A motion was made by **Commissioner Riley** and seconded by **Commissioner Sawyer** to approve the minutes of September 16th and 20th, October 6th, 10th and 14th, 1994. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by **Commissioner Riley** and seconded by **Commissioner Barnes** to table approval of the **County Treasurer's monthly report** until Friday, November 18th. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Mahan motioned to approve the **monthly reports** of the **Adult Probation and Juvenile Probation Department**. **Commissioner Sawyer** seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED REPORTS.

Commissioner Riley motioned to accept the **monthly report** of the **Justice of the Peace, Pct. #1**. The motion was seconded by **Commissioner Mahan**. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by **Commissioner Mahan** to approve the **monthly reports** of the **County Extension Department**. **Commissioner Riley** seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED REPORTS.

A motion was made by **Commissioner Mahan** and seconded by **Commissioner Barnes** to table approval of the **monthly report** of the **County Auditor** until Friday, November 18th. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Riley made the motion to approve the **accounts payable** from the **County Auditor's Office** as submitted. **Commissioner Mahan** seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED ACCOUNTS PAYABLE PAID & GENERAL DISTRIBUTION LEDGER.

Jeff McCrae and **Steve Bird** presented a report of **delinquent tax** activity. The firm did a mailing in September; 37 new law suits had been filed in the first four months, most of which were on personal properties. Twenty-four of the 134 unknown accounts had been eliminated; five were tracked to current owners. On the 1994 tax roll only two unknown accounts remained. A tax sale was had in October: Six of the nine accounts were paid in full or made payment agreements; three were struck off to the entities. Commissioners **Mahan** and **Riley** questioned the problems reported with the computer conversion from **Warren ISD**. **Mr. McCrae** responded the **tax office** had received an update on Thursday and was in the process of verifying the data. Also, November 28th was set as a date for hearing on the larger accounts.

NOVEMBER 18, 1994

Judge Owens introduced Mr. Eddie Chalmers as the newly appointed Chief Appraisal for the **Tyler County Appraisal District**. He cultivated the basis for all entities to work together for the good of taxpayers. **Commissioner Mahan** motioned to accept the report of the delinquent tax firm, **Calame, Linebarger, Graham & Pena**. The motion was seconded by **Commissioner Sawyer**. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED REPORT.

Commissioner Riley requested the Court to defer items #9 and #13 until later in the meeting.

Commissioner Riley made a motion to submit the names of Guy Davis (Comm. Riley) and Lloyd Fortenberry (Comm. Mahan) as members to the **Appraisal Review Board** of the **Tyler County Appraisal District**. The motion was seconded by **Commissioner Barnes**. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Mahan motioned to approve the expansion of two telephone lines and update the system in the **Criminal District Attorney's office**. The installation cost will be paid from the District Attorney's discretionary funds along with any overage of telephone line charges from next year's budget. **Commissioner Sawyer** seconded this motion. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Riley motioned to adopt the resolution to continue as a member of the **Southeast Texas Drug Task Force**, based upon the report of **Sheriff Henngan** that the share would be \$21,000 for a two year period, instead of this cost for each year. The motion was seconded by **Commissioner Barnes**. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED RESOLUTION.

A motion was made and amended by **Commissioner Riley** and seconded by **Commissioner Sawyer** to approve the deputation and bond, upon receipt, of Traci Watford for the **District Clerks' department**. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED DEPUTATION AND BOND.

Leon Hastings reported the opening of a DETCOG sponsored office for the education of literacy.

Bids for the **911 rural addressing** were opened and announced received from: AIMS\Austin, Texas, Design Graphics\Livingston, Texas, Public Safety Assoc, Inc.\Dallas, V. Meyer & Associates\Sulphur, LA, Geo Info, Inc.\Tyler Texas, and United Geo Data\San Antonio, Texas. A motion was made by **Commissioner Riley** and seconded by **Commissioner Mahan** to table consideration of these bids for study. All voted yes and none no.

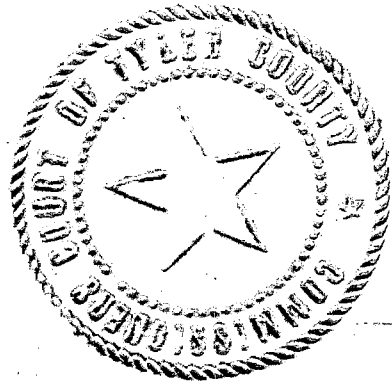

Selected major activities since last report-October

*-Agent coordinated the 46th Annual Tyler County Fair on September 30-October 2. This was the largest fair that the county has ever seen. Entries in the livestock division were up by 25% from last year (167 W, 2 H, 87 F).

