A motion was made by Commissioner Riley and seconded by Commissioner Sawyer to
approve the minutes of February 18, 2000. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Sawyer motioned to table approval of the **County Treasurer's monthly
report** until Friday. **Commissioner Sawyer** seconded the motion. All voted yes and
none no.

A motion was made by **Commissioner Sawyer** to approve the **County Probation
monthly reports**, both adult and juvenile departments. **Commissioner Marshall**
seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED REPORTS.

Commissioner Riley motioned to accept the monthly report of the **Justice of Peace, Pct.
#1**. **Commissioner Hughes** seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE
ATTACHED REPORT.

A motion was made by **Commissioner Riley** to accept the monthly report of the County
Clerk. **Commissioner Marshall** seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE

A motion was made by **Commissioner Riley** and seconded by **Commissioner Hughes** to
approve the monthly report of the County Extension Department. All voted yes and none

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Commissioner Riley made a motion to table approval of the County Auditor's monthly report until Friday, March 17th. Commissioner Sawyer seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Marshall to approve the allowances and accounts payable as submitted by the County Auditor. Commissioner Hughes seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED

The County Auditor opened and read aloud bids received from Bryan and Bryan, and, Cobar Enterprises. A motion was made by **Commissioner Hughes** and seconded by **Commissioner Sawyer** to award to the lowest bid, submitted by Bryan and Bryan, for cracked fuel road oil for a two year period. All voted yes and none no.

Item 10 – no one was present to give an update on the road disaster grant.

Commissioner Hughes motioned to adopt the **resolution** authorizing signatures on the Texas Community Development Program Grant – **Disaster Relief Project**. The motion was seconded by **Commissioner Marshall**. All voted yes and none no.

The Audit was not considered since action had been taken last month.

A request was made by Judge Brasher for clerical help entering warrants into the computer; and help with the upcoming OMNI base program with the State. She indicated this employee would be entering work for all the **JP's of all four precincts**. A motion was made by **Commissioner Riley** and seconded by **Commissioner Sawyer** to approve the **clerical for the Justice of Peace office** not to exceed 24 hours. The salary will be paid from the following funds: Driver Safety Fees, Time Payment Fees and unclaimed funds from the Arrest Fee #2. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by **Commissioner Hughes** and seconded by **Commissioner Marshall** to adopt the **proclamation** for Poison Prevention Week March 19 through March 25th. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED PROCLAMATION.

A motion was made by Commissioner Marshall to appoint Vance Champaign and Bill Crozier to the Board of Commissioners for Fire District #5 (Damb). The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hughes. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Marshall and seconded by Commissioner Hughes to approve the bond and oath, at no expense to the county, of Gary Vann for Fire District #5. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED BOND.

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Commissioner Riley motioned to adopt the resolution endorsing and supporting Fair Housing. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hughes. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED RESOLUTION.

Clyde Smith from the Chamber of Commerce made the Court aware that additional electrical plugs were needed in order to improve the quality of the "Lighting of the Square" for the Christmas season. He indicated the cost of the "Lighting" was about \$2000 each year. He plans to have activities in four quadrants of the square with church bazaars in Charlton Street for next year. It was a consensus of the court that he return with a projected cost after meeting with Entergy and getting their recommendations.

A motion was made by Commissioner Riley to adopt the Tyler County Emergency Management Basic Plan as presented by John Paul and Gary Hennigan; and, designate titles for Mr. Paul and Sheriff Hennigan as indicated in the plan; and authorize the County Judge to execute the service plan. Commissioner Hughes seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED PLAN. A discussion of grants ensued as to which John Paul stated that if "shared grants" would be solicited, he would bring them to the court for approval.

Commissioner Marshall motioned the approval of a pit donation agreement between Tyler County, Pct. #3 and Louisiana-Pacific Corp. Commissioner Hughes seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED AGREEMENT.

Commissioner Riley motioned to approve a load posting agreement with the Texas Department of Transportation, recommending posting for bridges in Tyler County. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Marshall. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED AGREEMENT.

A motion was made by Commissioner Sawyer and seconded by Commissioner Riley to appoint Gary Manino as Fire Commissioner for District #6 (Fred) replacing Robert Chambers. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED RECOMMENDATION.

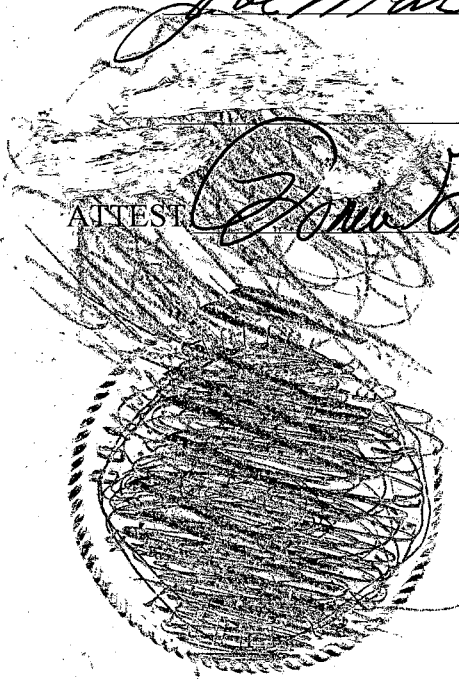

COMMISSIONERS COURT ORDER NO. 3132000

BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF TYLER COUNTY, TEXAS ESTABLISHING A PROGRAM INCLUDING MITIGATION, PREPAREDNESS, RESPONSE, AND RECOVERY PHASES OF COMPREHENSIVE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT; ACKNOWLEDGING THE OFFICE OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIRECTOR; AUTHORIZING THE APPOINTMENT OF AN EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR; AND PROVIDING FOR THE DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THOSE OFFICES; IDENTIFYING AN OPERATIONAL ORGANIZATION; GRANTING NECESSARY POWERS TO COPE WITH ALL PHASES OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT WHICH THREATEN LIFE AND PROPERTY IN THE COUNTY OF TYLER; AUTHORIZING COOPERATIVE AND MUTUAL AID AGREEMENTS FOR RELIEF WORK BETWEEN THIS AND OTHER CITIES OR COUNTIES AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES; PROHIBITING UNAUTHORIZED WARNING AND ALL-CLEAR SIGNALS AND MAKING VIOLATIONS A MISDEMEANOR PUNISHABLE BY FINE NOT TO EXCEED \$ 250.00

WHEREAS, The Commissioners Court of the County of Tyler finds that the identification of potential hazards and the prevention or mitigation of their effects must be an on-going concern of the County if the lives and property of the populace are to be protected; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court hereby declares that the preparation of a Comprehensive Emergency Management plan, and the means for its implementation for the protection of lives and property in the County of Tyler from natural or man-caused disasters or threat thereof is immediately essential; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court further finds that in times of disasters which may imperil the safety of the inhabitants of the City, or their property, it becomes necessary to effectuate and place into operation the preconceived plans and preparations with a minimum of delay; and

WHEREAS, The Commissioners Court finds, therefore, that the preparation and implementation of such plans are now imperative; BE IT ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF TYLER COUNTY, TEXAS:

Section 1. ORGANIZATION

There exists the office of Emergency Management Director of the County of Tyler, which shall be held by the County Judge in accordance with state law.

- (a) **A Manager of Emergency Services and an Emergency Management Coordinator may be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Director,**
- (b) **The Director shall be responsible for a program of comprehensive emergency management within the County and for carrying out the duties and responsibilities set forth in this ordinance. He/she may delegate authority for execution of these duties to the Coordinator, but ultimate responsibility for such execution shall remain with the Director.**

- (c) The operational Emergency Management organization of the County of Tyler shall consist of the officers and employees of the County so designated by the Director in the emergency management plan, as well as organized volunteer groups. The functions and duties of this organization shall be distributed among such officers and employees in accordance with the terms of the emergency management plan.

Section 2. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIRECTOR - POWERS AND DUTIES

The duties and responsibilities of the Emergency Management Director shall include the following:

- (a) Conduct an on-going survey of actual or potential hazards which threaten life and property within the County and an on-going program of identifying and requiring or recommending the implementation of measures which would tend to prevent the occurrence or reduce the impact of such hazards if a disaster did occur.
- (a) Supervision of the development and approval of an emergency management plan for the County of Tyler, and shall recommend for adoption by the Commissioners Court all mutual aid arrangements deemed necessary for the implementation of such plan.
- (c) Authority to declare a local state of disaster. The declaration may not be continued or renewed for a period in excess of 7 days except by or with the consent of the Commissioners Court. Any order or proclamation declaring, continuing, or terminating a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the County Clerk.
- (d) Issuance of necessary proclamations, regulations, or directives which are necessary for carrying out the purposes of this order. Such proclamations, regulations, or directives shall be disseminated promptly by means calculated to bring its contents to the attention of the general public and, unless circumstances attendant on the disaster prevent or impede, promptly filed with the County Clerk.
- (e) Direction and control of the operations of the Tyler County Emergency Management organization as well as the training of Emergency Management personnel.
- (f) Determination of all questions of authority and responsibility that may arise within the Emergency Management organization of the County.
- (g) Maintenance of liaison with other municipal, county, district, state, regional or federal Emergency Management organizations.
- (h) Marshaling of all necessary personnel, equipment, or supplies from any department of the County to aid in the carrying out of the provisions of the emergency management plan.
- (i) Supervision of the drafting and execution of mutual aid agreements, in cooperation with the representatives of the State and of other local political subdivisions of the State, and the drafting and execution, if deemed desirable, of an agreement with the cities located in Tyler County, for the County-wide coordination of Emergency Management efforts.
- (j) Supervision of, and final authorization for the procurement of all necessary supplies and equipment, including acceptance of private contributions which may be offered for the purpose of improving Emergency Management within the County.

