A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Sawyer to approve the minutes of June 14, 1999. All voted yes and none no.

Everett & Jimmy with **DETCOG** presented the 911 update. They will be sending a letter to residents. Commissioner Riley stated the road signs and maps were completed. The 911 system was in place. The work being done is for an "enhanced system" to show addressing. Leon Hastings showed much concern that the present system only showed a phone number, which he felt was insufficient. Other discussion was had between Mr. Hastings and Everett concerning the personnel and equipment. The addressing was taken place in Warren and part of Fred.

Commissioner Riley motioned to approve payment of all the bills. Commissioner Sawyer seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED GENERAL LEDGER DISTRIBUTION.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Sawyer to table approval of the County Treasurer's monthly report for reconciliation. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Sawyer to table approval of the County Auditor's monthly report for reconciliation. All voted ayes and none no.

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Joe Smith presented that the Court had no liability to approve the issuance of East Texas Housing Finance Corp Single Family Mortgage Revenue Bonds, Series 199A and 199B. He stated this was a wonderful opportunity for Tyler County. The Court is just saying, "yes, you can do business here". Commissioner Riley indicated that there seemed to be very little interest in this project from persons in Tyler County. A motion was made by Commissioner Sawyer and Commissioner Marshall seconded the motion to approve the issuance of the bonds. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Marshall and seconded by Commissioner Hughes to approve the purchase of a track loader for Precinct #3 in the amount of \$45,500.00. A trade in value of \$5000 was given and a down payment of \$10,000 will bring a balance of \$40,500.00 to be paid in two time warrants of \$15,250.00 each. The lowest and best bid being from Mustang Tractor & Equipment. All voted and none no. SEE ATTACHED BID

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Sawyer to approve the form of ordinance, whereby the tax rate had been adopted in 1998. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Marshall and seconded by Commissioner Riley to set the election for the proposed Rural Fire Prevention District #7, Colmesneil, to be held on the General Election date in November. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Marshall motioned to approve the resolution for grant funds for improvements at the Tyler County Airport; and designate the Commissioners' Court as sponsors consultant selection committee; and to designate the County Judge as the authorized representative. Commissioner Hughes seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Riley motioned the meeting adjourned.
