Budget, and advertize for Public Hearing on Budget and proposed Tax Rate, as follows: General Fund .34; Lateral Road 10.8; Special Road Fund 3.7; Hospital Fund 6; Total 54.5; This motion passed 3-1, with Commissioner Mahan dissenting.

1. Pressure treated skids run the entire length of the building and are attached (permanently) to the building.
2. Exterior glued plywood floor. American Plywood Association Grade... Trademarked. 5-ply--1650 lbs. PSI. . . applied over floor joists 16" on centers. Solid blocking between floor joists at plywood joints.
3. Maximum Rigidity...All buildings have a double bottom plates and double corner studs. Diagonal bracing is solidly mortised into top and bottom plates and studs, for maximum reinforcement.
4. Kaiser, Reynolds and Fabral Lifetime Aluminum on sidewalls and roof. 30 Year Guarantee. High temper, specially designed for extra strength. Natural aluminum finish never needs painting. Reflects 95% of radiant heat. Your building is amazingly cool in summer, easily heated in winter.
5. 20 Year Baked-On-Enamel (Optional) This siding is pre-painted at the factory before it is formed. The acrylic resin Hi-Gloss enamel finish will last up to ten times longer than an oil base paint of the same color. It won't blister, chip, peel, or flake. Beige, white, green, red, and gold are standard colors.
6. Doors ....36" wide, 1 3/4" thick exterior grade doors, specially treated for long life.
7. Weather Tight -- Windows, corners and eaves are sealed for moisture and dust protection.
8. Metal Corner, Door and Roof Trim ... Baked on enamel for maintenance free long life.
9. Aluminum Windows with Screens...Special built for extra heavy duty. Horizontal sliding type with automatic locking device for maximum security. Screens are removable.
10. Poly-Clad Coated Pre-Finished Paneling. Walls on all lined buildings are finished with attractive, high grade, vinyl V-Grooved wood grain paneling.
11. Blanket Fiberglass Insulation..Continous wrap around method insures no voids, maximum thermo value and sound deadening. This is the most effective insulation available.

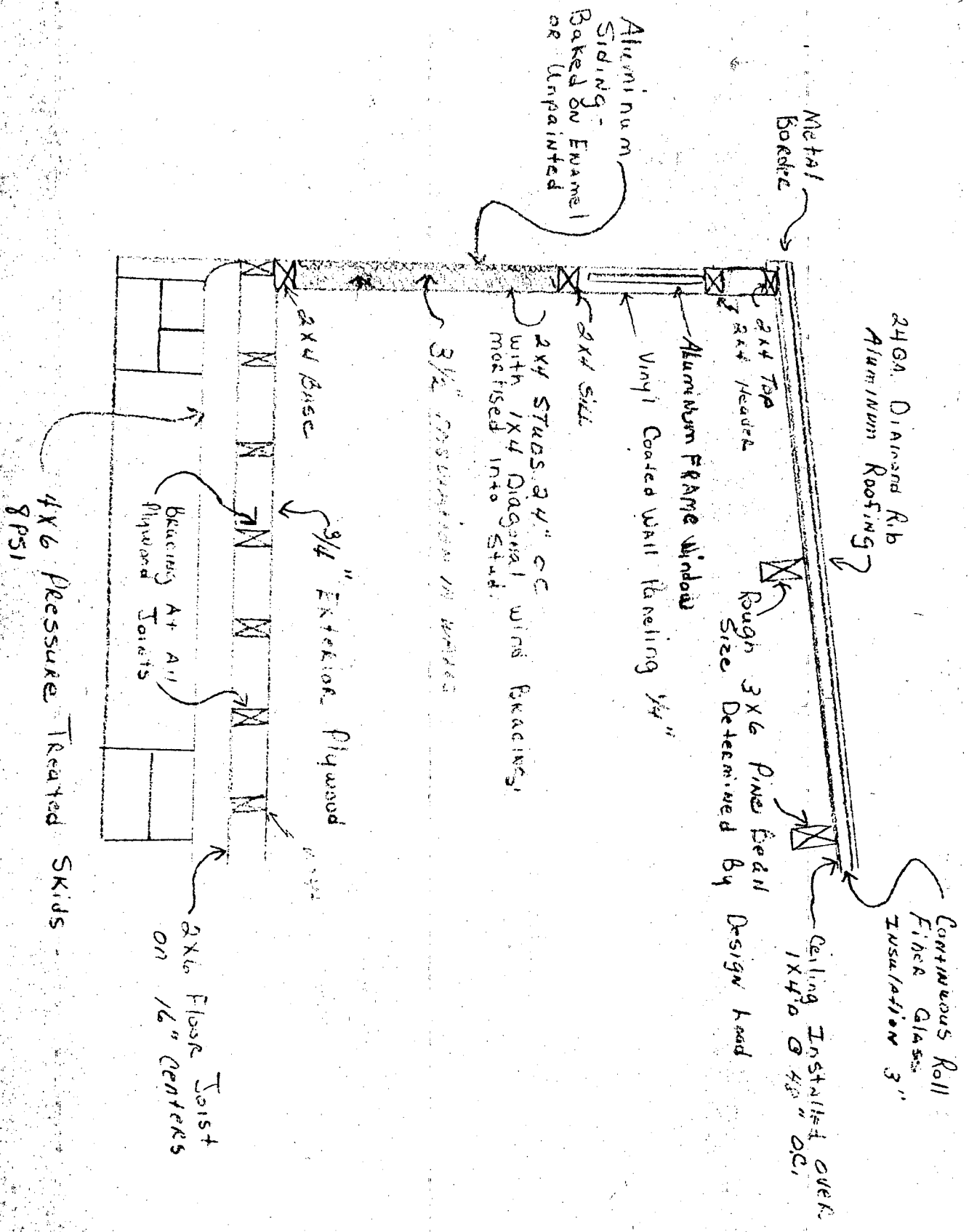
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12. Exposed Rustic Beam Cathedral Ceiling...White pre-finished ceiling material.
13. Complete Electrical Wiring...Wiring is done in strict accordance with National Electric Code. Both 110V and 220V included.
14. Fluorescent Lights with tubes...Twin tube 8' slim-line strips with tubes are optional lighting in all lined [redacted] and wired buildings.
15. Screws...All siding is applied with cadmium plated screws.
16. Cement Coated Nails are used exclusively for framing. This cement, (glue coating) multiplies the holding power so necessary in a quality portable building.
17. Spikes .... $\frac{1}{4}$  x 6" spikes are used to anchor floor joist to skids. These spikes are an absolute necessity to insure against skids being pulled loose from the building when the building is moved.
18. Optional Features...Partitions, vinyl floor tile, carpet, solid rool type vinyl, plumbing, air conditioning and heating equipment, cabinets, closets, special windows and doors, rustic wood or baked-on-enamel aluminum siding.
19. Studs -- 24" OC
20. Floor Joist -- 16" OC