- (k) Authorizing of agreements, after approval by the County Attorney, for use of private property for public shelter and other purposes.
- (l) Survey of the availability of existing personnel, equipment, supplies, and services which could be used during a disaster, as provided for herein.
- (m) Other requirements as specified in the Texas Disaster Act of 1975, Vernon's Texas Codes Annotated, Government Code Chapter 418

Section 3. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLAN

A comprehensive Emergency Management Plan shall be developed and maintained in a current state. The plan shall set forth the form of the organization; establish and designate divisions and functions; assign responsibilities, tasks, duties, and powers; and designate officers and employees to carry out the provisions of this ordinance. As provided by State law, the plan shall follow the standards and criteria established by the State division of Emergency Management of the State of Texas. Insofar as possible, the form of organization, titles, and terminology shall conform to the recommendations of the State Division of Emergency Management. When approved, it shall be the duty of all departments and agencies to perform the functions assigned by the plan and to maintain their portion of the plan in a current state of readiness at all times. The emergency management plan shall be considered supplementary to this ordinance and have the effect of law during the time of a disaster.

Section 4. INTERJURISDICTIONAL PROGRAM

The County Judge is hereby authorized to join with the Mayors of the cities in Tyler County in the formation of an interjurisdictional emergency management program for the County of Tyler, and shall have the authority to cooperate in the preparation of an interjurisdictional emergency management plan, as well as all powers necessary to participate in a County-wide program of emergency management insofar as said program may affect the County of Tyler.

Section 5. OVERRIDE

At all times when the orders, rules, and regulations made and promulgated pursuant to this ordinance shall be in effect, they shall supersede and override all existing ordinances, orders, rules, and regulations insofar as the latter may be inconsistent therewith

Section 6. LIABILITY

This order is an exercise by the County of its governmental functions for the protection of the public (peace, health) and safety and neither the County of Tyler, the agents and representatives of said County, nor any individual, receiver, firm, partnership, corporation, association, or trustee, nor any of the agents thereof, in good faith carrying out, complying with or attempting to comply with, any order, rule, or regulation promulgated pursuant to the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable for any damage sustained to persons as the result of said activity. Any person owning or controlling real estate or other premises who voluntarily and without compensation grants to the County of Tyler a license of privilege, or otherwise permits the County to inspect, designate, and use the whole or any part or parts of such real estate or premises for the purpose of sheltering persons during an actual, impending, or practice enemy attack or natural or man-made disaster shall, together with his successors in interest, if any, not be civilly liable for the death of, or injury to, any person on or about such real estate or

premises under such license, privilege or other permission or for loss of, or damage to, the property of such person.

Section 7. COMMITMENT OF FUNDS

No person shall have the right to expend any public funds of the County in carrying out any Emergency Management activity authorized by this ordinance without prior approval by the County Council, nor shall any person have any right to bind the County by contract, agreement, or otherwise without prior and specific approval of the County Council unless during a declared disaster. During a declared disaster, the County judge may expend and/or commit public funds of the County when deemed prudent and necessary for the protection of health, life, or property.

Section 8. OFFENSES; PENALTIES

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person willfully to obstruct, hinder, or delay any member of the Emergency Management organization in the enforcement of any rule or regulation issued pursuant to this ordinance.
- (b) It shall likewise be unlawful for any person to wear, carry, or display any emblem, insignia, or any other means of identification as a member of the Emergency Management organization of the County of Tyler, unless authority to do so has been granted to such person by the proper officials.
- (c) Any unauthorized person who shall operate a siren or other device so as to simulate a warning signal, or the termination of a warning, shall be deemed guilty of a violation of this ordinance and shall be subject to the penalties imposed by this ordinance.
- (d) Convictions for violations of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punishable by fine not to exceed \$ 250.00 dollars

Section 9. SEVERABILITY

If any portion of this ordinance shall, for any reason, be declared invalid such, invalidity shall not affect the remaining provisions thereof.

Section 10. LIMITATIONS


This ordinance shall not be construed so as to conflict with any State or Federal statute or with any military or naval order, rule or regulation.

Section 11. REPEALER


All orders, parts of orders, or resolutions in conflict herewith are expressly repealed.



JOINT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Cities of Woodville, Chester, and Colmesneil by City Ordinance No. _____, and Tyler County by Commissioners Court Order dated _____ have established similar programs of comprehensive emergency management which includes the mitigation, preparedness response and recovery phases of emergency management; and

WHEREAS, the Cities and County find that vulnerability to many potential hazards is shared by residents of the Cities of Woodville, Chester, Colmesneil and the unincorporated portions of Tyler County; and

WHEREAS, the Cities and County further finds that the common goal of emergency management can best be achieved through an organization which shares the combined resources of the Cities and the County; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that there is hereby established the Tyler County Emergency Management organization which shall consist of the officers and employees of the Cities and of the County as designated in a interjurisdictional emergency management plan, together with such organized volunteer groups as that plan may specify; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tyler County Judge shall appoint an Emergency Management Coordinator to coordinate all aspects of the Tyler County program of comprehensive emergency management, including the preparation and maintenance of a interjurisdictional emergency management plan for the Cities of Woodville, Chester, and Colmesneil and Tyler County in accordance ;with this resolution.

To all Recipients:

Transmitted herewith is the revised Emergency Management Plan for Tyler County. This plan supersedes any previous plans. It provides a framework in which Tyler County can plan and perform their respective emergency functions during a disaster or national emergency.

This comprehensive Emergency Management Plan attempts to be all inclusive in combining the four phases of Emergency Management, which are:

- (1) **mitigation:** those activities which eliminate or reduce the probability of disaster;
- (2) **preparedness:** those activities which governments, organizations, and individuals develop to save lives and minimize damage;
- (3) **response:** to prevent loss of lives and property and provide emergency assistance;
- (4) **recovery:** short-and long-term activities which return all systems to normal or improved standards.

This plan includes and has been approved by Tyler County. It will be revised and updated as required. All recipients are requested to advise the Tyler County Office of Emergency Management on any changes which might result in its improvement or increase its usefulness. Plan changes will be transmitted to all addressees on the distribution list.

FOREWORD

As Emergency Management Director, the County Judge is charged with the responsibility to develop and implement a joint emergency management plan in the Tyler County . The heaviest emphasis in the past was on preparedness and response to all risks: attack, man-made emergencies and natural disasters. Added emphasis is now placed on mitigation and recovery to round out the four phases of emergency management.

The situations addressed by this plan are those in which the actions of many different agencies must be coordinated. This major coordination effort differs from those emergencies handled on a daily basis by local fire, law enforcement and medical services personnel.

This Emergency Management Plan attempts to be all inclusive in combining the four phases of management, which are:

- 1) **Mitigation:** those activities which eliminate or reduce the probability of disaster;
- (2) **Preparedness:** those activities which governments, organizations, and individuals develop to save lives and minimize damage;
- (3) **Response:** those activities that follow a disaster and are designed to prevent loss of lives and property and provide emergency assistance;
- (4) **Recovery:** short- and long-term activities which return all systems to normal or improved standards.

BASIC PLAN

I. AUTHORITY

This plan applies to and has been approved by Tyler County .

II. PURPOSE

This plan seeks to mitigate the effects of a hazard, to prepare for measures to be taken which will preserve life and minimize damage, to respond during emergencies and provide necessary assistance, and to establish a recovery system in order to return the community to it's normal state of affairs.

This plan attempts to define in a straightforward manner who does what, when, where, and how in order to mitigate, prepare for, respond to, and recover from the effects of war, natural disaster, technological accidents, and other major incidents.

III. SITUATIONS AND ASSUMPTIONS

A. Situation

Tyler County is exposed to many hazards, all of which have the potential for disrupting the community, causing damage, and creating casualties. Possible natural hazards include hurricanes, floods, tornadoes, fires, and winter storms. There is also the threat of a war-related incident such as a nuclear, biological, chemical or conventional attack. Other disaster situations could develop from a hazardous materials accident, conflagration, major transportation accident, terrorism or civil disorder. Additional detail is provided in the Tyler County Hazard Analysis/Identification.

B. Assumptions

1. Tyler County will continue to be exposed to the hazards noted above as well as others which may develop in the future.

2. Outside assistance will be available in most emergency situations affecting Tyler County. Although this plan defines procedures for coordinating such assistance, it is essential for Tyler County to be prepared to carry out disaster response and short-term actions on an independent basis.
3. It is possible for a major disaster to occur at any time, and at any place in Tyler County. In some cases, dissemination of warning and increased readiness measures may be possible. However, many disasters and events can, and will, occur with little or no warning.
4. Local government officials recognize their responsibilities for the safety and well-being of the public and will assume their responsibilities in the implementation of this emergency management plan.
5. Proper implementation of this plan will reduce or prevent disaster related losses.

IV. CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS

A. General

It is the responsibility of government to protect life and property from the effects of hazardous events. Local government has the primary responsibility for emergency management activities. This plan is based upon the concept that the emergency functions for various agencies/organizations involved in emergency management will generally parallel normal day-to-day functions. To the extent possible, the same personnel and material resources will be employed in both cases. Day-to-day functions that do not contribute directly to the emergency may be suspended for the duration of any emergency. The efforts that would normally be required for those functions will be redirected to the accomplishment of emergency tasks by the agency concerned.

