A Special Meeting of the Commissioner's Court was held on Monday, December, 1984, at 10:00 A. M. All members being present except Commissioner Jerry Mahan. The meeting was opened with prayer by Commissioner Jordan.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to approve the bonds covering the following listed officials, both elected and appointed: Pat Hardy, Criminal District Attorney; Wanda Brasher, Justice of the Peace #1; B. J. Vardeman, Criminal Investigator; Harley Crews, Constable Pct. #3; Barbara Tolbert, Tax Assessor-Collector; Ann Fondren, County Auditor; Lynn Clamon, Constable Pct. #2; Willis Graham, Commissioner Pct. #3; Leon Fowler, Sheriff; Arthur Gilchrist, Constable Pct. #4; Maxie Riley, Commissioner Pct. #1; John D.
