The invocation was delivered by Rev. Jack Lewellen.

Tom Mackey and Elmer Ray Oates presented the Court with a Certificate of Appreciation of Sponsorship from the **Southeast Texas Resource**Conservation & Development, Inc. for the support the Court had given to this program. SEE ATTACHED COPY OF CERTIFICATE.

Paul Cook, District Engineer with the **Texas Department of Transportation** presented a brief synopsis of several projects within the County:

Highway 92- working on line changes and surveying changes to satisfy property owners as best they could. The schematic will be done next. A public meeting should be scheduled around the first of November.

Highway 69- a consulting firm has been hired to work with the railroad company(report due October 13); has received approval to do right-of-way study and environmental report. He expected the environmental agencies to protest since the extension would be egressing through a national forest preserve for a distance of two miles.(mostly outside of Tyler Co.)

miles.(mostly outside of Tyler Co.)

US 190 West - four lane sections plus six foot shoulders;
trying to get this project appropriated with two millions dollars.

US 69 - requested three left turn lanes for Lake Hyatt Estates, Camp Urland Road and Seneca Road. Hoped to contract this work since maintenance forces were not available. This should be let around April of May of 1995.

Lights for Warren and Spurger- the foundations should be

Lights for Warren and Spurger- the foundations should be installed really soon. Delay was caused by priority of other towns having higher priority.

There were 8 persons in attendance interested in these projects. Mr. Cook answered questions from Bob Dickmeyer, concerning right turn lanes for Ivanhoe. Richard "Dick" Best from Mt. Carmel area, offered the help of citizens in the area, for the Hwy 92 extension, to lobby the environmental agencies. The details of an environmental study was explained. If everything goes like "clock work" the projected time of completion for the Hwy 92 extension would be approximately three years.

Commissioner Riley offered the help of the Court to get the projects moving.

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James Allison, attorney at law, presented a **plat** requesting approval on behalf of David Feagin for the **Eastwood Addition**. He was in agreement that the County would not be accepting the **roads**. A motion was made by **Commissioner Mahan** and seconded by **Commissioner Riley** to accept the plat for recording purposes only. All voted yes and none no. Mr. Allison indicated the plat was to be presented to the city council and afterwards he would present it for recording.

COURT TOOK A 10 MINUTE RECESS. COURT IN SESSION:

A motion was made by Commissioner Sawyer and seconded by Commissioner Riley to approve the minutes of August 15, 1994. All voted yes and none no.

Upon balancing with the County Auditor's report, a motion was made by **Commissioner Riley** and seconded by **Commissioner Sawyer** to approve the **County Treasurer's monthly report** as submitted by Tina Bump. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED REPORT.

Commissioner Mahan motioned to approve the monthly reports of the Adult Probation and Juvenile Probation Department. Commissioner Barnes seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED REPORTS.

Commissioner Riley motioned to accept the monthly report of the Justice of the Peace, Pct. #1. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Barnes. All voted yes and none no.

Sherry Jeanes informed the Court she would be attending the National Convention as a delegate, at her own expense. A motion was made by Commissioner Riley to approve the monthly reports of the County Extension Department. Commissioner Mahan seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED REPORTS.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Sawyer to approve the monthly report of the County Auditor as submitted. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED STATEMENT OF CONDITION.

Commissioner Sawyer made the motion to approve the accounts payable from the County Auditor's Office as submitted. Commissioner Mahan seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED ACCOUNTS PAYABLE PAID & GENERAL DISTRIBUTION LEDGER.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley to approve the Forfeiture Fund Budget of the Criminal District Attorney. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Barnes. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED BUDGET.

Commissioner Mahan made a motion to approve the M.H.M.R. Contract. Commissioner Sawyer seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED CONTRACT.

Bids for used cars to be sold from the Sheriff's department were opened and read aloud by the County Clerk. A motion was made by Commissioner Riley to table a decision until Friday, September 16th.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Barnes. All voted yes and none no.

James Clark presented abatement procedures, in accordance with the Health and Safety Code, concerning the nuisance of **buildings** which are falling down or a health trap. A motion was made by **Commissioner Mahan** and seconded by **Commissioner Barnes** to adopt the **abatement procedures relating to public nuisance laws**. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED.