A local state of disaster may be declared by the presiding officer of the County. The effect of the declaration is to activate the recovery and rehabilitation aspects of the plan and to authorize the furnishing of aid and assistance. When the

emergency exceeds local government capability to respond, assistance will be requested from neighboring jurisdictions and/or the state government.

B. Phases of Management

This plan follows an all-hazard approach and acknowledges that most responsibilities and functions performed during an emergency are not hazard specific. Likewise, this plan accounts for activities before and after, as well as during emergency operations; consequently, all phases of emergency management are addressed as shown below.

1. Mitigation

Mitigation activities are those which eliminate or reduce the probability of a disaster occurring. Also included are those long-term activities which lessen the undesirable effects of unavoidable hazards.

2. Preparedness

Preparedness activities serve to develop the response capabilities needed in the event an emergency should arise. Planning and training are among the activities conducted under this phase.

3. Response

Response is the actual provision of emergency services during a crisis. These activities help to reduce casualties and damage and speed recovery. Response activities include warning, evacuation, rescue and other similar operations.

4. Recovery

Recovery is both a short-term and long-term process. Short-term operations seek to restore vital services to the community and provide for the basic needs of the public. Long-term recovery focuses on restoring the community to its normal, or improved, state of affairs. The recovery period is also an opportune time to institute mitigation measures,

particularly those related to the recent emergency. Examples of recovery actions would be temporary housing and food, restoration of non-vital government services, and reconstruction of damaged areas.

V. ORGANIZATION AND ASSIGNMENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES

A. General

The County Judge is responsible for emergency management planning and operations for that area of the county outside the corporate limits of the - incorporated - municipalities of the county. The Mayor of each incorporated municipality is responsible for emergency management planning and operations for that jurisdiction.

Most of the departments within the County have emergency functions in addition to their normal duties. Each department is responsible for developing and maintaining their own emergency management procedures. Specific responsibilities are outlined below under the section entitled Task Assignments as well as in individual annexes. Attachment 3 details how the County is organized for emergencies. Attachments 4 and 5 illustrate functional responsibilities and annex assignment, respectively.

B. Organization

1. Executive Group

The Executive Group is referred to in this plan as a single body but in fact has several components with representation from each local political jurisdiction within the emergency management program. Each group is responsible for the activities conducted within their respective jurisdiction. The members of the Group include both elected and appointed executives with certain legal responsibilities such as: the County Judge, Commissioner Court members, Manager of Emergency Services, and the Emergency Management Coordinator.

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2. Emergency Services

These groups include those services required for an effective emergency management program, including but not limited to; Fire , Police, Transportation, Sheltering, Legal, and other support services as needed.

C. Executive Group Responsibilities:

1. The County Judge is primarily responsible for:

- a. Directing the overall preparedness program for Tyler County.
- b. Making emergency policy decisions
- c. Declaring a state of emergency when necessary
- d. Implementing the emergency powers of local government (See Section VIC, Emergency Authority)
- e. Keeping the public and the Disaster District informed of the situation (with the assistance of the Public Information Officer)
- f. Requesting outside assistance when necessary (Either from the Disaster District or from other jurisdictions in accordance with existing Mutual Aid Agreements)

2. The Manager of Emergency Services is responsible for:

- a. Assuring that all county departments develop, maintain, and exercise their respective service annexes to this plan.
- B. Supporting the overall preparedness program in terms of its budgetary and organizational requirements
- c. Serving as controller of the EOC during its activation.
- d. Implementing the policies and decisions of the governing body

- e. EOC activation
 - f. Directing the emergency operational response of county services
 - g. Prepare and maintain Annex J (Damage Assessment), Annex N (EOC/Direction and Control), to this plan and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's)
3. The Emergency Management Coordinator is responsible for:
- a. Serving as staff advisor to the County Judge on emergency matters
 - b. Coordinating the planning and general preparedness activities of the government and maintenance of this Plan
 - c. Analyzing the emergency skills needed by the county forces and arranging the training necessary to provide those skills
 - d. Ensuring the operational capability of the EOC
 - e. Keeping the governing body apprized of the County preparedness status and anticipated needs.
 - f. Serving as day-to-day liaison between the County and State emergency management organizations
 - g. Maintaining liaison with organized emergency volunteer groups and private agencies
 - h. Initiating and monitoring the increased readiness actions among the County services when disaster threatens
(Refer to Section VII, Increased Readiness Conditions)
 - i. Prepare and maintain Annex L (Utilities), Annex O (Human Services), Annex S (Transportation) to this plan and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's)

- D. Emergency Services' Responsibilities: - Assigned to -:
1. WARNING Sheriff/Police Chief
 - a. Disseminate emergency public information as requested
 - b. Receive and disseminate warning information to the public and key County officials.
 - c. Prepare and maintain Annex A, (Warning) to this plan and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's)

 2. COMMUNICATIONS Sheriff
 - a. Establish and maintain Emergency Communications System
 - b. Coordinate use of all public and private communication systems necessary during emergencies (including EMS)
 - c. Manage and coordinate all emergency communication operated within the EOC once activated
 - d. Prepare and maintain Annex B (Communications) to this plan and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's).

 3. EOC/DIRECTION AND CONTROL Manager of Emergency Services
 - a. Direct and control local operating forces
 - b. Maintain contact with support EOC's, neighboring jurisdictions and Disaster District EOC
 - c. Maintain EOC in an operating mode at all times or be able to convert EOC space into an operating condition
 - d. Assign representatives by title to report to the EOC and develop procedures for crisis training

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- e. Develop and identify duties of staff, use of displays and message forms, and procedures for EOC activation
 - f. Prepare and maintain Annex N (EOC/Direction and Control) and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's)
4. SHELTER/MASS CARE Emergency Management Coordinator
- a. Maintain the Community Shelter Plan (CSP)
 - b. Supervise the Shelter Management program, (stocking, marking and equipping, etc.) for natural disaster and/or fallout shelters
 - c. Coordinate support with other County departments, relief agencies and volunteer groups
 - d. Prepare and maintain Annex C, (Shelter/Mass Care) and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's)
5. RADIOLOGICAL PROTECTION Radiological Officer
- a. Establish and maintain a radiological monitoring and reporting network
 - b. Secure initial and refresher training for instructors and monitors
 - c. Provide input to the statewide monitoring and reporting system
 - d. Under fallout conditions, provide County officials and department heads with information on fallout rates, fallout projections, and allowable doses
 - e. Coordinate radiological monitoring throughout the County
 - f. Provide monitoring services and advice at the scene of accidents involving radioactive materials

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- g. Prepare and maintain Annex D, (Radiological Protection) to this plan and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's)

6. EVACUATION

Sheriff/Police Chief

- a. Define responsibilities of county/city departments and private sector groups
- b. Identify high hazard areas and number of potential evacuees
- c. Coordinate evacuation planning to include:
 - (1). Movement control
 - (2). Health/medical requirements
 - (3). Transportation needs
 - (4). Emergency Public Information materials
 - (5). Shelter/Reception
- d. Prepare and maintain Annex E, (Evacuation) to this plan and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's)

7. FIRE

Emergency Management Coordinator/Fire Chiefs

- a. Fire prevention
- b. Fire suppression
- c. Inspection of damaged area for fire hazards
- d. Hazardous spills containment and clean-up
- e. Inspection of shelters for fire hazards
- f. Prepare and maintain Annex F, (Fire/Rescue) and Annex Q (Hazardous Materials Response) to this plan and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's)

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8. LAW ENFORCEMENT - Sheriff/Police Chief
- a. Law enforcement
 - b. Traffic control
 - c. Crowd control
 - d. Isolation of damaged area
 - e. Damage reconnaissance and reporting
 - f. Explosive ordinance reconnaissance
 - g. Weather reconnaissance
 - h. Disaster area evacuation
 - i. Prepare and maintain Annex G (Law Enforcement) to this plan and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's)
9. HEALTH AND MEDICAL Health Officer
- a. Coordinate planning efforts of hospital and other health facilities with city planning requirements
 - b. Coordinate patient loads of health facilities during emergencies
 - c. Coordinate triage and first aid activities immediately after disaster strikes, including EMS
 - d. Develop emergency health and sanitation standards and procedures
 - e. Prepare and maintain Annex H (Health and Medical) to this plan and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's)

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10. EMERGENCY PUBLIC INFORMATION

Sheriff/P.I.O.

- a. Conduct on-going hazard awareness and public education programs
- b. Compile and prepare emergency information for the public in case of emergency
- c. Arrange for media representatives to receive regular briefings on the county status during extended emergency situations
- d. Secure printed and photographic documentation of the disaster situation
- e. Handle unscheduled inquiries from the media and the public
- f. Prepare and maintain Annex I (Emergency Public Information) to this plan and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's)

11. DAMAGE ASSESSMENT

Emergency Management Coordinator

- a. Establish a damage assessment team from among city departments with assessment capabilities and responsibilities
- b. Train and provide damage plotting team to EOC
- c. Develop systems for reporting and compiling information on deaths, injuries, dollar damage to tax-supported facilities and to private property.
- d. Assist in determining geographic extent of damaged area
- e. Compile estimates of damage for use by city officials in requesting disaster assistance.

