A Regular Meeting of the Commissioner's Court, met on Monday, February 14, 1983 at 10:00 A.M. All members, except Commissioner Riley being present. The meeting was opened with prayer by County Judge Allen Sturrock.

A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to appoint the following for 1983-1984 Historical Committee: Chairman, Kitty Peacock; members, Phebe Armstrong, Dolores Gibson, Ruth Montague, Gilbert Wright, Vivian Jordan, Jane Mann, Ewel & Marjorie Wood, Stephanie Yearwood, Jack & Manie Whitmeyer and Barbara Phillips. A copy was mailed to Texas Historical Commission P.O. Box 12276 Austin, Texas 78711. See attached. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to accept the Bid of Citizens State Bank, on the Depository for the County, for two years. All voted yes and none no. See attached.

Mrs Madeline Collins gave a good talk on the Tyler County Criminal District Attorney Resolution. A summary is attached.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Comm. Odom to table the County Treasurers Monthly Report, until later in this meeting. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Mahan to accept the County Extension Monthly Report, as submitted by Mr Currie. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to accept the Bid of Lufkin Typewriter, on a Typewriter for County Treasurer, Austin Fuller. The cost of \$945.00. All voted yes and none no. See attached.

Mrs Phebe Armstrong appeared before the Court, announcing that Mr. Morris Clemmons had donated the McCready House to the Historical Committee and asked for help from the County in finding a suitable location to move the house too, as well as support for a fund-raising drive now underway to restore the nineteenth century home. Attached is a request.

With a report of the Greviance Committee, Commissioner Odom made a motion to set back all Elected Officials Salaries to 1982 salaries. No second to this motion, so therefore it died. Commissioner Odom withdrew his motion. A motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Odom to table the report, and also Salaries, until next Friday. All voted yes and none no. See attached.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Odom to ammend the Revenue Sharing Budget for County Auditor Ann Nichol to use \$1558.00 for Part Time Personel. Also for the Sheriff and Commissioner Pct. III, to adjust their budget to their best advantage. On these three items, each Official is required to stay within his 1983 Budget. All voted yes and none no. See attached.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Odom to table the Resolution on R.O.W. in Pct. #III., until next Friday. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to continue the Bid of purchasing two used dump-trucks from Pct. #III, until Friday. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to allow the J.P.'s of all four Pcts. to Bid on Office Supplies. All voted yes and none no. Spec. attached.

A motion was made by Commissioner Odom and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to set terms for County Court, by listing February, May, August and Nov. as dates for 1983. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Odom to open Bids on Insurance for the Courthouse, on March 14, 1983. All voted yes and none no. Specifications attached.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to pass a Resolution for widening and improving U.S. Highway 69 in the State of Texas from the following attached Order. All voted yes and none no. The Commissioners Court Order did waive the 50% reimbursement due the County for acquisition of these right of way parcels. All voted yes and none no.

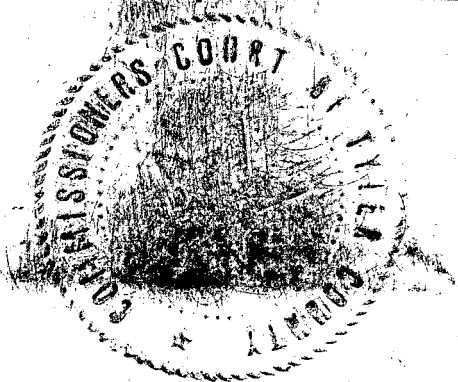



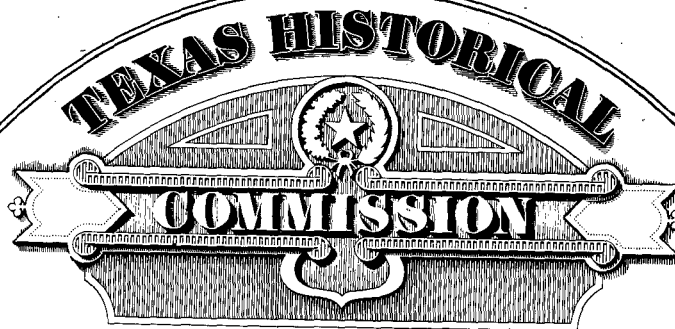

Dear County Judge:

This letter is addressed to you as presiding officer of the commissioners court. It concerns the appointment of your county historical commission for the 1983-84 term. Enclosed is a copy of Article 6145.1. You will note that Section 1(a) provides for the county commissioners court to appoint a county historical commission every two years. Under the provisions of the article the term of the county historical commission expired on December 31, 1982. May I suggest that the agenda of the next meeting of the commissioners court contain an item providing for the appointment of the county historical commission for the coming two-year term.

It is of particular importance that these appointments be made during the month of January because we want to send the chairman the revisions for the Historic Preservation Handbook. We also feel it is essential that the chairman make plans to attend the Historic Preservation Conference to be held in Galveston on April 14, 15, and 16, 1983.

Enclosed is some material that should be helpful in the appointment or reappointment of the commission. I know you and the commissioners are well aware of the importance of the documentation and preservation of your county's history. The use of history is to give value to the present. By careful selection of the people chosen to serve on the county historical commission, you will provide the county with a group of dedicated interested volunteers who will protect the history of your area. I would like to urge the court to include citizens of all ages and all areas of the county. The quality of historic preservation in your county will depend on the interest and capability of the chairman and the members of the county commission.