-Served on a environmental wildlife school curriculum grant committee for Woodville Independent School District. Our first organizational meeting was held October 3 at the Woodville High School.

-Tyler County 4-H members celebrated National 4-H Week that ran October 3-7. Public service announcements were taped at local radio station, newspaper articles were written, etc.

-Agent attended State 4-H record book training for new system at Overton on October 5.

*-Agent assisted 4-H members at the South Texas State Fair in Beaumont October 6-11. 4-H members had 2 first place class winners in breeding beef, 19th place fryer rabbits, and 21st place market swine (12 W).

*-Provided educational program centering on the Africanized Honey Bee for the Mount Olivet Baptist Brotherhood on October 11 (6 W) in Fred.

-Agents conducted the Tyler County Executive Board meeting on October 13. Plans were finalized for the annual meeting.

-Agent met with District Forester from Temple-Inland to set up deer forest management demonstration at the Forest Lakes Hunting Club near Spurger on October 13.

*-Agent gave advice to Tyler County Go-Texan Committee at organizational meeting on October 13.

*-Agent served on decorations committee for District 5 Gold Star 4-H Banquet held in Nacogdoches October 18. One Tyler County 4-H member received the award (1 W).

-Agents participated in a District Civil Rights/Affirmative Action Audit by District Extension Directors on October 20.

-Agents coordinated with the Polk County Staff for an Alabama/Coushatta Indian Reservation Grant Conference on October 20.

*-Agent helped coordinate the first Annual Tyler County Go-Texan Bull Rides Blowout on October 22. Proceeds benefit the Tyler County Go-Texan Committee. 87 bullriders participated.

-Agent worked with the Long Leaf Soil and Water Conservation District to organize East Texas Hay Show at meeting October 25. The District and local feed store will sponsor forage samples for show.

-Annual Leave - October 26

-Agent made 10 farm visits, 15 4-H project visits, taped 6 radio programs, published 3 news articles, received 120 office calls, 62 walk in visitors (3 B, 2 AI, 28 F), and wrote 50 information letters.

Re: Activity Report on Delinquent Tax Collections

Dear Judge Owens:

In an effort to keep you and the Comissioner's Court informed as to our activities, we have prepared the following report which summarizes our collection work on behalf of Tyler County.

MAILINGS

During this reporting period our law firm has continued to mail demand letters to delinquent taxpayers to ensure that they are aware that they owe taxes to the school district. It has been our experience that providing taxpayers frequent reminders of their obligation tends to increase the likelihood that the taxpayer will take steps to resolve the delinquency. We performed a mass mailing to all delinquent taxpayers in September sending out a total of 5,175 statements.

LITIGATION

Where request for payment and all other negotiations have failed, we have backed up our notice letters with lawsuits. During this reporting period not only have we filed new lawsuits against property but at the same time, we have continued to prosecute any cases which were already pending prior to this reporting period. The attached reports under "Exhibit A" and entitled "Filed Petitions" list each lawsuit filed during the reporting period and also gives the status of each case as it now stands.


Frequently, after filing our lawsuits, the property owner voluntarily pays the taxes after being served with citation. It is our practice to then dismiss the case and the litigation comes to an end as to that particular person and property. During this brief reporting period, we have dismissed a total of 5 lawsuits which involve in excess of \$5,000 in taxes, penalty and interest. The attached report under "Exhibit B" entitled "Filed Non-Suits" identifies each case which has been dismissed.

TOTAL COLLECTIONS

By the use of all of our collection tools, including notice letters, specialized demand letters, and litigation, we have collected on your behalf \$98,914 in delinquent taxes, penalty and interest from July 1, 1994 through September 30, 1994. A comparison to the same time period last year using the information available at the time this report is being prepared is attached as "Exhibit C".

It has been our privilege to work with and for Tyler County and we look forward to the challenges of the coming year. We will continue working closely with you and the County Tax Collector to provide assistance and advice in all property tax matters, including changes in the law brought about by the property tax code.

RESOLUTION



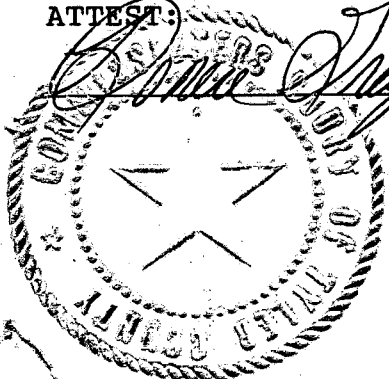

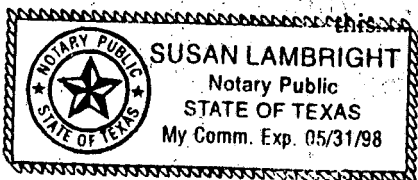
