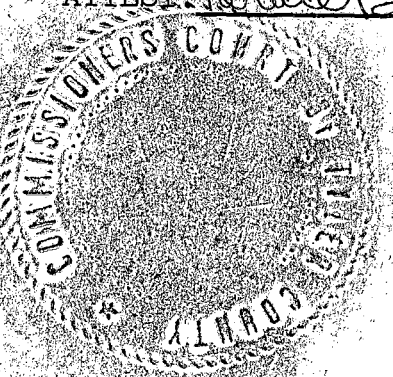

Dear Judge Sturrock:


This is in reference to the redistricting of commissioner, justice of the peace and constable precincts, realignment of voting precinct boundaries, establishment of three new voting precincts and three polling places for Tyler County, Texas, submitted to the Attorney General pursuant to Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended, 42 U.S.C. 1973c. Your submission was received on December 16, 1981.

The Attorney General does not interpose any objections to the changes in question. However, we feel a responsibility to point out that Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act expressly provides that the failure of the Attorney General to object does not bar any subsequent judicial action to enjoin the enforcement of such changes.

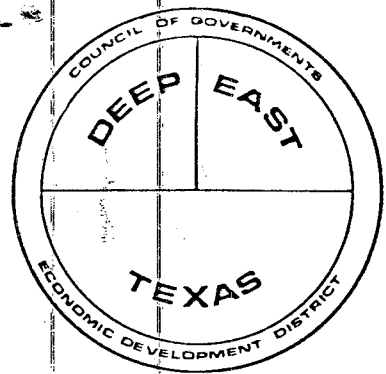

WHEREAS, Tyler County, Texas feels that it is in the best interest of the Citizens of Tyler County to enter into an agreement to form a mutual aid law enforcement task force to cooperate in the investigation of criminal activity and enforcement of the laws of the State of Texas with the following law enforcement agencies:

1. Lufkin Police Department, Lufkin, Texas
2. Nacogdoches Police Department, Nacogdoches, Texas
3. Diboll Police Department, Diboll, Texas
4. Trinity Police Department, Trinity, Texas
5. Crockett Police Department, Crockett, Texas
6. Jasper Police Department, Jasper, Texas
7. Woodville Police Department, Woodville, Texas
8. Corrigan Police Department, Corrigan, Texas
9. Any other law enforcement agencies authorized under Article 999b to participate in said task force.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY TYLER COUNTY, TEXAS

1. THAT Tyler County designate Leon Fowler, Sheriff for said Tyler County to represent said County in entering into an agreement with the above listed law enforcement agencies to form a mutual aid law enforcement task force to cooperate with each other in the investigation of criminal activity and the enforcement of the laws of the State of Texas: and
2. THAT Tyler County implement the provisions of Article 999b of Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes to aid Sheriff Leon Fowler in the fulfillment of the purposes for which this resolution is entered.
3. THAT this action be reflected in the Minutes of this meeting.