Judge Owens and Kinney Simpson related background of the formation of community service. It was requested the supervision of services

performed by defendants on community service be managed under the commissioner's court and not the probation department. Commissioner Mahan agreed the Court had more knowledge of dealing with maintenance services, however he felt it was the probation officer that had more training in dealing with probationers. Mr. /Kimpson requested that if it was the desire of the Court that the probation department continue with administration, his department would be given total authority. Judge Owens moved the Court accept the responsibility of administration of community service, hiring a supervisor of their The motion was seconded by Commissioner Riley. Commissioner Riley and Judge Owens voted for the motion. Commissioners Mahan and Sawyer voted against. Commissioner Barnes The motion failed to carry. No other action was taken.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Mahan to solicit insurance proposals for the County's Health The proposal will be heard September 16, 1994. All voted Insurance. ves and none no.

Commissioner Mahan motioned to transfer a "cook" position within the sheriff's departmental budget in order to have a part-time deputy, as requested by Gary Hennigan. The motion was made by Commissioner Sawyer. All voted yes and none no.

The meeting was adjourned by the County Judge.

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## PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT

Pursuant to the authority granted under the Texas Health and Safety Code, Title 7, Chapter 534, DEEP EAST TEXAS REGIONAL MENTAL HEALTH MENTAL RETARDATION SERVICES (hereafter, "MHMR") enters into this Contract with Tyler County Commissioners Court, (hereafter, "SERVICE PROVIDER").

### Recitals

WHEREAS, SERVICE PROVIDER, is a Law Enforcement Agency with Licensed Peace Officers for the State of Texas, whose present address is County Courthouse, Woodville, Texas 75979, and whose Social Security or Federal Employer Identification number is  $\underline{74-6002576}$ .

WHEREAS, SERVICE PROVIDER, has the following qualifications:

County Sheriff's Department

AND WHEREAS, MHMR desires to be provided by SERVICE PROVIDER and SERVICE PROVIDER wishes to provide to MHMR, certain support services in the area of patient transportation.

### Contract Term

1. The parties agree that this Contract shall be for one year, beginning on September 1, 1994, and ending on August 31, 1995, or upon the completion of all services requested by MHMR, whichever is earlier, unless otherwise terminated as provided herein.

### <u>Renewal</u>

2. The Contract may be renewed with the written approval of both parties. The term of any renewal shall be for one year immediately following the expiration of the term of this Contract or any renewal thereof, as the case may be. Unless otherwise agreed, any renewal shall be agreed to in writing prior to thirty (30) days before the expiration of the term of this Contract or any renewal thereof, as the case may be. MHMR and SERVICE PROVIDER agree to negotiate any contract renewal at arms length and in good faith.

### <u>Services</u>

- 3. SERVICE PROVIDER agrees to provide MHMR with the following services;
  - a. To provide Mental Health Deputy Transportation to clientele identified by Deep East Texas MHMR via the local MHMR Center or Deep East Texas MHMR Crisis Line who is in need of transportation to an inpatient psychiatric facility.
  - b. To transport Mental Health clientele identified by MHMR to the inpatient facility designated by MHMR. (Substance Abuse clientele are excluded from this Contract.)
  - c. To transport identified Mental Health clientele on a timely basis in which transportation occurs within four (4) hours of notification by MHMR.
- $4.\,$  SERVICE PROVIDER will provide services in accordance with the following specifications:
- a. To provide MHMR with a monthly statement of services rendered indicating the patient's name, date of service, type of service and destination, total Deputy time per trip, and the cost of the service, and
- b. The SERVICE PROVIDER agrees to complete the necessary paperwork required by MHMR and submit it no later than the fifteenth (15th) of the following month in order for MHMR to provide client data and budgetary information on a timely basis.
- 5. SERVICE PROVIDER will be allowed the use of the following property, equipment, space or staff to be provided by MHMR:

The SERVICE PROVIDER will not require the use of property, equipment, space or staff of MHMR.

6. SERVICE PROVIDER will, in the performance of services pursuant to this Contract, interact with staff, other service agents, service providers and consultants of MHMR in a cooperative manner and will consult with such persons regarding services provided under this Contract as necessary.