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- f. Evaluate effect of damage on city economic index, tax base, bond ratings, insurance ratings, etc., for use in long-range recovery planning
- g. Prepare and maintain Annex J (Damage Assessment) to this plan and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's)

12. PUBLIC WORKS, ENGINEERING

County Commissioners/
City Public Works Director

- a. Barricading of hazardous areas
- b. Priority restoration of streets and bridges
- c. Protection and/or restoration of waste treatment and disposal systems
- d. Augmentation of sanitation services
- e. Assessment of damage to streets, bridges, traffic control devices, waste water treatment system, and other public works facilities
- f. Debris removal
- g. Assessment of damage to county/city owned facilities
- h. Condemnation of unsafe structures
- i. Direct temporary repair of essential facilities
- j. Prepare and maintain Annex K (Public Works, Engineering) to this plan and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's)

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15. Human Services Emergency Management Coordinator
- a. Identify emergency feeding sites
 - b. Identify sources of clothing for disaster victims
 - c. Secure source of emergency food supplies
 - d. Coordinate operations of shelter facilities, whether they are operated by the City, local volunteers or organized disaster relief agencies such as American Red Cross
 - e. Coordinate special care requirements for sheltered groups such as unaccompanied children, the aged, and others
 - f. Prepare and maintain Annex O (Human Services) to this plan and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's)
16. TRANSPORTATION Manager of Emergency Services
- a. Identify local transportation resources and arrange for their use in emergencies
 - b. Coordinate deployment of transportation equipment to the services requiring augmentation
 - c. Establish and maintain a reserve pool of drivers, maintenance personnel, parts and tools
 - d. Maintain records on use of privately-owned transportation equipment and personnel for purpose of possible reimbursement
 - e. Prepare and maintain Annex S (Transportation) to this plan and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's)

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17. LEGAL

County/City Attorney

- a. Advise County/City officials on emergency powers of local government and necessary procedures for invocation of measures to:
 - (1). implement wage, price and rent controls
 - (2). establish rationing of critical resources
 - (3). establish curfews
 - (4). restrict or deny access
 - (5). specify routes of egress
 - (6). limit or restrict use of water or other utilities
 - (7). use any publicly or privately owned resource with or without payment to the owner
 - (8). remove debris from publicly or privately owned property
- b. Review and advise County/City officials on possible liabilities arising from disaster operations, including the exercising of any or all of the above powers
- c. Prepare and/or recommend legislation to implement the emergency powers which may be required during an emergency
- d. Advise County/City officials and department heads on record keeping requirements and other documentation necessary for the exercising of emergency powers
- e. Prepare and maintain Annex U (Legal) to this plan and supporting Standing Operating Procedures (SOP's)

E. Other Agencies' Responsibilities

Other County department and agency heads not assigned a specific function in this plan will be prepared to make their resources available for emergency duty at the direction of the County Judge.

VI. DIRECTION AND CONTROL

A. General

The County Judge as Emergency Management Director for Tyler County, is responsible for assuring that coordinated and effective emergency response systems are developed and maintained. Existing agencies of government will perform emergency activities closely related to those they perform routinely. Specific positions and agencies are responsible for fulfilling their obligations as presented in the Basic Plan and individual annexes. As EOC controller the Manager of Emergency Services will provide overall direction of the response activities within each department. Department heads will retain control over their employees and equipment unless directed otherwise by the Emergency Management Director. Each agency will be responsible for having its own standing operating procedures to be followed during response operations. Outside assistance, whether from other political jurisdictions or from organized volunteer groups, will be requested and used only as an adjunct to existing County services, and only when the situation threatens to expand beyond the County response capabilities. Requests for state or federal assistance are covered in SECTION IX.

B. Emergency Operations Center (EOC)

Response activities will be coordinated from the Emergency Operating Center, which is located at Justice Center, Highway 69, Woodville, The EOC will be activated upon notification of a possible or actual emergency. EOC responsibilities and activation procedures are addressed in Annex N, (EOC/Direction and Control).

During large scale emergencies the EOC will, in fact, become the seat of government for the duration of the crisis.

C. Emergency Authority

1. A compilation of primary state and local legal documents pertaining to emergency management is shown in Attachment 2.
2. In accordance with Section 8 (g) of the Texas Disaster Act of 1975, as amended, the County Judge may take extraordinary measures in the interest of effective emergency management. Procedures associated with emergency powers are contained in Annex U (Legal). These powers include but are not limited to:
 - a. Declaration of a local state of disaster
 - b. Wage, price and rent controls and other economic stabilization measures
 - c. Curfews, blockades and limitations on utility usage
 - d. Rules governing ingress and egress to the affected area
 - e. Other security measures
2. All physical resources within the County, whether publicly or privately owned, may be utilized when deemed necessary by the County Judge. The County assumes no financial or civil liability for the use of such resources; however, accurate records of such use will be maintained in case reimbursement becomes possible.
3. As provided in the Texas Disaster Act of 1975, as amended and the Executive Order of the Governor, the County Judge may exercise the same powers, on an appropriate local scale, granted to the Governor.

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VII. INCREASED READINESS CONDITIONS

A. Most emergencies follow some recognizable build-up period during which actions can be taken to achieve a state of maximum readiness. General departmental actions are outlined in the appropriate annex while specific actions will be detailed in the SOP's.

B. The following INCREASED READINESS CONDITIONS will be used as a means of increasing the Tyler County 's alert posture.

CONDITION 4: The term "Condition 4" will be used by the County to denote a situation that causes a higher degree of readiness than is normally present.

- a. "CONDITION 4" actions could be triggered by the onset of a particular hazard vulnerability season such as the tornado, flash flood, drought, freeze, planting, farm chemicals application, or harvesting season.
- b. An increase in international tensions could also trigger a "CONDITION 4."
- c. The potential for local civil unrest could also trigger a "CONDITION 4."
- d. Declaration of "CONDITION 4" by the Emergency Management Director/Coordinator will generally require the initiation of the increased readiness activities identified in each Annex.

CONDITION 3: The term "CONDITION 3" will be used by the County to refer to a situation which presents more potential threat than "CONDITION 4," but poses no immediate threat to life and/or property. This condition includes situations that could develop into a hazardous condition.

Factors such as staff experience, warning times, evacuation times/rates, sheltering, etc. should be considered before identifying specific CONDITION 3 events.

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- a. "CONDITION 3" actions could be generated by severe weather watch information issued by the National Weather Service such as:
 - (1). Hurricane Watch: Issued whenever a hurricane becomes a possible threat to a coastal area.
 - (2). Tornado Watch: Issued to alert persons to the possibility of tornado development in a specified area, for a specified period of time. Persons in watch areas should maintain their daily routine but be prepared to respond to a tornado warning.
 - (3). Flash Flood Watch: Issued to alert persons to the possibility of flash flooding in a designated area due to heavy rains occurring or expected to occur. Persons should remain alert and be prepared to take immediate action.
 - (4). Winter Storm Watch: Issued when there is a threat of severe winter weather in a particular area.
 - b. "CONDITION 3" actions could be generated when the international situation has deteriorated to the point that enemy attack is a possibility. This condition probably would allow sufficient time for an orderly evacuation and/or preparation of shelters.
 - c. "CONDITION 3" actions could also be generated when small-scale, localized civil unrest is present
 - d. Declaration of "CONDITION 3" by the Emergency Management Director/Coordinator will generally require the initiation of the increased readiness activities identified in each Annex.
3. CONDITION 2: The term "CONDITION 2" will be used by the County to signify that hazardous situation with a significant potential and probability of causing loss of life and/or property. This condition will normally require some degree of warning to the public.

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- a. "CONDITION 2" actions could be triggered by severe weather warning information issued by the National Weather Service such as:
 - (1) Hurricane Warning: Issued when hurricane conditions are expected in a specified coastal area in 24 hours or less. Hurricane conditions include:
 - (a) Sustained winds of 74 mph or higher and/or
 - (b) Dangerously high water or a combination of dangerously high water and exceptionally high waves, even though expected winds may be less than hurricane force.
 - (2). Tornado Warning: Issued when a tornado has actually been sighted in the area or indicated by radar, and may strike in the vicinity of the County.
 - (3). Flash Flood Warning: Issued to alert persons that flash flooding is imminent or occurring on certain streams or designated areas, and immediate action should be taken.
 - (4). Winter Storm Warning: Issued when heavy snow (4 inches or more in a 12-hour period or 6 inches or more in a 24-hour period), sleet or freezing rain are forecast to occur separately or in combination.
- b. "CONDITION 2" actions could be generated when the international situation has deteriorated to the point that enemy attack is probable. This condition may/may not allow sufficient time for an orderly evacuation.
- c. "CONDITION 2" actions could also be triggered by civil disorder with relatively large-scale localized violence.
- d. Declaration of "CONDITION 2" by the Emergency Management Director/Coordinator will generally require the initiation of the increased readiness activities identified in each Annex.

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4. **CONDITION 1:** The term "CONDITION 1" will be used by the County to signify that hazardous conditions are imminent. This condition denotes a greater sense of danger and urgency than associated with a "CONDITION 2" event.
 - a. "CONDITION 1" actions could be generated by severe weather warning information issued by the National Weather Service combined with factors making the event more imminent, such as:
 - (1) Hurricane landfall predicted in 12 hours or less.
 - (2) Tornado sighted especially close to a populated area or moving in the path of a populated area.
 - (3) Flooding is imminent or occurring at specific locations.
 - b. "CONDITION 1" actions could be generated by technological incidents when evacuation has actually become necessary or by federal and state implementation of petroleum demand management measures due to petroleum shortages.
 - c. "CONDITION 1" actions could be generated when an enemy attack is imminent based upon the evaluation of intelligence data. This warning (ATTACK WARNING) is declared and disseminated by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) National Warning Center over the FEMA National Warning System (NAWAS).
 - d. "CONDITION 1" actions could also be implemented when civil disorder precipitates large scale and wide-spread violence.
 - e. Declaration of "CONDITION 1" by the Emergency Management Director/Coordinator will generally require the initiation of the increased readiness activities identified in each Annex.

