A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Mahan to approve the minutes of December 16, 1994 at 8:30AM. All voted yes and none no.

Upon balancing with the County Auditor, a motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Sawyer to approve the County Treasurer's monthly report as submitted. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED REPORT.

Commissioner Riley motioned to approve the monthly reports of the Adult Probation and Juvenile Probation Department. Commissioner Mahan seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED REPORTS.

Commissioner Riley motioned to accept the monthly report of the Justice of the Peace, Pct. #1. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Sawyer. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED REPORT.

Bids for four patrol cars for the sheriff's department were opened and read aloud. A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan to defer consideration of this item until later in the meeting to give the Sheriff time to review the bids.

Bids for a pick-up truck for Precinct #3 were opened and read aloud. Bids were received from Allison Chevrolet, Knapp Ford Sales, Jasper

Ford Lincoln Mercury, and Knapp Chevrolet in Houston. A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan to table consideration until Friday, January 13th for further study. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Riley. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Sawyer to approve the Official Bonds for Jimmy Wayne Davis, JP#3 Roy Drake, JP#4, James Clark, DA and Calvin Meyer, RFPD#3. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED BONDS.

Commissioner Riley motioned to advertise for bids to purchase road oil and cracked fuel oil, to be opened February 13th. Commissioner Sawyer seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED NOTICE TO BIDDERS.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Mahan to approve the Schedule of Salaries as per the 3% increase as presented by the County Treasurer. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED SCHEDULE.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Barnes to authorize advertisement for bids for a bank depository to be opened on February 13th at 10:00AM. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED NOTICE TO BIDDERS.

A motion was made by Commissioner Mahan and seconded by Commissioner Riley to table discussion of part-time employment for the Tax Office until Friday, January 13th. This item had already been postponed for the January 13th meeting.

Discussion was had toward the payment of salaries for the 88th District Court Secretary and Court Reporter, since a vacancy had occurred in the seat of the District Judge. It was a consensus that these positions would probably be used by Judge Lawlis. Commissioner Riley made aware he would be abstaining from the vote due to kinship to one of the employees. No action was taken. (c)

Upon recommendation of the Sheriff, and after figuring the added cost of transportation and cloth seats, Commissioner Mahan motioned to accept the bid from Knapp Ford in Woodville for four police cars. Commissioner Barnes seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED BIDS. (c)
