The Regular Meeting of the Commissioner's Court was held on Monday, October 14, 1985 at 10:00 A.M. All members being present. The meeting was opened with prayer by Commissioner Jordan.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley to accept the bid of \$ 750.00 from Emmanuel Baptist Church for the Dodge Mini-Van. Commissioner Lowe seconded this motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lowe and seconded by Commissioner Graham to accept the bid of \$1,011.11 from Lade Sales for the 1983 Chevrolet Sheriff's car. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED.

Commissioner Riley made a motion to adopt the option of a ten(10) year retirement vesting plan rather than the 12 year vesting plan for retirement benefits. Commissioner Lowe seconded this motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED.

Commissioner Lowe made a motion to approve the County Extension Monthly report. Commissioner Riley seconded this motion. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley to table approving the Auditor's Monthly report until Friday, October 18, 1985. The commissioners needed more time to review the report. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Jordan. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Lowe to approve payment of monthly allowances and travel as requested by the county auditor. Also, the auditor will be permitted to send memos to all officials asking them to refrain from purchases until Ad Valorem taxes are received. Commissioner Graham seconded this motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Jordan to appoint Barbara Tolbert, by resolution, as a nominee for the Tyler County Tax Appraisal Board of Directors. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED.

Commissioner Graham made a motion to replace election judges of Precinct #10 and Precinct #14. New election judges will be Jack Lewellen; Precinct #10 and W.E. "Bill" Brown; Precinct #14. Commissioner Jordan seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED.

A motion was made by Commissioner Graham and seconded by Commissioner Riley to solicit bids of selling a 1964 pickup from Precinct #3 and a two-ton Ford truck from Precinct #4. The bids will be opened November 12, 1985. The vehicles can be seen at the precinct barns of Precinct #3 and Precinct #4. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Graham and seconded by Commissioner Lowe to accept the bid from John Deere of Lufkin, Texas for a used maintainer for Precinct #3. This will be paid for by one(1) time warrant for \$35,000.00 which will mature in 6 months. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED. The Motor Grader bid was submitted by Harrell Machinery, Inc. in Lufkin, Texas, a distributor of John Deere equipment.

Commissioner Riley made a motion to extend the bidding time of accepting bids on liability insurance for county, elected officials and sheriff's department. The motion was seconded by Commissioner graham. All voted yes and none no.

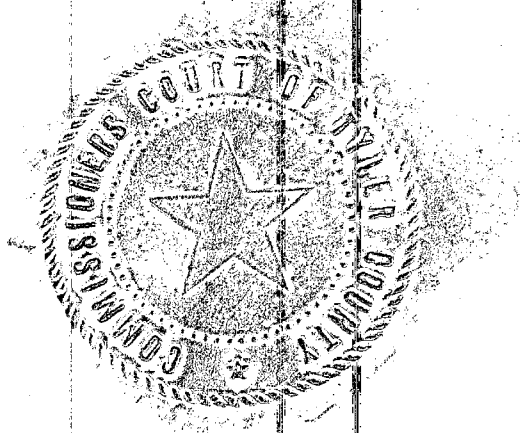

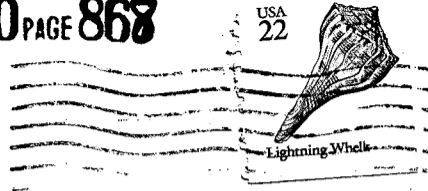

"2. Effective January 1, 1986:

- (a) Any person who on or after January 1, 1986 is a TCDRS member who shall have accumulated ten (10) or more years of credited service with this County and other subdivisions that have adopted ten (10) year service retirement eligibility under Section 54.207 of the TCDRS Act and has attained the age of sixty (60) shall have the right to retire and receive a service retirement annuity.
- (b) Any person who on or after January 1, 1986 is a TCDRS member who shall have accumulated sufficient years of credited service with this County and other subdivisions which have adopted the provisions of Section 54.207 of the TCDRS Act such that, when the years of such credited service is added to the member's years of attained age produces a sum equal to or in excess of eighty (80), shall have the right to retire and receive a service retirement annuity.
- (c) Any person who on or after January 1, 1986 is a TCDRS member who shall have accumulated ten (10) or more years of credited service with this County and other subdivisions which have adopted the provisions of Section 54.207 of the TCDRS Act, and who is not eligible for service retirement, may retire and receive a disability retirement annuity if the member is certified as disabled in accordance with Section 54.303 (b)(2) of the TCDRS Act.
- (d) Any person who on or after January 1, 1986 is a TCDRS member who shall have accumulated twenty (20) or more years of credited service with this county and other subdivisions that have adopted twenty (20) year deferred service eligibility or who shall have accumulated ten (10) or more years of credited service with this county and other subdivisions that have adopted ten (10) year deferred service eligibility and has attained the age of sixty (60) shall have the right of "deferred service retirement" under the terms and conditions prescribed in Sections 54.203 and 54.207 of the TCDRS Act.
- (e) Any person who on or after January 1, 1986 is a TCDRS member and who shall have accumulated at least ten (10) years of credited service with this and other participating subdivisions which have adopted ten (10) year vesting, shall have the right, despite withdrawal from service prior to attainment of age sixty (60), to remain a member and to retire at or after age sixty (60), conditioned that he lives to date of retirement and that he shall not have withdrawn his accumulated deposits with the System.

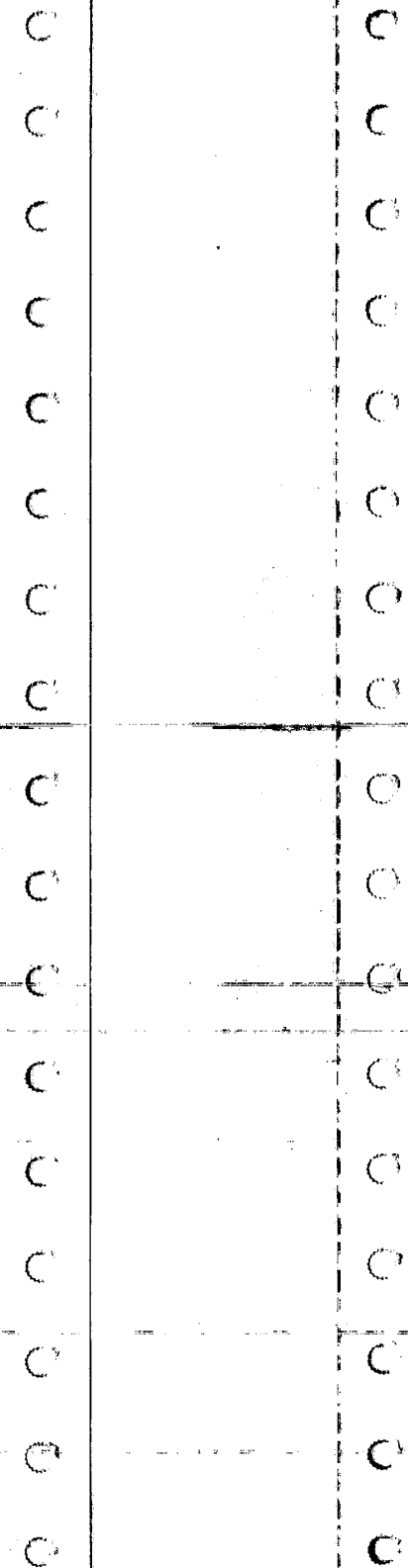

WHEREAS, the 66th Legislature of the State of Texas enacted SB 621 which provides that an Appraisal District be established in each county.

WHEREAS, the 67th Legislature of the State of Texas enacted HB 30 Seciton 6.031 which provides that both the number of directors and the method of selection may be changed by the governing bodies of three-fourths of the taxing units entitled to vote within the Appraisal District.

WHEREAS, on September 5, 1979, the three-fourths rule was implemented by resolutions stating that each taxing unit entitled to vote may nominate and elect one member to the Board of Directors.

WHEREAS, by October 1, 1985, the three-fourths rule has not been revoked and remains in effect.

WHEREAS, a motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Jordan that the governing body pass the following resolution.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that it is this governing body's intent to nominate Barbara Tolbert to have his/her name placed on the ballot for the Tyler County Tax Appraisal Board of Directors.

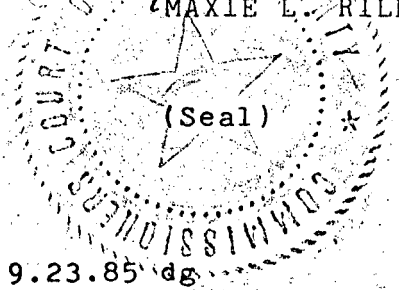