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VIII. CONTINUITY OF GOVERNMENT

A. Line of Succession

1. Line of Succession within the county is from the Judge to the Commissioners in order of their seniority.
2. Line of Succession to the County Judge(s) will be the County Judge Pro-tem followed by the County Council members in order of their seniority to the Council.
3. Line of Succession to the Manager of Emergency Services will be the Emergency Management Coordinator followed in order by the Training Officer and the Resource Officer.
4. Line of Succession to each department head are according to the Standing Operating Procedures established by each department.

B. Preservation of Records

In order to provide normal government operations following a disaster, vital records must be protected. These would include legal documents, as well as personal documents such as property deeds and tax records. The principal causes of damage to records are fire and water; therefore, essential records should be protected accordingly.

IX. ADMINISTRATION AND SUPPORT

A. Support

Requests for state or federal assistance, including the Texas National Guard or other military services, will be made to the District Disaster Committee in Beaumont, Texas. All requests will be made by the County Judge or by another official duly authorized by the County Judge.

B. Agreements and Understandings

Should local resources prove to be inadequate during an emergency, requests will be made for assistance from other local jurisdictions and other agencies in accordance with existing or emergency negotiated mutual-aid agreements and understandings. Such assistance may take the form of equipment, supplies, personnel or other available capabilities. All agreements will be entered into by duly authorized officials and will be formalized in writing whenever possible.

C. Reports and Records

Required reports will be submitted to the appropriate authorities in accordance with individual annexes.

D. Relief Assistance

All individual relief assistance will be provided in accordance with the policies set forth in state and federal provisions.

E. Consumer Protection

Consumer complaints pertaining to alleged unfair or illegal business practices will be referred to the State Attorney General's Consumer Protection Division.

X. PLAN DEVELOPMENT, MAINTENANCE AND IMPLEMENTATION


A. If a plan is to be effective, its contents must be known and understood by those who are responsible for its implementation. The Director/Coordinator will brief the appropriate public/private officials concerning their role in emergency management and ensure proper distribution of the plan and changes thereto.

B All agencies will be responsible for the development and maintenance of their respective annexes and SOP's identified in SECTION V, Organization and Assignment of Responsibilities.

- C. The Director/Coordinator will be responsible for ensuring that an annual review of the plan is conducted by all officials involved and that the plan is recertified biannually by the chief elected official.
- D. The plan will be updated, as necessary, based upon deficiencies identified by drills and exercises, changes in local government structure, technological changes, etc. The Director/Coordinator will incorporate approved changes to the plan and will forward changes to all organizations and individuals identified as having responsibility for implementation. Revised pages will be dated and marked to show where changes have been made. The plan will be activated at least once a year in the form of a simulated emergency in order to provide practical experience to those having (EOC) responsibilities.
- E. This plan supersedes and rescinds all previous editions of the Tyler County Emergency Management Plan and is effective upon signing by the County Judge. If any portion of this plan is held invalid by judicial or administrative ruling, such ruling shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the plan.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

ALLOCATION: The process of designating where evacuees or sheltering would go for protective shelter, temporary lodging, or feeding.

ASSESSMENT: (Radiological): The interpretation of radiological measurements in such a way that the measurements can form a basis for decision-making. Assessment can include making dose or effect predictions and advisory actions that might be taken to minimize harmful effects.

BUSINESS BAND RADIO: Any commercial radio communications not otherwise specifically stated.

CA-CAPABILITY ASSESSMENT: A formal measurement of current capabilities against standards and criteria that have been established as necessary to perform basic emergency management functions.

CAT-CATEGORY: When related to fallout shelter spaces, indicates a range of protection factors (PF). This is used to more easily define the capability of a shelter since there will be a wide range of protection factors throughout the facility. Categories normally used are:

CAT 0 - PF 10-19

CAT 1 - PF 20-39

CAT 2 - PF 40-69 (usually combined with CAT 3 extending the range to PF 99)

CAT 4 - PF 100-up

CEMTREC - CHEMICAL TRANSPORTATION EMERGENCY CENTER: Located in Washington, D.C., this facility, sponsored by the chemical industry, provides 24-hour assistance in dealing with chemical transportation emergencies.

CIVIL DEFENSE EMERGENCY: An emergency declared by the President of the United States or Congress pursuant to applicable federal law finding that an attack upon the United States has occurred or is anticipated and that national safety requires the invocation of the emergency authority provided for by federal law.

CONGLOMERATE (Crisis Relocation): A term used to identify a nuclear high risk area and its associated reception areas.

CONGREGATE CARE FACILITY: Facilities, to include public and private buildings, in reception areas that may be used to lodge and accommodate

evacuees. Generally, assigned space is approximately 40 square feet per person.

CRISIS RELOCATION: The concept designed to move populations from areas at high risk of nuclear attack to areas of lower risk and to provide for their well-being (i.e., congregate care housing, feeding, fallout protection, etc.)

CRP - CRISIS RELOCATION PLAN: The contingency planning designed to move populations from high hazard areas to those of lower risk and to provide for their well-being (i.e., congregate care housing, feeding, fallout protection, etc.). Also frequently referred to as evacuation planning.

CSP - COMMUNITY SHELTER PLAN: A document (normally published in map form) that enables a local government to give its people the answers to questions, "Where do I go for shelter?" and "What do I do?" when the warning sounds. The CSP designates specific shelters to be used by people working or living in specific areas of the community, thus allocating the people to the best available fallout protection. It is part of the Emergency Management Plan and is sometimes referred to as The In-Place Shelter Plan.

DECONTAMINATION: The reduction or removal of contaminating radioactive or chemical material from a structure, area, object, or person.

DAC - DISASTER APPLICATION CENTER - A location established in a disaster area which houses all federal, state and local agencies that deal directly with the needs of the individual victim. DAC's are established only after a Presidential Declaration.

DIRECTION AND CONTROL: The control group in the EOC during the emergency operations consists of the Chief Executive (Mayor/County Judge, etc.), the deputy, chiefs of the emergency operating services and any supporting staff such as communications controller, public information officer, and legal advisor as deemed necessary.

DISASTER: As event, the effects of which cause loss of life, human suffering, property damage, both public and private, and severe economic and social disruption. Disasters can be natural and man-made events; major accident, or enemy attack. Disasters are differentiated from those day-to-day emergencies and accidents that are routinely responded to by local emergency organizations, and may be of such magnitude or unusual circumstance as to require response by all levels of government--federal, state, and local.

DRILL: A supervised instruction period aimed at testing, developing and maintaining skills in a particular operation. A drill is often a component of an exercise.

EMERGENCY: According to the Disaster Relief Act of 1974 (Public Law

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93-288), the term emergency means any hurricane, tornado, storm, flood, high water, wind-driven water, tsunami (tidal wave), earthquake, volcanic eruption, landslide, mudslide, snowstorm, drought, fire, explosion or other catastrophe in any part of the United States which requires federal emergency assistance to supplement state and local efforts to save lives and protect property, public health and safety or to avert or lessen the threat of a major disaster.

EBS - EMERGENCY BROADCAST SYSTEM: A network of broadcast stations and interconnecting facilities which have been authorized by the Federal Communications Commission to operate in a controlled manner during a war, state of public peril or disaster, or other national emergency--as provided by the Emergency Broadcast System Plan.

EMERGENCY CLINIC (Crisis Relocation): A temporary facility established to render out-patient medical care for relocatees.

EMERGENCY HOSPITAL: A temporary facility established to care for hospital patients when the capacity of the existing medical facilities are exceeded.

EMP - ELECTROMAGNETIC PULSE: An effect that occurs when a nuclear weapon is detonated. EMP energy can be controlled by long cables or antennas to form voltage surges strong enough to burn out many items of electrical equipment.

EMT - EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN: An individual who has completed the required training and is licensed by the State of Texas to perform emergency basic life support functions.

EOC - EMERGENCY OPERATING CENTER: The site from which civil government officials (municipal, county, state, and federal) exercise direction and control in an emergency or disaster. To qualify as a fully operational EOC, the facility must provide protection from radioactive fallout, have back-up emergency power with a 14-day fuel supply, and staff support facilities.

EOC STAFF: The Emergency Management Director and members of the Emergency Management Organization tasked to operate the Emergency Operating Center during disasters. Also includes key coordinating and supporting staff positions that function only during disasters such as: EOC Communications Officer, Public Information Officer; Medical Coordinator, etc.

EOP - EMERGENCY OPERATIONS PLAN: A document which describes action to be taken and provides instructions to all individuals and local government services and states what will be done in an anticipated emergency. The plan will state the method of taking coordinated action to meet the needs of the situation. It will state the action to be taken by whom, what, when, and where, based on predetermined assumptions, objectives and capabilities. Synonymous with the term -

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Emergency Management Plan.

EMERGENCY PROTECTION ACTIONS (Radiological): Measures taken after a release of radioactive materials to prevent or minimize radiation exposures to persons in the threatened area. Examples of emergency protection actions are: area access control; evacuation; in-house shelter; decontamination; and, respiratory protection.

EPI - EMERGENCY PUBLIC INFORMATION: Information which is disseminated before, during and/or after an emergency which instructs and transmits direct orders to the public via the news media.

EVACUATION CONTROL PROCEDURES: The plans made by the various services to outline their duties and to ensure the orderly movement of people during the evacuation period.

EVACUATING JURISDICTION: The jurisdiction that is sending its people into safer areas during the emergency period.

EVACUEES, SPONTANEOUS: Persons who might leave an area in periods of intense crisis in response to a real or feared threat whether or not they are advised to do so.

