The following were absent: Commissioner Barnes thereby constituting a quorum. In addition to the above were: none

Gene Koci and Gil Tubb made the Court aware that Aqua-culture Innovations Group, Inc. was considering a site within Tyler County for a fish farm. This industry would provide a 7.5 million dollar tax base and 310 jobs stimulating business for other establishments. 60% of all processed fish would be obtained from the private farms within the County. Another benefit is that an educational program will be instituted within the Woodville High School for students.

Commissioner Riley was impressed with the concept, however he would be opposed to the discharge of toxic chemicals in creeks, the smell of the plant in residential areas, and the disposal of salt water.

Commissioner Mahan inquired if the company would hire their unskilled labor from the Woodville area. Mr. Koci responded as to the levels of labor required.

Commissioner Jordan questioned as to the jobs for Tyler County citizens. Mr. Tubb replied that the projection is 130 employees the first year then additional 90 for the next two years.

Commissioner Riley motioned that pursuit to Texas law, a 100% abatement be given to A.I.G.I. from Tyler County for two years beginning with construction and for two years thereafter and for 3 years after construction for a total of five consecutive years. Terms and conditions to be negotiated with Tyler County and to be effective upon such mutual agreement. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Jordan. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Riley motioned that the meeting adjourn. Commissioner - Mahan seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.