### Delivery of Service

- 7. SERVICE PROVIDER will coordinate with MHMR the SERVICE PROVIDER'S schedule for providing services under this Contract. SERVICE PROVIDER'S schedule must be mutually agreed upon by SERVICE PROVIDER and MHMR, but may be altered at the request of either party whenever possible.
- 8. SERVICE PROVIDER agrees to provide the aforementioned services in such facilities, and at such locations as requested by MHMR.

### Billing and Method of Payment

9. The parties agree that SERVICE PROVIDER shall bill Tyler County MHMR Center, an organizational unit of MHMR, and MHMR shall pay for services provided herein according to the rate established in the following schedule:

The SERVICE PROVIDER shall be reimbursed at the rate of FIVE AND NO/100 (\$5.00) DOLLARS per hour for transportation which is one-half of the actual costs. Transportation costs begin when the patient and Deputy leave the county in route to the location identified by MHMR. Transportation of mental health clients within the SERVICE PROVIDER'S county shall not be covered under this contract.

The parties agree that the total amount which may be expended under this Contract shall not exceed the sum of \$1,000.00. In the event such amount is reached, SERVICE PROVIDER shall provide transportation services as outlined in the Texas Mental Health Code, Section 14. Should the SERVICE PROVIDER be detained at any of the locations listed in the rate schedule, in the performance of his duties, he shall be reimbursed at the rate of FIVE AND NO/100 (\$5.00) DOLLARS per hour.

10. MHMR agrees to make payment to SERVICE PROVIDER by check payable to SERVICE PROVIDER and mailed to SERVICE PROVIDER'S address shown herein or to such other address which SERVICE PROVIDER may provide to MHMR in writing.

### Independent Contractor

11. It is the intent of MHMR and SERVICE PROVIDER that SERVICE PROVIDER is an independent contractor and not an employee of MHMR for any purpose. SERVICE PROVIDER and MHMR understand and agree that (a) MHMR will not withhold or pay on behalf of SERVICE PROVIDER any sums for income tax, unemployment insurance, Social Security, or any other withholding pursuant to any law or requirement of any governmental body, or make available to SERVICE PROVIDER any of the benefits, including workers compensation insurance coverage, afforded to employees of MHMR, (b) all such withholdings, payments and benefits, if any, are the sole responsibility of SERVICE PROVIDER. SERVICE PROVIDER indemnifies MHMR from any and all causes of action, claims, damages, or liability, including attorneys fees and legal expenses, incurred by MHMR with respect to such payments, withholdings, and benefits. SERVICE PROVIDER will be free from MHMR control in the manner and method of providing services as long as such services are provided in accordance with accepted procedures of SERVICE PROVIDER'S profession, the Rules of the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation (hereafter "TXMHMR"), and applicable standards of accrediting or certifying agencies.