EXECUTIVE GROUP: The control group in the Emergency Operating Center during emergency operations. Consists of the Chief Executive (Mayor, County Judge, etc.) of the affected jurisdictions and/or their deputies.

EXERCISE: An activity designed to promote emergency preparedness; test or evaluate emergency operations plans, procedures or facilities; train personnel in emergency response duties; and demonstrate operational capability. There are three specific type of exercises:

A. TABLETOP EXERCISE: An activity in which elected and appointed officials and key agency staff are presented with simulated emergency situations without time constraints. It is usually informal, in a conference room environment, and designed to elicit constructive discussion by the participants as they attempt to examine and then resolve problems based on existing emergency operating plans. The purpose is for participants to evaluate plans and procedures and to resolve questions of coordination and assignment of responsibilities in a non-threatening format and under minimum stress.

B. FUNCTIONAL EXERCISE: An activity designed to test or evaluate the capability of an individual function or complex activity within a function or complex activity within a function. It is applicable where the activity is capable of being effectively evaluated in isolation from other emergency management activity.

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(Example) A DIRECTION AND CONTROL FUNCTIONAL EXERCISE: An activity designed to test and evaluate the centralized emergency operations capability and timely response of one or more units of government under a stress environment. It is centered in an EOC, or interim EOC, and simulates the use of outside activity and resources.

C. FULL SCALE EXERCISE: A full-scale exercise is intended to evaluate the operational capability of emergency management systems in an interactive manner over a substantial period of time. It involves the testing of a major portion of the basic elements existing within emergency operations plans and organizations in a stress environment. This type of exercise includes the mobilization of personnel and resources and the actual movement of emergency workers, equipment, and resources required to demonstrate coordination and response capability.

FALLOUT, RADIOACTIVE: The process or phenomenon of the fallback to the earth's surface of particles contaminated with radioactive materials from a cloud of this matter formed by a nuclear detonation. The term is also applied in a collective sense to the contaminated particulate matter itself. The early (or local) fallout is defined, somewhat arbitrarily, as those particles which reach the earth within 24 hours after a nuclear explosion. The delayed (or worldwide) fallout consists of the smaller particles which ascend into the upper troposphere and into the stratosphere and are carried by winds to all parts of the earth. The delayed fallout is brought to earth mainly by rain or snow, over extended periods ranging from months to years.

FALLOUT SHELTER: A habitable structure, facility, or space--public or private--used to protect its occupants from radioactive fallout. Space is allocated at 10 square feet per person.

FCO - FEDERAL COORDINATING OFFICER: Responsible for the coordination of all federal disaster assistance efforts in the affected area. He works closely with the State Coordinating Officer (SCO) to assure effective implementation of assistance programs. The FCO is located in the Disaster Field Office.

FEDERAL AGENCY: Any department, independent establishment, government corporation, or other agency of the Executive Branch of the Federal Government, including the United States Postal Service, but shall not include the American Red Cross.

FEDERAL AGENCY DISASTER DESIGNATION: Certain Federal Agencies have programs under their own authorities which allow them to provide assistance without a Presidential Declaration.

FEMA - FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY: The Federal Agency charged with development of an Integrated Emergency Management System and with

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supporting Emergency Management and Disaster Assistance efforts at all levels of government.

GOVERNOR'S AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE: The person named by the Governor in the Federal-State Agreement to execute on behalf of the State all necessary documents for disaster assistance following the declaration of an emergency or major disaster, including certification of applications for public assistance.

GOVERNOR'S EMERGENCY FUND: A fund established by state law that may be expended, upon direction of the Governor, for any state of emergency to supplement local efforts to maintain and/or promptly restore essential public facilities or services when threatened or damaged as a result of a natural disaster.

GOVERNOR'S PROCLAMATION - STATE OF DISASTER EMERGENCY: The Governor has found that a disaster has occurred or that the occurrence or threat thereof is imminent within the state or any part thereof, and he has activated the disaster response and recovery aspects of state, local and interjurisdictional organizations for the purpose of aiding the affected individuals and local governments.

GROUPS, INSTITUTIONALIZED: Persons who reside in public and private group quarters of a varied nature rather than households. This includes hospital, nursing homes, orphanages, colleges, universities, and correctional facilities. Residents generally lack household possessions or transportation, or require special care and custody.

HAZARD: A potential event or circumstance which present a threat to life and/or property.

HAZMAT - HAZARDOUS MATERIALS: Substances which, if released in an uncontrolled manner (i.e., spilled), can be harmful to people, animals, property, and/or the environment.

HEALTH PHYSICS PROFESSIONAL: A person who is registered with or meets the qualifications of registration as a Plenary Member with the Health physics Society, 4720 Montgomery Lane, Bethesda, Maryland 20814.

HI - HAZARD IDENTIFICATION: The process of identifying the potential hazards that could affect the jurisdiction and determine the probable impact each of these hazards could have on people and property.

HI/CA - HAZARD IDENTIFICATION (CAPABILITY ASSESSMENT): A process implemented in Fiscal Year 1985 which surveys jurisdictions documenting aspects of the formal hazard identification capability assessment.

HIGH RISK AREA: Areas designated by the federal government, or locally through a Hazard Vulnerability analysis, as relatively more likely to experience the direct effects of certain natural disasters or nuclear

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attack.

HISTORY: The record of occurrences of previous disasters or events.

IAO - INDIVIDUAL ASSISTANCE OFFICER: A principal staff officer on the FCO's staff and directly responsible to the FCO for all matters relating to individual and mobile teams. The IAO is co-located with the FCO.

IC - INFORMATION CENTER (LOCAL): Located at or near the Emergency Operating Center (EOC). Information is compiled and verified as factual before releases. Concerned with the confirmation of information and rumor control.

ICU: Intensive Care Unit

IEMS - INTEGRATED EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM: A concept that applies mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery activities to all-hazards in a local/state/federal partnership.

"IN-PLACE" PLANNING: See CSP.

INQUIRY CENTER (LOCAL): A location separated from the Emergency Operating Center where information requests from the public can be handled. Special Disaster Information telephone numbers are published relieving pressure on the Emergency Response System. This term is synonymous with "Rumor Control."

IRR - INCREASED READINESS REPORTING: A reporting system outlined in FEMA CPG 2-10 series which would provide information concerning actions taken by local and state governments to increase readiness during periods of increased international tension, as well as public response to the crisis.

JIC - JOINT INFORMATION CENTER: A location established by State and Federal Government subsequent to a Presidential Disaster Declaration. These centers have the dual role of collecting damage information relating to the private (individual) sector and serving as a referral center to help individuals in getting available assistance to meet immediate needs.

KEY PERSONNEL: Those officials of local government and other agencies and organizations who have primary functional responsibilities under this plan.

KEY WORKER: An individual whose skills or services are required to continue operation of vital facilities and activities that will provide goods and services to the relocated population and host county residents or ensure continuance of the nation's production capabilities and preservation of the economic system.

LIAISON TEAM: A group of High Risk Area key personnel whose function is

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to coordinate Risk Area operations with Host Area officials.

LODGING FACILITIES: Public or private buildings in designated reception areas that may be used to lodge and care for evacuees. Generally, assigned space in approximately 40 square feet per person. The facility may or may not meet criteria for designation as a protective or fallout shelter.

MAJOR DISASTER: According to the Disaster Relief Act of 1974 (P.L. 93-288), the term major disaster means any hurricane, tornado, storm, flood, high water, wind-driven water, tsunami (tidal wave), earthquake, volcanic eruption, landslide, mudslide, snowstorm, drought, fire, explosion or other catastrophe in any part of the United States which in the determination of the President, causes damage of sufficient severity and magnitude to warrant major disaster assistance under this Act, above and beyond emergency services by the federal government to supplement the efforts and available resources of states, local governments, and disaster relief organizations in alleviating the damage, loss, hardship, or suffering caused thereby.

MAXIMUM THREAT: The greatest destruction that can be expected from a disaster.

MCD - MINOR CIVIL DIVISION: Those component parts of counties that have been used traditionally for the presentation of statistics. They represent political or administrative subdivision of the states and may be townships, precincts, districts, independent municipalities, etc.

MCI - MASS CASUALTY INCIDENT: An incident, emergency, or disaster which generates sufficient casualties where:

1. The number of patients and the nature of their injuries make the normal level of stabilization and care un-achievable, or
2. The number of Emergency Medical Technicians and ambulances that can be brought to the field within the time allowed is not enough, or
3. The stabilization capabilities of the hospital are insufficient to handle all the patients

MEDIA RELEASE POINT (Local): Designated location for release of information from the Information Center (IC) to the general media for dissemination to the public. May be located at or near the Information Center.

MEDIA CONTROL: The term used to designate overall command of medical treatment field operations.

MOBILE ASSISTANCE TEAM: Personnel from federal, state, local and private relief agencies which conduct meetings throughout an affected

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area to immediately aid victims or refer victims to where assistance may be available.

MUTUAL-AID AGREEMENTS: Arrangements between organizations, either public or private, for reciprocal aid and assistance in case of disaster too great to be dealt with unassisted.

NAWAS - NATIONAL WARNING SYSTEM: A nationwide dedicated telephone warning system. This system operates on the Federal, State, and local levels. When an enemy attack is confirmed by the North American Aerospace Defense Command a warning is disseminated to all warning points on the system.

NSS - NATIONAL SHELTER SURVEY: Computer listings of facilities which promote protection from radioactive fallout.

NCP - NUCLEAR CIVIL PROTECTION: A planning effort designed to provide protection of the population through one or a combination of the following options: 1) in-place at or near their places of residence or work; and 2) orderly relocation of people from areas of potentially high risk from the direct effects of nuclear weapons to areas at lower risk. Under IEMS, former NCP planning is included under the umbrella of Population Protection Planning.

