TYLER COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT  
REGULAR MEETING  
JULY 8, 1985---10:00 A. M.

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The Regular Meeting of the Commissioner's Court was held on Monday, July 8, 1985, at 10:00 A. M. All members being present. The Meeting was opened with prayer by Commissioner James R. Jordan.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to approve the County Extension's monthly report, as submitted by Janie Marquiss, County Agent. All voted yes and none no.

Janie Marquiss, County Agent, appeared before the Court to present Certificates from A & M University to members of various departments for attending the Annual Seminar in College Station, Texas. Persons receiving these certificates were Judge Allen Sturrock, District Clerk Patricia Brown, District Clerk's Deputy Tina Bump, County Treasurer Austin Fuller, County Clerk's Deputy Seta Birdwell, and County Clerk's Deputy Janet Brown. Judge Allen Sturrock expressed the Court's appreciation to County Agent Marquiss for the presentation.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Jordan to grant permission to Veterans Service Officer David Enloe for attending Seminar in San Antonio, Texas, in August, 1985. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Graham to appoint Commissioner James R. Jordan to serve on the Deep East Texas Council of Governments Board of Directors, for the new fiscal year beginning on October 1, 1985. All voted yes and none no. See Attached.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Graham to table any decisions to be made concerning filling any Election Judges vacancies until Friday, July 12, 1985, at 10:00 A. M. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to table any decisions to be made concerning the approval of the County Auditor's Monthly report, as submitted by County Auditor Ann Fondren, until Friday, July 12, 1985, at 10:00 A. M.; in order to study the report more thoroughly. All voted yes and none no.

Ann Fondren, County Auditor, appeared before the Court to discuss a new Federal Law concerning monthly allowances and travel pay; stating that the new law advises that this type of pay should be placed on payroll, with withholding taxes and social security to be withheld from same. After some discussion on the matter, a motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Graham to pay the allowances and travel pay as per usual, with each person receiving this type of pay, to be issued Form 1099 at the end of each year, for reporting purposes to the Government; also, to give Auditor Fondren more time to check more thoroughly into the matter. All voted yes and none no. Also, Auditor Fondren discussed the amount now allowed by a new Federal Law on travel, stating that any amount over .20½ cents that was paid to an employee of the County would have to be reported on Form 1099. After discussing this problem for a period of time, a motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to lower the amount of .25¢ now being paid for mileage to .20½¢, in order to avoid the responsibility of having to issue the Form 1099 to any employees that might have drawn travel pay during the year. All voted yes and none no. At this time, a motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Riley to approve paying travel allowances this month in the usual manner; instructing Auditor Fondren to issue checks for same. All voted yes and none no.

Sheriff Leon Fowler and Deputy Sheriff Max Langston met with the Court to discuss amending the Sheriff's Department Budget for 1985, for the next three (3) months, in order to be able to hire new deputies and purchase needed equipment for the new deputies; This being done because of the problems caused by the new Wage and Hour Law. After discussing the matter for some time, a motion was made by Commissioner Jordan and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to table any decision to be made until 1:30 P.M., this date, in order for Commissioners James R. Jordan and Willis Graham to study the schedule presented to the Court by Sheriff Fowler and perhaps reach some decision on the matter. (These two (2) Commissioners having been appointed by Judge Sturrock for this purpose).

RECESSED UNTIL 1:30 P.M.

IN SESSION:

More discussion was held at this time between members of Commissioners Court and Sheriff Fowler, along with his Deputy, Max Langston, concerning the Wage and Hour Law, and the necessity of hiring more deputies and obtaining new equipment in order to comply with the law concerning overtime pay for employees. No decision was reached at this time.

RECESSED FOR THIRTY MINUTES:

IN SESSION:

At this time, it was agreed by members of the Court to amend the Sheriff's Budget for the remainder of the year 1985, and allow the Sheriff to hire two (2) extra Deputies and purchase one (1) new car, instead of three (3) extra Deputies and two (2) new cars as agreed upon during a previous meeting. Sheriff Fowler stated that he would try to use these extra employees and equipment to the best advantage in order to give the County residents as much protection as possible, and to try to comply with the new rules and regulations under the new Wage and Hour Law.

RECESSED AT 4:00 P.M. UNTIL 9:00 A.M. TUESDAY, JULY 9, 1985.

IN SESSION: 9:00 A.M., JULY 9, 1985.

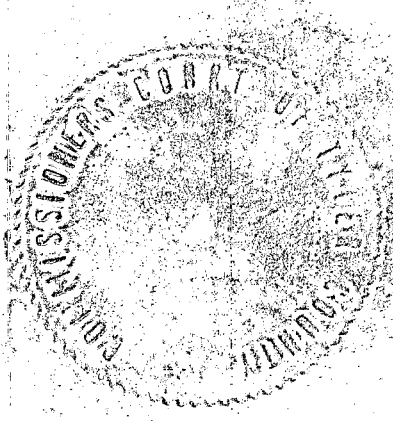
This session opened with prayer by Commissioner James R. Jordan. Sheriff Leon Fowler and Deputy Max Langston met with the Court to continue discussion on the wage and hour problems existing in the Sheriff's Department. Deputy Langston had made a tape recording at the meeting held in Austin, Texas, on the new Wage and Hour Law, and presented this recording to the Court in order to review some of the information that he had. Dwight Martin, representative of the Attorney General's Office, was the speaker on this particular tape. After listening to several parts of the tape, a motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Graham to approve amending the Sheriff's Department Budget for 1985, granting the Department an additional \$26,000.00 for the remainder of the fiscal year 1985. All voted yes and none no.

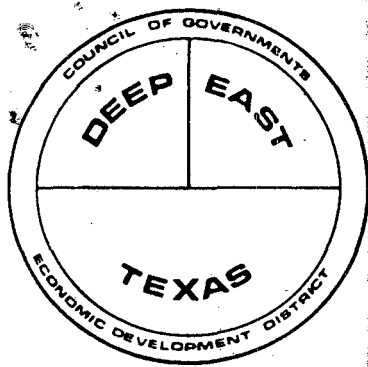

Article 1666-"The auditor shall prepare an estimate of all the revenues and expenses, and annually submit it to the Commissioners Court, which Court shall carefully make a budget of all appropriations to be set aside for the various expenses of the county government in each branch and department. He shall open an account with each appropriation in said budget, and all warrants drawn against same shall be entered to said account. He shall carefully keep an oversight of same to see that the expenses of any department do not exceed said budget appropriation, and keep said court advised of the condition of said appropriation accounts from time to time."




