A motion was made by Commissioner Jordan and seconded by Commissioner Riley to approve paying the bill submitted by Barnes Plumbing. All voted yes and none no with Commissioner Barnes abstaining.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Barnes to approve paying the remainder of the accounts payable as submitted by the County Auditor. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED GENERAL LEDGER DISTRIBUTION REGISTER.

Commissioner Riley made a motion to defer consideration of a resolution on locating a 1000 man detention facility in Woodville until the County Judge could clear up some of the language in the resolution. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Barnes. All voted yes and none no. Commissioner Jordan added that the Court would go on record supporting the detention facility being located in Woodville.

Commissioner Barnes made a motion to accept the bid for \$660.00 from Timberline Constructors, Inc. to remove trees from the site at the Human Services Center. Commissioner Riley seconded this motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED LETTER AND FREEDSAL.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Barnes to allow Justices of Peace from Pct. #1 and Pct. #2 to attend the Governor's Law Enforcement Conference on June 23. Funds are provided for within their budget for this expense. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Barnes to amend the budget withdrawing money from the Miscellaneous Expense under Commissioner's Court Appropriations to allow a donation of \$500.00 to the Southeast Texas RC & D. Commissioner Riley seconded this motion. All voted yes and none no.

The County Clerk opened the bids for used vehicles from the Sheriff's department being from Woodville Auto Parts, Ruth Stanford and John Max Lade. Commissioner Riley motioned that action concerning these bids be tabled for further study. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Barnes. All voted yes and none no. A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Barnes to set speed limits on county roads at 30mph unless otherwise posted. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Barnes reported that the committee had met to consider the cable T.V. network. As a result, Commissioner Barnes added that he wanted some firm answers to questions as 1) increases of charges and fees, 2) quantity of house per mile for service, 3) designated areas of the County to be serviced. Therefore, a motion was made by Commissioner Barnes authorizing a letter from the Court to ChannelVision requesting resolute answers to questions by the Court; and that this matter be tabled for further study. Commissioner Riley seconded this motion. All voted yes and none no.
