A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to table until Friday, January 18, 1985, at 10:00 A. M., any decision to be made concerning the County Auditor's Monthly report, in order that the Court might have time to study the report before approving. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Graham to approve the following listed days as the County Holidays for 1985:

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to accept the Handicapped Self Evaluation Report from Deep East Texas Council of Governments Economic Development District, and to report on needed corrections. Corrections to be made are to remove an unnecessary rail in the restroom now used by the handicapped; place a sign on the Tax Office designating the restroom for the handicapped; notifying each employee in the County Clerk's Office, or the County Judge's office to contact personnel in the Sheriff's Office and Justice of the Peace, Pct. #1, office, when a handicapped person needs to contact these two offices, since a ramp could not be built to cover steps in the hall of the Courthouse; and to put a new handicapped parking place on the Courthouse square, located on Highway 190.