Your interest in this vital program is appreciated and we look forward to working with you, the commissioners court and the county historical commission.

## ARTICLE 6145.1 COUNTY HISTORICAL COMMISSIONS

Section 1, Chapter 152, Acts of the 58th Legislature, 1963, as amended (Article 6145.1, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), is amended to read as follows:

Section 1. (a) The Commissioners Court of each county may appoint a County Historical Commission to consist of at least seven residents of the County for the purpose of initiating and conducting such programs as may be suggested by the Commissioners Court and the Texas Historical Commission for the preservation of the historical heritage of the county. The members of the commission shall be appointed during the month of January of odd-numbered years and shall serve for a term of two years. Should the Commissioners Court fail to appoint a commission by April 1 of each odd-numbered year, the Texas Historical Commission may appoint such commission upon 30 days written notice to the Commissioners Court of its intention to do so.

(b) Each County Historical Commission shall meet at least once a year at its county seat and may meet as often as each commission may determine under rules and regulations adopted by it for its own regulation. Each Commission shall make an annual report of its activities and recommendations simultaneously to its Commissioners Court and to the Texas Historical Commission before the end of each calendar year and may make as many other reports and recommendations as it sees fit.

(c) Each commission shall institute and carry out a continuing survey of the county to determine the existence of historical buildings, and other historical sites, private collections of historical memorabilia, or other historical features within the county, and shall report the data collected to the Commissioners Court and the Texas Historical Commission.

(d) The Commissioners Court may pay the necessary expenses of the Commission and may authorize a car allowance and pay the necessary traveling expenses of the chairman and members of the commission.

(e) The Commission shall make recommendations to the Commissioners Court and the Texas Historical Commission concerning the acquisition of property, real or personal, which is of historical significance.

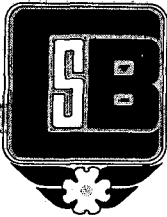
(f) The commission may operate and manage any museum which may be owned or leased by the county, and may acquire artifacts and other museum paraphernalia in the name of the museum or the commission, and may supervise any employees hired by the Commissioners Court to operate the museum.

(g) In addition to the powers already conferred on it by law, the Commissioners Court of each county of this state may appropriate funds from the general fund of the county for the purpose of:

- (1) erecting historical markers, monuments, and medallions;
- (2) purchasing objects and collections of objects of any kind which are historically significant to the county; and
- (3) preparing, publishing, and disseminating, by sale or otherwise, a history of the county.

Section 2. County Historical Survey Committees in existence on the effective date of this amendatory Act become county historical commissioners as if the members were appointed under chapter 152, Acts of the 58th Legislature, 1963, as amended by this Act (Article 6145.1, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes). If the terms of any members expire before January, 1977, the Commissioners Court shall appoint successors to serve until new appointments are made in January 1977. Members may be appointed to succeed themselves.

Section 3. Chapter 150, Acts of the 58th Legislature, 1963, (Article 2372r, Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), is repealed.

On January 14th, the Commissioners Court voted to prepare a Resolution for approval from the Legislature to abolish the office of County Attorney & District Attorney and to create a Criminal District Attorney for Tyler County.

I have read this resolution and think that Tyler County will benefit greatly from this Resolution if item (j) which reads:

"The newly created Criminal District Attorney of Tyler County is hereby permitted to actively engage in the private practice of Law" is deleted/

This office will pay a salary of 80 to 90% of ~~XXXX~~ the salary of a District Judge. After some checking I find this salary would be between \$45,000. and 52,000. per year. I feel Tyler County deserves a full-time Criminal District Attorney for this kind of salary and not the part-time attorney we would have if he or she is allowed to engage in private practice.

If we have a part-time Criminal District Attorney, our jail could become over crowded and Tyler County citizens could find themselves in the position of haveing to build a new jail. and after listening to the budget problems of our County for the past few weeks, this county cannot afford this.

Again, I am 100% in favor of a <sup>Our Own</sup> ~~XXXXXXXX~~ Criminal District Attorney, but beg you to reconsider, and make this a full-time office by deleting (J) of your Resolution.

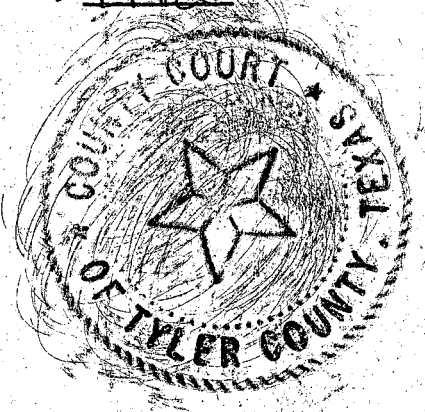

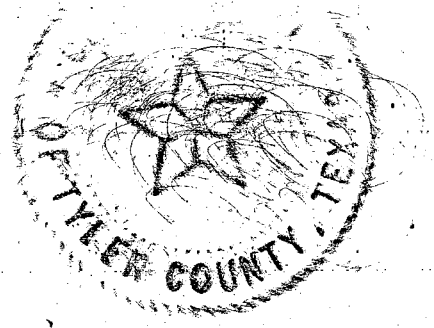
