A Special Meeting of the Commissioner's Court met on Friday, March 16, 1984, at 10:00 A. M. All members being present. The meeting was opened with prayer by Commissioner James R. Jordan.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to approve the bid received from Knapp Ford Sales, Inc. for a new Truck for Pct. #1, to be equipped with a Gallion bed and without air. Time Warrants will be issued for this truck. Purchase price for this type equipped truck is \$14,899.00, with the installed Gallion bed price at an extra \$3,608.87, amounting to a total price of \$18,507.87. All voted yes and none no. At this time, a motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Mahan to approve the bid received from Knapp Ford Sales, Inc. for a new Truck for Pct. #2, to be equipped with a Gallion bed and with air, to be paid for with funds from Pct. #2. Purchase price for this type equipped truck is \$16,053.37, with the installed Gallion bed priced at an extra \$3,608.87, amounting to a total price of \$19,662.24. All voted yes and none no. Also, at this time, a motion was made by Commissioner Jordan and seconded by Commissioner Riley to table any decision to be made concerning the purchase of a new truck for Pct. #4, until further information could be obtained.