### Laws, Rules, and Regulations

- 12. The parties agree that SERVICE PROVIDER shall abide by the following laws, rules and regulations and orders:
- a. All applicable federal laws, rules, regulations, Executive Orders, and standards, including, but not limited to, the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended; Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; the Age Discrimination in Employment Act; the Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended; and,
- b. All applicable state and local laws, rules, regulations, including, but not limited to T.R.C.S., Article 5561(h) and T.R.C.S., Article 5547-300, et. seq., and TXMHMR Commissioner's Rule, Chapter 403, Subchapter K relating to the confidentiality of records and other identifying information of clients served by MHMR.
- c. All applicable standards, rules, regulations, resolutions, directives, settlements, or plans of TXMHMR, including but not limited to the following:
- 1) TXMHMR Mental Health and Mental Retardation Community Service Standards,
- 2) TXMHMR Commissioner's Rule, Chapter 403, Subchapter T, Client Abuse and Neglect in Community Mental Health and Mental Retardation Centers, and
- 3) TXMHMR Commissioner's Rule, Chapter 401, Subchapter E, Contracts Management.
- d. All applicable TCADA, Medicare/Medicaid, ICF/MR and JCAHO rules, regulations, and standards.
- e. This agreement incorporates the policies and procedures, rules and regulations and purposes of TXMHMR, TCADA, and MHMR, as if recited herein verbatim and the SERVICE PROVIDER agrees to become familiar with and abide by all such applicable policies, procedures, rules and regulations.
- 13. If SERVICE PROVIDER is required to comply with any additional requirement pursuant to rules, standards, regulations, resolutions, settlements, or plans, and compliance results in a material change in SERVICE PROVIDER'S rights or obligations under this Contract or places a significant financial burden on SERVICE PROVIDER, SERVICE PROVIDER may, upon giving sixty (60) days' notice of such intention, be entitled to renegotiate this Contract. SERVICE PROVIDER shall have the burden of bringing forth proof of the financial burden placed on SERVICE PROVIDER caused by the compliance with MHMR standards. MHMR agrees to negotiate amendments to this Contract in good faith as needed.
- 14. SERVICE PROVIDER agrees that in receiving, storing, processing, or otherwise dealing with any information regarding drug and alcohol abuse clients, SERVICE PROVIDER will abide by the provisions of 42 U.S.C. Sec. 290-dd-3, regarding the confidentiality of client information; will institute appropriate procedures for safeguarding such information; and will undertake to resist in judicial proceedings all efforts to obtain access to such information, except as provided by 42 U.S.C. Sec. 290-dd-3.
- 15. SERVICE PROVIDER will institute appropriate procedures for safeguarding the confidentiality of information received during the performance of this Contract, including information which identifies any person being served by MHMR.

### Eligibility to Contract and Status of Service Agent

- 16. The parties agree that SERVICE PROVIDER shall notify MHMR immediately if, during the term of the Contract, SERVICE PROVIDER is held in abeyance or barred from the award of a federal or state contract. Such abeyance or bar shall constitute grounds for termination of this Contract without notice. SERVICE PROVIDER hereby certifies that it is not currently held in abeyance or barred from the award of any federal or state contract.
- 17. SERVICE PROVIDER shall maintain all certifications, registrations or licenses required by law to remain in good standing in its professional during the term of this Contract. In addition, SERVICE PROVIDER will inform MHMR immediately of any changes to said certifications, registrations or licenses during the term of this Contract.
- 18. SERVICE PROVIDER certifies that it is current in its payment of Texas franchise tax or that it is exempt from the payment of Texas franchise tax. A false statement regarding franchise tax status will be treated as a material breach of this Contract and will constitute grounds for termination of this Contract at the option of MHMR. If SERVICE PROVIDER becomes delinquent in the payment of its Texas franchise tax during the term of this Contract, payment by MHMR may be withheld until such delinquency is remedied.

### Conviction Disclosure

- 19. SERVICE PROVIDER certifies that neither SERVICE PROVIDER nor any of its employees, officers or other persons directly or indirectly involved in negotiating or providing services under this Contract have been convicted of a criminal offense related to any state or federally funded program. SERVICE PROVIDER shall immediately disclose the identify of any person convicted of any such crime. If SERVICE PROVIDER is so convicted, this Contract may be terminated without prior notice.
- 20. SERVICE PROVIDER certifies that neither SERVICE PROVIDER nor any of its employees, officers, or other persons directly or indirectly involved in negotiating or providing services under this Contract have been convicted of any crime listed in Exhibit "B" of the Departmental Rule regarding Contracts Management (Texas Administrative Code, Title 25, Chapter 401, Subchapter E). SERVICE PROVIDER shall immediately disclose to MHMR the identify of any person convicted of any such crime and immediately remove that individual from direct contact with all persons served. If SERVICE PROVIDER is so convicted, this Contract may be terminated without prior notice.

### Non-Discrimination

21. SERVICE PROVIDER will ensure that no person working or acting under its right of control will, on the basis of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, age, handicap, or political affiliation, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subject to discrimination under any of the policies of MHMR or under any applicable law.

