

Dear Judge Sturrock:

Once again we're having to ask for your help in order that we may continue to distribute commodities to persons in your county. We have been informed by the Texas Department of Human Services in Austin that there will be no funds for reimbursement of the commodity program expenses in Texas from June through September, 1986. A new contract will begin on October 1, 1986, and hopefully funds will be allocated to continue this program. We have been told there are foods available if we can find funds to support the program.

On May 5, 1986 our Board of Directors instructed me to contact each county judge immediately so that the commodity program expenses might be included on the May 12th Commissioners' Court agenda. In order to continue the distribution of commodities, Tri-County will absorb the personnel costs for its employees during the period of June through September, 1986. We are asking each county to contribute \$300.00 per month or \$1,200.00 for the four (4) month period. As of October 1, 1986, we should be able to operate the program, if funds are allocated by the State, and the counties agree to contribute \$100.00 per month.

I know that funds are short for everyone now (we've taken cuts in all of our programs), but I think if we all work together during these tough times, we can continue to assist those persons in need. Your past support has been greatly appreciated.

Please let me know your county's decision by May 19, 1986, so that I may inform our Board. If you need any additional information, please contact me and I will be happy to answer your questions.
