Sheriff Hennigan proposed to hire a jail administrator for the supervision of INS prisoners. The salary would be \$1582.00 per month plus benefits with no overtime pay. He would have responsibilities such as schedules and ordering supplies for the jail. The requirements governing a jail administrator were discussed. The expenses of the jail administrator would be funded from INS at no expense to the County. Commissioner Jordan moved that Sheriff Hennigan be authorized to hire a jail administrator to be paid from INS Funds at the monthly salary of \$1582.00 plus benefits with the understanding that this will be terminated in the event that the Fund does not cover the expense. Commissioner Riley seconded this motion. All voted yes and none no.

The County Auditor recommended establishing a separate fund from the General Fund for the revenue from INS prisoners. A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Barnes to create a Special Jail INS Fund for handling of accounts for prisoners transferred under the INS. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley that the Sheriff hire a part-time cook for the Tyler County Justice Center. Commissioner Riley amended his motion to read that the cook be paid \$5.00 an hour on contract labor with workmen's compensation with the stipulation that the job terminates if INS funds are not available. Commissioner Barnes seconded this motion. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Barnes that the meeting adjourn. All voted yes and none no.