### Access To, and Retention Of, Information

- 22. The SERVICE PROVIDER agrees that it will provide MHMR, TCADA and the TXMHMR unrestricted access to all facilities, service providers, individuals served, records, data, and other information under its control as necessary to enable MHMR, TCADA, and TXMHMR to audit, monitor, and review all financial and programmatic activities and services associated with this Contract, including the creation of reports and other records which may not be contained in the files of the SERVICE PROVIDER.
- 23. SERVICE PROVIDER agrees to furnish MHMR with any and all information, records, reports, documents, test results, and professional opinions, which SERVICE PROVIDER acquires, develops, or generates in the course of providing services under this Contract. All files and patient records of the SERVICE PROVIDER shall be available for review and copying at any time during or after the conclusion of this Contract.
- 24. SERVICE PROVIDER shall retain all financial records, all supporting documents, statistical records and any other records pertinent to the services of which request for payment is submitted to MHMR, for a period of five (5) years following the expiration or termination of this Contract. If any audit findings have not been resolved at the end of five (5) years, the records shall be retained until resolution of the audit findings, provided MHMR gives SERVICES PROVIDER notice of such unresolved findings before the end of such five (5) year period.
- 25. SERVICE PROVIDER agrees to comply with applicable provisions of the Social Security Act requiring SERVICE PROVIDER to make available to the Secretary of the United States Department of Health and Human Services, the Comptroller General, or any of the duly authorized agents, any and all books, documents, or records necessary to certify the nature and extent of costs claimed from Medicare/Medicaid relating to the services provided by SERVICE PROVIDER under this Contract, or relating to the services provided by any of SERVICE PROVIDER'S subcontractors who furnish services under this Contract, for a period of four (4) years after such services are provided.

### Report of Misconduct

- 26. SERVICE PROVIDER will report to MHMR, in writing, any allegation of abuse and neglect of persons served by MHMR in accordance with federal and state law and TXMHMR rules, including but not limited to TXMHMR Commissioner's Rule, Chapter 404, Subchapter, A, B, C and D. MHMR will immediately submit a copy of such report to the appropriate state agency.
- 27. SERVICE PROVIDER will report to MHMR, in writing, any allegation that a professional, licensed or certified by the State of Texas and employed by SERVICE PROVIDER, has committed any action that constitutes grounds for the denial or revocation of certification or licensure. MHMR will immediately submit a copy of such report to the appropriate state agency.

### Conflict of Interest

28. SERVICE PROVIDER certifies that none of its current employees who have procured or directly or indirectly aided in the procurement of this Contract, were within the last year former employees or officers of TXMHMR, the Texas Department of Human Services (TDHS), or MHMR. For purposes of this paragraph, "employee" means a person who on the last date of employment with TXMHMR, TDHS, or MHMR was compensated at or above the amount designated for a salary group 17, step 1 of the state position classification salary schedule, including a state employee who is exempt from the state position classification plan. This paragraph does not apply to a former officer or employee if the person was employed by a state agency other than TXMHMR, TDHS, or a community center other than MHMR.

### Investigation and Reports

- 29. If SERVICE PROVIDER provides any direct client care under this Contract, SERVICE PROVIDER understands and agrees that, as required or allowed by law, MHMR may request information from federal/state/local agencies, departments, or other appropriate sources, regarding any criminal history background of the SERVICE PROVIDER and its agents, employees and subcontractors.
- 30. SERVICE PROVIDER further understands and agrees that MHMR shall make appropriate reports to federal/state agencies, departments, commissions and/or boards in the event of a case of suspected client abuse in which SERVICE PROVIDER is involved, or when a report of other information relating to SERVICE PROVIDER is otherwise required by law.

### <u>Assignment</u>

31. SERVICE PROVIDER shall not assign this Contract or any of the duties or obligations required herein, nor any person who is not an employee of SERVICE PROVIDER to perform such duties or obligations, without first obtaining the prior written approval of MHMR. If MHMR permits any assignments of this Contract or the duties or obligations required herein, SERVICE PROVIDER shall require each person or entity approved by MHMR to comply with all duties and obligations required herein of SERVICE PROVIDER, and notwithstanding such assignment, SERVICE PROVIDER shall continue to be liable for the default of any person or entity who provides services under this Contract.

### Other Contracts

32. Nothing herein shall prevent SERVICE PROVIDER from furnishing similar services to other persons or entities provided such other contractors do not interfere with the delivery of services required herein. Nothing herein shall prevent MHMR from contracting to obtain services required herein from other providers.