OPERATIONS PLAN: A description of actions to be taken in facing an anticipated disaster situation and the method or scheme for coordinating to meet the needs of that situation. It describes the action to be taken (who, what, where, when, and how) on the basis of assumptions, objectives, and capabilities.

OPERATIONS PLANNING: The process of determining the need for application of resources and determining the methods of obtaining and committing these resources to fill the operational needs.

OVERPRESSURE: The transient pressure, usually expressed in pounds per square inch, exceeding the ambient pressure, manifested in the shock (or blast) wave from an explosion. The variation of the overpressure with time depends on the energy yield of the explosion, the distance from the point of burst, and the medium in which the weapon detonated. the peak overpressure is the maximum value of the overpressure at a given location and is generally experienced at the instant the shock (or blast) wave reaches the location.

PF - PROTECTION FACTOR (Nuclear Attack): Ratio of outside radiation to that experienced inside a fallout shelter; i.e., a person inside a PF 40 Shelter would receive only 1/40th of the radiation that exists outside the Shelter.

PPP - POPULATION PROTECTION PLANNING: A process which provides for the development, exercising, maintenance, and improvement of plans to cope with

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the effects of natural disasters, technological hazards, and nuclear attack.

PPS SURVEY: A listing of facilities which have a capability to lodge and feed evacuees.

PRESIDENTIAL EMERGENCY DECLARATION: Is issued when the President has decided that a catastrophe, in any part of the United States, requires federal emergency assistance to supplement state and local efforts to save lives and protect property, public health and safety, or to avert or lessen the threat of a natural disaster which because of the pressure of time or because of the unique capabilities of a federal agency, assistance can be more readily provided by the Federal Government.

PRESIDENTIAL MAJOR DISASTER DECLARATION: Is issued when in the determination of the President, a catastrophe causes damage of sufficient severity and magnitude to warrant Federal assistance under PL 93-288 or subsequent litigation, above and beyond emergency services provided by the Federal Government to supplement the efforts and available resources of states, local governments, and other relief organizations in alleviating the damage, loss, hardship, or suffering as a result of the catastrophe.

PROBABILITY: The likelihood an event will occur.

PROTECTIVE SHELTER: Any shelter with the capability to protect individuals, animals, or equipment from the effects of hazards such as tornadoes, blast, fire, initial radiation, and fallout. Some additional terms associated with protective shelters are:

- A. EXPEDIENT SHELTER: Any shelter constructed in an emergency or crisis period on a crash basis by government, individuals or single families.
- B. FALLOUT SHELTER: A habitable structure, facility, or space used to protect its occupants from radioactive fallout. Criteria include a protection factor of 40PF or greater, a minimum of 10 square feet of floor space per person, and at least 3 cubic feet of fresh air per minute per person when capacity is based on minimum space requirements. In unventilated underground space, 500 cubic feet of space per person is required.
- C. UPGRADABLE SHELTER: Shelter space obtained by taking actions to improve fallout protection in existing facilities and spaces; usually accomplished by adding mass overhead and to walls through use of earth and other materials to establish a protection factor of PF40 or better.

RACES - RADIO AMATEUR CIVIL EMERGENCY SERVICES: Radio communications

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services conducted by volunteer licensed amateur radio operators providing emergency radio communications to local, regional, or state emergency management organizations.

RADIOLOGICAL EMERGENCY: A radiological/nuclear incident which requires immediate action to save lives, to protect public health, to preserve property, or to reduce or avoid an increase in the threat resulting from the incident.

RADIOLOGICAL MONITORING: The use of detection equipment to determine the levels of radiation or the presence and concentration of radioactive contamination to include the planning and data collection necessary to the task.

RADIOLOGICAL PROTECTION: The organized effort, through warning, detection, and preventive or remedial measures, to minimize the effect of nuclear radiation on people and resources.

RECEPTION AREA: A specified area designated for reception and care of evacuees that is unaffected by the disaster or hazard, or in the case of possible nuclear attack is relatively unlikely to experience direct weapons effects (blast of 2psi or more, heat, and initial nuclear radiation).

REM - ROENTGEN EQUIVALENT MAN: A special equivalent or radiation dose equivalent.

ROENTGEN: The unit of exposure from X or gamma rays.

RESOURCES: Manpower, raw or basic materials, finished goods and products, services and facilities.

PRIMARY RESOURCES: those which by their nature have a national or interstate use. They generally include interstate wholesale stocks or manufacturers inventories.

SECONDARY RESOURCES: those which generally include retail stocks and intrastate wholesale stocks to meet essential needs within a single state (Post-Attack).

RESOURCES LIST: A current list of all resources (equipment, personnel, supplies) which can be used by emergency services in response to local disasters/emergencies.

SCO - STATE COORDINATING OFFICER: The person appointed by the Governor to act as the state representative for state assistance and to coordinate with the Federal Coordinating Officer.

SHELTER MANAGER: A pre-trained individual selected by their local coordinator who provides for internal organization, administration, and

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operation of a shelter facility.

SOP - STANDING OPERATING PROCEDURES: A ready and continuous reference to those procedures which are unique to a situation and which are used for accomplishing specialized functions.

STAGING AREA (SA): A pre-selected location having large parking areas and cover for equipment, vehicle operators, and other personnel such as major shopping area, schools, etc. The SA provides a base for coordinated emergency operations, assembly of persons to be moved by public transportation to reception jurisdictions, a rally point for mutual aid, and a debarking area for returning evacuees. Several of these areas may be designated to each evacuating/hazard and reception jurisdiction.

STATE EMERGENCY PLAN: State plan which is designated specifically for state-level response to emergencies or major disasters and which sets forth actions to be taken by the state and local governments, including those for implementing federal disaster assistance.

STATE RADIATION TEAM\RADIOLOGICAL MONITORING TEAM: Response team dispatched to the state of a radiological incident by the Bureau of Radiation Control, Texas Department of Health. This team or teams may be augmented by emergency management radiological monitoring resources, to include aerial monitoring if requested by the Department of Health. At the incident scene, all radiation control capabilities are coordinated by the Department of Health which also furnishes technical guidance and other services to local government.

TRAFFIC CONTROL POINTS: Places along evacuation routes that are manned by law enforcement officials to direct and control movement to and from the area being evacuated.

TRIAGE: A system of assigning priorities of medical treatment to the injured and/or ill on the basis of urgency, chance of survival, etc.

VULNERABILITY (OR RISK): The degree to which people, property, the environment, or social and economic activity--in short, all elements-at-risk--are susceptible to injury, damage, disruption, or loss of life.

BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF TYLER COUNTY, TEXAS ESTABLISHING A PROGRAM INCLUDING MITIGATION, PREPAREDNESS, RESPONSE, AND RECOVERY PHASES OF COMPREHENSIVE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT: ACKNOWLEDGING THE OFFICE OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIRECTOR; AUTHORIZING THE APPOINTMENT OF AN EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT COORDINATOR; AND PROVIDING FOR THE DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THOSE OFFICES; IDENTIFYING AN OPERATIONAL ORGANIZATION; GRANTING NECESSARY POWERS TO COPE WITH ALL PHASES OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT WHICH THREATEN LIFE AND PROPERTY IN THE COUNTY OF TYLER; AUTHORIZING COOPERATIVE AND MUTUAL AID AGREEMENTS FOR RELIEF WORK BETWEEN THIS AND OTHER CITIES OR COUNTIES AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES; PROHIBITING UNAUTHORIZED WARNING AND ALL-CLEAR SIGNALS AND MAKING VIOLATIONS A MISDEMEANOR PUNISHABLE BY FINE NOT TO EXCEED \$ 250.00

WHEREAS, The Commissioners Court of the County of Tyler finds that the identification of potential hazards and the prevention or mitigation of their effects must be an on-going concern of the County if the lives and property of the populace are to be protected; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court hereby declares that the preparation of a Comprehensive Emergency Management plan, and the means for its implementation for the protection of lives and property in the County of Tyler from natural or man-caused disasters or threat thereof is immediately essential; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court further finds that in times of disasters which may imperil the safety of the inhabitants of the City, or their property, it becomes necessary to effectuate and place into operation the preconceived plans and preparations with a minimum of delay; and

WHEREAS, The Commissioners Court finds, therefore, that the preparation and implementation of such plans are now imperative; BE IT ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF TYLER COUNTY, TEXAS:

Section 1. ORGANIZATION

There exists the office of Emergency Management Director of the County of Tyler, which shall be held by the County Judge in accordance with state law.

- (a) **A Manager of Emergency Services and an Emergency Management Coordinator** may be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Director,
- (b) The Director shall be responsible for a program of comprehensive emergency management within the County and for carrying out the duties and responsibilities set forth in this ordinance. He/she may delegate authority for execution of these duties to the Coordinator, but ultimate responsibility for such execution shall remain with the Director.

- (c) The operational Emergency Management organization of the County of Tyler shall consist of the officers and employees of the County so designated by the Director in the emergency management plan, as well as organized volunteer groups. The functions and duties of this organization shall be distributed among such officers and employees in accordance with the terms of the emergency management plan.

