the Commissioner's Court in and for Tyler County, Texas convened in a Special Meeting at the Commissioner's Courtroom in Woodville, Texas, the following members of the Court present, to wit:

A motion was made by Commissioner Conner and seconded by Commissioner Barnes to approve the payment of bills as submitted by the County Auditor, Janie DuBose. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED REGISTER.

Vickie Thompson, representing the Tyler County Children Services Board, reported to the Court that the books were supposed to be audited by the County Auditor each year, however the past bookkeeping system was not sufficient for an audit. Ms. Thompson also reported that "from here out" sufficient records will be kept for future auditing procedures. No motions were made. SEE ATTACHED CORRESPONDANCE.

Commissioner Barnes made a motion to accept the monthly report from Justice of Peace, Pct. #1, Wanda Brasher. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Conner. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED REPORT.

A representative of Wildwood Property Owners Assoc. requested that the Court approve an amendment to plat recorded for Block 646 in Wildwood Resort City. The amendment shows the abandonment of one easement and the establishing of a new one. A motion was made by Commissioner Conner and seconded by Commissioner Graham to accept the amendment for recording purposes only in the plat records in the office of the County Clerk. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED SURVEY PLAT.

A motion was made by Commissioner Barnes and seconded by Commissioner Graham to defer the consideration and approval of additional personnel for the Justice Center until a later date. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Barnes made a motion to defer approving final payment to A.I.D. ARCHITECTS until problems with television cables and antenna wires being pulled in Justice Center, have been resolved. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Graham. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by **Commissioner Conner** to adopt a resolution disapproving of the abolishment of the office of **County Treasurers** and that a copy be sent to the Texas House of Representatives, Committee on County Affairs. The motion was seconded by **Commissioner Barnes**. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED RESOLUTION.

**Commissioner Barnes** made a motion to table discussion of crossings of County roads with pipeline of **Cherxon** until a letter of agreement or contract has been received and is agreeable with the Court and the Criminal District Attorney. The motion was seconded by **Commissioner Conner**. All voted yes and none no.

**Criminal District Attorney, Pat Hardy** requested that the Court approve \$ 1,240.00 for remodeling of office space allocated to his department. A motion was made by **Commissioner Conner** to defer approval of the funds until the Court could see if money was available. The motion was seconded by **Commissioner Barnes**. All voted yes and none no. Mr. Hardy stated he felt the estimate by Joe Coward was for materials and labor, if it is not he would come back to the Court and ask that the motion be resubmitted.

**County Sheriff, D. Fowler** reported that if the Court allowed prisoners to be housed in Tyler County, **additional personnel** would be needed. If they did not allow these extra prisoners, he could get by with the hiring of one cook. This would save the County money due to obtaining commodities that could be used instead of purchasing expensive frozen dinners. **Mr. and Mrs. Brasher** both agreed that it would not be safe for prisoners to clean offices other than the Sheriff's department. Therefore, a custodian would also be needed for the **Justice Center**. They also made the Court aware that cleaning supplies and equipment needed to be purchased. After much discussion, a motion was made by **Commissioner Barnes** to employ a full time cook at a salary of \$ 5.00 per hour. The motion was seconded by **Commissioner Conner**. All voted yes and none no. A motion was made by **Commissioner Barnes** and seconded by **Commissioner Conner** to employ **Carl Jones** as custodian at a salary of \$ per hour on a part-time basis of 2 days a week. This is in agreement with him in using his own equipment. Mr. Jones will be responsible to the Sheriff and the dispatcher for keeping his time sheet. This is with the understanding that he gets the floors in shape right away. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by **Commissioner Conner** and seconded by **Commissioner Barnes** to defer the workshop to discuss a fee schedule for the use of the **County Dump** until a meeting could be called. All voted yes and none no.

THERE BEING NO FURTHER BUSINESS, THE MEETING ADJOURNED.
