The Court met for a budget workshop tabled from October 2, 1989.

In deliberation of increases to the budget, Judge Owens proposed getting an authority on workmen's compensation to do a study for Tyler County. Commissioner Mahan suggested that the County consider the necessity and feasibility of insurance premiums for families of employees. Reaction varied as to health insurance premiums. Commissioner Riley agreeing that it was a considerable cost to the County. Commissioner Barnes expressed concern with cutting the payment of insurance premiums for families of employees and suggested that the departments make further cuts to keep from raising the tax rate over 3%. Commissioner Jordan agreed that the insurance should not be cut. Judge Owens advised that the insurance issue should not be dealt with at this time; however it should be reviewed the first of 1990.

Court recessed at 11:15 a.m. for 15 minutes.

COURT BACK IN SESSION:

Judge Owens read aloud the Notice of Public Hearing on Tax Increase to be published in the newspaper as required by law. A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Riley to give public notice of a public hearing to be held on October 13, 1989 at 1:00 p.m. on the proposal to increase total tax revenues from properties on the tax roles in 1988 by 6.27%. Commissioners Mahan, Riley, Jordan and Judge Owens voted yes. Commissioner Barnes voted no. SEE ATTACHED NOTICE.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Barnes that the meeting recess until Tuesday, October 10, 1989. All voted yes and none no.
