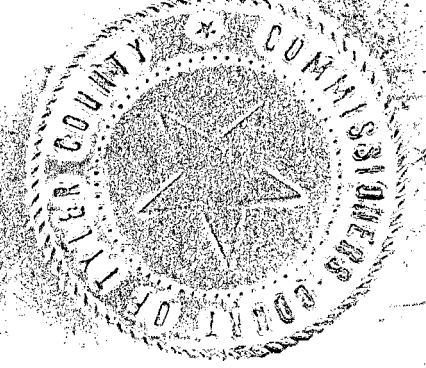
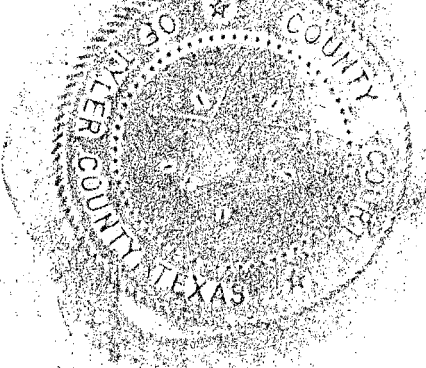
Judge Allen Sturrock appointed Tyler County Auditor, Ann Fondren, to serve on the Self Evaluation Committee for Revenue Sharing.