### Development of Agreement

33. Both the SERVICE PROVIDER and MHMR have contributed to the development of this Contract and mutually agree to evaluate its effectiveness and plan for any changes or improvements.

### <u>Insurance</u>

34. The SERVICE PROVIDER shall be an independent contractor and not an employee, agent, or representative of MHMR under this Contract and shall maintain a policy of errors and omissions professional liability insurance in the amount necessary to cover any claims arising out of the performance of its services under this agreement and shall further indemnify, save harmless, and defend MHMR from any such claims arising from any act or omission of the SERVICE PROVIDER. The SERVICE PROVIDER shall be required to provide a copy of its certificate of insurance upon the return of this signed Contract. The SERVICE PROVIDER shall require that MHMR be shown as an added named insured party on such policy owned by SERVICE PROVIDER. The SERVICE PROVIDER shall also be required to submit a copy of the renewal certificate within fifteen (15) days in advance of termination.

The SERVICE PROVIDER shall also provide automobile liability insurance in amounts necessary to cover the limits of liability established by statute for units of local government such as MHMR.

The insurance coverage provided by the SERVICE PROVIDER shall be the primary coverage in the event of any claim. SERVICE PROVIDER shall be responsible for all deductible amounts, excess policy limits claim and non-covered claims and amounts.

### Indemnification

35. SERVICE PROVIDER agrees to indemnify and hold harmless MHMR, its Board of Trustees, employees and agents from all suits, actions, claims, costs or liability of any character, type or description, including attorneys fees and legal expenses, brought, made for or on account of any death, injury or damage received or sustained by any person or property arising out of or occasioned by the acts or omissions, including the negligence, of SERVICE PROVIDER or SERVICE PROVIDER'S agents or employees in the executive or performance of this Contract.

### <u>Termination</u>

- 36. A default shall occur under the terms of this Contract in the event of the following:
- a. If either party has failed to cure its failure, actual or anticipatory, to perform any of the obligations required herein or in any of the instruments and/or exhibits attached hereto, within ten (10) days after receiving notice of such failure from the other party; and/or
- b. If SERVICE PROVIDER submits falsified information, documents or fraudulent billings to MHMR, if SERVICE PROVIDER has made false statements as part of this Contract, of if SERVICE PROVIDER has failed to disclose information required by this Contract.
- 37. In the event of a default under the terms of this Contract, the non-defaulting party may (a) proceed by court action to enforce performance of any obligations required under this Contract and/or to recover all damages and expenses incurred by that party by reason of such breach or other failure of performance, (b) exercise any other right of remedy available at law or equity, and/or (c) terminate this Contract. In the event of any termination of this Contract, the non-defaulting party shall not be liable for any further payments or for any payment for undelivered work or unprovided services required under the Contract, and shall be entitled to repayment of payments for undelivered work or unprovided services required herein. These remedies are cumulative of all other rights or remedies specified in this Contract or now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute or otherwise, and may be enforced concurrently therewith or from time to time.
- 38. MHMR may terminate this Contract, without prior notice, if it reasonably believes that the health or safety of any person served by MHMR is in immediate jeopardy due to the acts or omissions of SERVICE PROVIDER or any agent, employee or associate of SERVICE PROVIDER.
- 39. In addition, either party may terminate the Contract at will by providing the other party with notice of termination at least thirty (30) days prior to the proposed termination date.
- 40. The parties agree that upon any termination, MHMR may, if necessary, conduct a fiscal audit of SERVICE PROVIDER to determine existence of any overpayment. If MHMR conducts an audit and verifies that SERVICE PROVIDER has been overpaid because of improper billing or accounting practices or failure to comply with terms of the Contract, MHMR shall notify the SERVICE PROVIDER in writing of the overpayment, the method of computing the reasonable dollar amount to be refunded, and any other actions MHMR may take over the Contract, and SERVICE PROVIDER shall immediately repay MHMR the amount of the overpayment.
- 41. The parties agree that upon termination of the Contract, SERVICE PROVIDER is responsible for the prompt settlement of any termination claims, including claims from its employees, subcontractors or vendors.
- 42. Upon termination of the Contract, SERVICE PROVIDER and MHMR will be discharged from any further obligation created under the terms of this Contract, excepting the indemnification and insurance against liability obligations, which obligations shall continue in full force and effect, without reduction or abatement, for the full term of the period of limitations applicable to the claim, and except for the equitable settlement of their respective accrued interest or obligations incurred prior to the termination. Termination does not, however, constitute a waiver of any remedies for breach of this Contract. In addition, the obligations of SERVICE PROVIDER to retain records and maintain the confidentiality of information shall survive this Contract.

