DECLARATION OF LOCAL DISASTER

WHEREAS, the County of Tyler on the 27th day of September 1996, has suffered widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss or property (or there is imminent threat of same) resulting from Excessive rain causing flooding:

and

WHEREAS, the Judge of the County of Tyler has determined that extraordinary measures must be taken to alleviate the suffering of people and to protect or rehabilitate property;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED BY THE JUDGE OF THE COUNTY OF TYLER:

Section 1. That a state of disaster is declared for the County of Tyler.


Section 2. That the County's Emergency Management Plan has been implemented.


Section 3. Whereas Section 418.108 of the Texas Disaster Act of 1975, as amended, Vernon's Texas Codes Annotated, Government Code Chapter 418, provides that the state of disaster shall continue for a period of not more than seven days of the date hereof, unless the same is continued by consent of the Commissioners Court of the County of TYLER, Texas.

Section 4. That this proclamation shall take effect immediately from and after its issuance.

COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT ORDER

WHEREAS, on ~~OCTOBER 4th~~ <sup>September 30<sup>th</sup></sup>, 1996, the County Judge issued a PROCLAMATION declaring a state of disaster for the County of Tyler resulting from FLOODING AND EXCESSIVE RAIN;


WHEREAS, the conditions necessitating declaration of a state of disaster continue to exist; and

WHEREAS, Section 418.108 of the Texas Disaster Act of 1975, as amended, Vernon's Texas Codes Annotated, Government Code Chapter 418, provides that a local state of disaster may not be continued for a period in excess of seven days without the consent of the governing body of the political subdivision;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF THE COUNTY OF TYLER:

Section 1. That the state of disaster proclaimed for the County of Tyler by the County Judge on ~~October 4~~ <sup>September 30</sup>, 1996 shall continue until terminated by order of the Commissioners Court.

Section 2. That this order shall take effect immediately from and after its passage and publication, and it's accordingly so ordained.