Section 2. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIRECTOR - POWERS AND DUTIES

The duties and responsibilities of the Emergency Management Director shall include the following:

- (a) Conduct an on-going survey of actual or potential hazards which threaten life and property within the County and an on-going program of identifying and requiring or recommending the implementation of measures which would tend to prevent the occurrence or reduce the impact of such hazards if a disaster did occur.
- (a) Supervision of the development and approval of an emergency management plan for the County of Tyler, and shall recommend for adoption by the Commissioners Court all mutual aid arrangements deemed necessary for the implementation of such plan.
- (c) Authority to declare a local state of disaster. The declaration may not be continued or renewed for a period in excess of 7 days except by or with the consent of the Commissioners Court. Any order or proclamation declaring, continuing, or terminating a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the County Clerk.
- (d) Issuance of necessary proclamations, regulations, or directives which are necessary for carrying out the purposes of this order. Such proclamations, regulations, or directives shall be disseminated promptly by means calculated to bring its contents to the attention of the general public and, unless circumstances attendant on the disaster prevent or impede, promptly filed with the County Clerk.
- (e) Direction and control of the operations of the Tyler County Emergency Management organization as well as the training of Emergency Management personnel..
- (f) Determination of all questions of authority and responsibility that may arise within the Emergency Management organization of the County.
- (g) Maintenance of liaison with other municipal, county, district, state, regional or federal Emergency Management organizations.
- (h) Marshaling of all necessary personnel, equipment, or supplies from any department of the County to aid in the carrying out of the provisions of the emergency management plan.
- (i) Supervision of the drafting and execution of mutual aid agreements, in cooperation with the representatives of the State and of other local political subdivisions of the State, and the drafting and execution, if deemed desirable, of an agreement with the cities located in Tyler County, for the County-wide coordination of Emergency Management efforts.
- (j) Supervision of, and final authorization for the procurement of all necessary supplies and equipment, including acceptance of private contributions which may be offered for the purpose of improving Emergency Management within the County .

- (k) Authorizing of agreements, after approval by the County Attorney, for use of private property for public shelter and other purposes.
- (l) Survey of the availability of existing personnel, equipment, supplies, and services which could be used during a disaster, as provided for herein.
- (m) Other requirements as specified in the Texas Disaster Act of 1975, Vernon's Texas Codes Annotated, Government Code Chapter 418

Section 3. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLAN

A comprehensive Emergency Management Plan shall be developed and maintained in a current state. The plan shall set forth the form of the organization; establish and designate divisions and functions; assign responsibilities, tasks, duties, and powers; and designate officers and employees to carry out the provisions of this ordinance. As provided by State law, the plan shall follow the standards and criteria established by the State division of Emergency Management of the State of Texas. Insofar as possible, the form of organization, titles, and terminology shall conform to the recommendations of the State Division of Emergency Management. When approved, it shall be the duty of all departments and agencies to perform the functions assigned by the plan and to maintain their portion of the plan in a current state of readiness at all times. The emergency management plan shall be considered supplementary to this ordinance and have the effect of law during the time of a disaster.

Section 4. INTERJURISDICTIONAL PROGRAM

The County Judge is hereby authorized to join with the Mayors of the cities in Tyler County in the formation of an interjurisdictional emergency management program for the County of Tyler, and shall have the authority to cooperate in the preparation of an interjurisdictional emergency management plan, as well as all powers necessary to participate in a County-wide program of emergency management insofar as said program may affect the County of Tyler.

Section 5. OVERRIDE

At all times when the orders, rules, and regulations made and promulgated pursuant to this ordinance shall be in effect, they shall supersede and override all existing ordinances, orders, rules, and regulations insofar as the latter may be inconsistent therewith.

Section 6. LIABILITY

This order is an exercise by the County of its governmental functions for the protection of the public (peace, health) and safety and neither the County of Tyler, the agents and representatives of said County, nor any individual, receiver, firm, partnership, corporation, association, or trustee, nor any of the agents thereof, in good faith carrying out, complying with or attempting to comply with, any order, rule, or regulation promulgated pursuant to the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable for any damage sustained to persons as the result of said activity. Any person owning or controlling real estate or other premises who voluntarily and without compensation grants to the County of Tyler a license of privilege, or otherwise permits the County to inspect, designate, and use the whole or any part or parts of such real estate or premises for the purpose of sheltering persons during an actual, impending, or practice enemy attack or natural or man-made disaster shall, together with his successors in interest, if any, not be civilly liable for the death of, or injury to, any person on or about such real estate or

premises under such license, privilege or other permission or for loss of, or damage to, the property of such person.

Section 7. COMMITMENT OF FUNDS

No person shall have the right to expend any public funds of the County in carrying out any Emergency Management activity authorized by this ordinance without prior approval by the County Council, nor shall any person have any right to bind the County by contract, agreement, or otherwise without prior and specific approval of the County Council unless during a declared disaster. During a declared disaster, the County judge may expend and/or commit public funds of the County when deemed prudent and necessary for the protection of health, life, or property.

Section 8. OFFENSES; PENALTIES

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person willfully to obstruct, hinder, or delay any member of the Emergency Management organization in the enforcement of any rule or regulation issued pursuant to this ordinance.
- (b) It shall likewise be unlawful for any person to wear, carry, or display any emblem, insignia, or any other means of identification as a member of the Emergency Management organization of the County of Tyler, unless authority to do so has been granted to such person by the proper officials.
- (c) Any unauthorized person who shall operate a siren or other device so as to simulate a warning signal, or the termination of a warning, shall be deemed guilty of a violation of this ordinance and shall be subject to the penalties imposed by this ordinance.
- (d) Convictions for violations of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punishable by fine not to exceed \$ 250.00 dollars

Section 9. SEVERABILITY

If any portion of this ordinance shall, for any reason, be declared invalid such, invalidity shall not affect the remaining provisions thereof.

Section 10. LIMITATIONS

This ordinance shall not be construed so as to conflict with any State or Federal statute or with any military or naval order, rule or regulation.

Section 11. REPEALER

All orders, parts of orders, or resolutions in conflict herewith are expressly repealed.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS

THIS AGREEMENT, made entered into and executed this _____ day of _____, 1999, by and between the State of Texas acting by and through the Engineer - Director, with approval of the Texas Department of Transportation District, hereinafter called the "State," and Tyler County hereinafter called the "Local Jurisdiction"

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the State desires to enter into an agreement with the Local Jurisdiction concerning the installation of load posting signs on bridges within the Local Jurisdiction;

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, the State and the Local Jurisdiction, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, do mutually agree as follows:

The Local Jurisdiction agrees to order load posting signs from the State, the State agrees to administer Federal funds to provide the load posting signs at no cost to the Local Jurisdiction, and the Local Jurisdiction agrees to take delivery, install, and maintain the signs as stated in the sections to follow.

1. Signs. The Local Jurisdiction hereby orders the following quantities of signs:

Sign R12-2Tb 31 ea.
Sign R12-2Tc 4 ea.
Sign R12-4Tb - ea.
Sign W12-5 20 ea.

Weight limits for each proposed sign shall be as listed in Attachment A, "Sign Requirements," attached hereto and made part of this agreement.

2. Sign Supports and Hardware. In addition, the Local Jurisdiction hereby orders the Following quantities of sign supports with appropriate hardware, and the State hereby agrees to administer Federal funds to provide the sign supports and hardware at no cost to the Local Jurisdiction.

Posts 2 each

3. Authorization. The Local Jurisdiction shall properly authorize all proposed signs by ordinance, resolution, or other appropriate action and shall provide a copy of such which shall be attached hereto and designated Attachment B.
4. Delivery. The Local Jurisdiction shall take delivery of all proposed signs, sign supports, and hardware as agreed upon with the appropriate Texas Department of Transportation District Office.
5. Installation and Documentation. The Local Jurisdiction shall install all proposed signs in accordance with requirements of Attachment C, "Load Posting Signs," and Attachment D, "Vertical and Lateral Clearances". The Local Jurisdiction shall document the installation by marking the date sticker affixed to the back of each sign.
6. Notification and Inspection. The Local Jurisdiction shall notify the appropriate Texas Department of Transportation District Office in writing within 15 days after all Proposed signs have been properly installed. The Local Jurisdiction shall allow the Federal Highway Administration to perform on-site inspection of the installed signs and shall adjust any signs that are found to be improperly installed.
7. Maintenance. The Local Jurisdiction shall keep the installed signs clean, legible, and open to the view of approaching motorists for at least 150 feet. The Local Jurisdiction shall reinstall signs that have been knocked down by vandalism, traffic accidents, or other causes.
8. State Responsibility. The appropriate Texas Department of Transportation District Office agrees to provide the Local Jurisdiction with reasonable consultation assistance in accomplishing the objectives of this agreement.
9. State Indemnified. The Local Jurisdiction shall save harmless the State from all claims and liabilities due to activities of the Local Jurisdiction, its agents, officials, or employees performed under this agreement and which result from an error, omission, or negligent act of the Local Jurisdiction, its agents, officials, or employees. The Local Jurisdiction shall also save harmless the State from any and all expenses, including attorney fees which might be incurred by the State in litigation or otherwise resisting said claims or liabilities.

10. Disputes. Should disputes arise under this contract, the State's decision shall be final and binding.
11. Civil Rights Compliance. With regard to work performed under this contract, the Local Jurisdiction, in compliance with regulations of the Department of Transportation (49CFR21 and 23CFR710.405), Executive Orders 11246 and 11375 regarding Equal Employment Opportunity, and regulations of the Department of Labor (41 CFR60), shall not discriminate on the grounds of race, color, sex, or national origin.
12. Inspection of Books and Records. The Federal Highway Administration, the Department of Transportation, the Office of Inspector General, and the Comptroller General of the United States, or any duty authorized representatives thereof, shall have access to any books, documents, papers, and records which are directly pertinent to this contract for the purpose of making audits, examinations, excerpts, and transcriptions.


