Judge Owens opened the meeting, then ask Commissioner Jordan to preside in order for him to meet with officials from MHMR.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Barnes to table consideration of appointing an inspector for sewer systems in Tyler County for further study and more information can be obtained. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Riley made a motion to approve the deputation and employment of employees for the Sheriff's department as follows:

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Barnes. All voted yes and none no SEE ATTACHED DEPUTATIONS.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Mahan to approve contract labor for the County Auditor, using funds in her budget, until her secretary is able to return to work. All voted yes and none no.

Victor Cain with the Texas Department of Health met with the Court and reviewed the regulations, passed by the EPA, that will change the operations for the sanitary landfills drastically. Proposed regulations include no burning after September 1, daily cover of garbage, new trenches will have to be certified, monitor wells will be needed, and after a site is closed the County will be responsible for 30 years.

A motion was made to recess until 3:00 P.M. by Commissioner Riley, in order that Mr. Cain could view the sites with the respective Commissioner. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Barnes. All voted yes and none no.

COURT IN SESSION ...3:00 P.M.

Mr. Cain reported to the Court his findings after the unofficial inspection of the sites. He stated that the main problem was that some of the sites were out of room. He advised that the dumps are not to be open on Sundays unless the County had a special permit.

Commissioner Jordan stated that the sanitary landfill at Woodville would be closed on Sunday now. Due to State Law, a motion was made by Commissioner Riley that the sanitary landfill at Woodville would be open from 7:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M., Monday to Friday; 7:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M., on Saturday and closed on Sunday. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Mahan. This will be effective February 1, 1989. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Barnes and seconded by Commissioner Mahan to defer action of other landfill sites until Friday, January 27, 1989. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Barnes and seconded by Commissioner Riley that the meeting adjourn. All voted yes and none no.