### Waiver

43. In no event shall any payment to SERVICE PROVIDER hereunder or any other act or failure of MHMR to insist in any one or more instances upon the terms and conditions of this Contract constitute or be construed in any way to be a waiver by MHMR of any breach of covenant or default which may then or subsequently be committed by SERVICE PROVIDER. Neither shall such payment, act or omission in any manner impair or prejudice any right, power, privilege, or remedy available to MHMR to enforce its rights hereunder, which rights, powers, privileges, remedies are always specifically preserved. No representative or agent of MHMR may waive the effect of this provision.

### Amendment

44. The parties agree that this Contract may not be altered, changed or otherwise modified, except where done in writing, and duly signed by an authorized representative of SERVICE PROVIDER and the MHMR Chief Executive Officer.

### Notice

45. Except as expressly provided herein, any notice required or permitted to be given under this Contract must be in writing and delivered in person or by certified or registered mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid, to the individual at the address shown below:

### Legal Construction

- 46. The parties agree that this Contract shall be construed under the laws of the State of Texas, and is performable in Lufkin, Angelina County, Texas.
- 47. If any one or more of the provisions in this Contract shall be for any reason held invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such matter shall not affect any other provision herein, and this Contract shall be construed as if such objectionable provision(s) had not been a part of the Contract.
- 48. The parties agree that this Contract shall inure to the benefit of and be enforceable against the parties hereto and their respective successors.

### Entire Contract

49. This instrument and any attached Exhibit(s) incorporated herein contain the entire agreement and supersede all previous agreements, whether oral or written, between the parties hereto relating to the subject matter herein, and there are no other verbal or written understandings, promises, representations, or other terms relating to the subject matter of this agreement which are not included herein.

### ADOPTION OF NUISANCE ABATEMENT PROCEDURES

WHEREAS, Chapter 343, Subchapter C, Section 343.021 of the Texas Health & Safety Code provides that a county may abate a nuisance under said chapter by demolition or removal if the county adopts abatement procedures that are consistent with the general purpose and that conform to such chapter; and

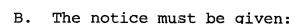
WHEREAS, it is desirous and beneficial for the county to be able to actively pursue the abatement of nuisances that arise in Tyler County; and

WHEREAS, Tyler County commissioners court has not adopted abatement of nuisance procedures as set out in the Code; and

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED THAT:

The commissioners court of Tyler County hereby adopts the following abatement procedures to abate a nuisance within the County:

- A. Before any demolition or removal of a nuisance may be ordered by the county, written notice must be given to the owner, lessee, occupant, agent, or person in charge of the premises and such notice must state:
  - (1) the specific condition that constitutes a nuisance;
- (2) that the person receiving notice shall abate the nuisance before the 31st day after the date on which the notice is served;
- (3) that failure to abate the nuisance may result in abatement by the county, assessment of costs, and a lien against the property on which the nuisance exists; and
- (4) that the owner, lessee, occupant, agent, or person in charge of the premises is entitled to submit, before the 31st day after the date on which the notice is served, a written request for a hearing.





- (1) by service in person or by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested; or
- (2) if personal service cannot be obtained or the address of the owner, lessee, occupant, agent, or person in charge of the premises is unknown, by posting a copy of the notice on the premises on which the nuisance exists and by publishing the notice in a newspaper with general circulation in the county two times within 10 consecutive days.
- C. If the owner, lessee, occupant, agent, or person in charge of the premises requests a hearing before the county abates the nuisance, the hearing may be conducted before the commissioners court or any board, commission, or official designated by the commissioners court. The commissioners court may designate a board, commission, or official to conduct each hearing.
