Commissioner Marshall made a motion to approve the Minutes of November 14, 2000, May 18, 2001, and June 11, 2001. Commissioner Woodrome seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Hughes made a motion to approve paying the bills. Commissioner Marshall seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Marshall and seconded by Commissioner Walston to table bids for the sale of a used patrol car. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Marshall to accept the bid from Gardner Oil for purchase of petroleum products. Commissioner Hughes seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED.

Commissioner Marshall made a motion to reject all bids for road materials and go out again for bids with new specifications. The bids will be opened during the Regular Meeting on July 9, at 10:00 a.m. Commissioner Woodrome seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Woodrome made a motion which was seconded by Commissioner Marshall to approve a gravel donation agreement between Temple Inland and Tyler County Pct. 1. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED.

Commissioner Hughes made a motion which was seconded by Commissioner Marshall to approve a gravel donation agreement between Temple Inland and Tyler County Pct. 2. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED.

A motion was made by Commissioner Marshall and seconded by Commissioner Walston to have Commissioner Hughes and Commissioner Woodrome to be in charge of placing the Historical marker in front of the Courthouse. All voted yes and none no.

Sheryl Downing, a financial services professional with The Mony Group, presented an employee benefit program. This is a Section 125 Cafeteria Plan offering life insurance, disability, and cancer policies. A time will be decided by a committee as to when Sheryl and her associates can meet with the employees to present these plans.

A presentation was to be given by Vicki Fulk on economic development. She was not present; therefore, no action was taken.

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Commissioner Hughes made a motion to table a resolution to close a public road in the City of Woodville. Commissioner Marshall seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Hughes and seconded by Commissioner Marshall to approve line item transfers as requested by Melissie Evans, District Clerk. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED.

Commissioner Woodrome made a motion to approve Rusty Hughes, Commissioner of Precinct 2, to be a designated signatory for the Kirby Memorial Chapel. Commissioner Marshall seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.

Elaine Clow presented the fiscal policy for the Tyler County Child Welfare Board which was adopted on May 1, 2001. Commissioner Woodrome made a motion to approve the policy which was seconded by Commissioner Walston. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED.

Judge Jerome Owens read the names of those who had been nominated to serve on the Redistricting Committee. They are: Judge Allen Sturrock, Chairman, Michael Hadnot, Judith Haney, Janet Terrell, Billy Frank Eaves, Jerry Grimes, Eunice Vinson, Henry Deason, James Gunter, Sue Shaw, Willie Gill, Luther Moya, and Henry Earl Sawyer. Commissioner Walston made a motion to appoint these citizens to serve on the Redistricting Committee. Commissioner Marshall seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.

John Paul Feely gave an update on the flooding situation due to rains from Tropical Storm Allison. FEMA will reimburse the county 75% for the damages incurred if documented and submitted by the deadline. This was not an agenda item; therefore, no action was taken.



TYLER COUNTY CHILD WELFARE BOARD
BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I - PURPOSE

To act as an advocate for children with emphasis on the dependent, neglected and abused children in Tyler County.

ARTICLE II - MEMBERSHIP

- A. The board shall consist of a "Regular Board" of not less than seven (7) and not more than fifteen (15) members to be appointed by the Tyler County Commissioners' Court. The members shall be residents of Tyler County, Texas.
- B. The board shall also include a "Reserve Board" whose members shall be enabled to fully participate in all functions of the Board and any committee thereof except voting on issues brought before the Board.
- C. The County Judges, County Commissioners, and the County District Attorney shall be "Ex-officio Members" of the Board.
- D. New members of the "Regular Board" shall be nominated by the Board and appointed by Tyler County Commissioners' Court. The "Regular Board" shall be appointed and approved by Tyler County Commissioners' Court. The entire Board membership will be presented to the Tyler County Commissioners' Court during the January annual report.
- E. Vacancies as they occur on the "Regular Board" shall be filled by nomination by the Board and appointment by Tyler County Commissioners' Court, provided however, that such appointment will be for the unfilled term of that vacancy. Non-attendance by any "Regular Board" member of three (3) consecutive regular meetings without notification will act as an automatic retirement of such non-attending member from the "Regular Board" there-by creating a vacancy on the "Regular Board".

ARTICLE III - OFFICERS

- A. The Board shall hold elections at each January meeting.
- B. A nominating committee of three (3) members shall be appointed at the December meeting. They shall present to the Board a suggested slate of officers at the January meeting. Board membership will be notified prior to the January meeting.
- C. Duties and responsibilities of the officers:
 1. The chair shall be the presiding officer of the Board. The Chair shall perform all duties pertaining to the office and those additional duties delegated by the Board. The Chair shall be an ex-officio member of all committees appointed from the Board.
 2. The Vice-Chair shall perform the duties of the Chair in case of absence or disability of the Chair. The Vice-Chair shall perform all other duties delegated by the Board.
 3. The Secretary shall be the recording officer of the Board. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Board and conduct such correspondence and perform such other duties pertaining to said office as are delegated by the Board.
 4. The Treasurer shall receive all funds for the Board; depositing such funds in a depository selected by the Board. The Treasurer shall disburse all funds spent by the Board, disbursing such funds by check to be signed by two (2) "Regular Board" members as selected by the Board. In addition, the Treasurer shall perform such other duties pertaining to said office as are delegated by the Board.

ARTICLE IV - MEETINGS

- A. Meetings shall be held at the discretion of the Board. Members will be notified as to time and place. Special meetings may be called by the Chair or by a majority of the Board.
- B. A simple majority of the "Regular Board" present shall constitute a quorum at Board meetings.
- C. Robert's Rule of Order shall govern parliamentary procedure of the Board.
- D. An annual report will be made to the Tyler County Commissioners' Court in January of each year which will be open to the public.

ARTICLE V - COMMITTEES

The Board may appoint committees to carry out programs as needed.

ARTICLE VI - FISCAL YEAR

The Fiscal year of the Board shall be the same as followed by Tyler County. At the close of each fiscal year an audit of the financial affairs of the Board will be completed by the Tyler County Auditor's Office with the results of such audit to be reported to the Board.

ARTICLE VII - DUTIES

- A. Negotiate and act as a liaison between the protective services unit and the Tyler County Commissioners' Court to secure adequate local funding for program components.
- B. Advise TDPRS staff about local policies, related to expenditure of county funds.
- C. Authorize spending county funds for appropriated purposes.
- D. Review and account for expenditures of protective services units to ensure that county money is spent for appropriated purposes.
- E. Conduct needs assessments for the children in the county.
- F. Formulate with TDPRS staff a plan to develop community resources to meet identified needs.
- G. Interpret child protective services and needs to the community and explain to TDRPS staff conditions in the community and community attitudes about TDPRS's policy, services, and priorities.
- H. Coordinate operations and develop local agreements, as needed, with other community agencies serving children.
- I. In conjunction with TDPRS staff, formulate goals and objectives for the Board and evaluate progress in achieving these goals and objectives.
- J. Review quality of services being rendered by the protective services units.

ARTICLE VIII - STANDING RULES

- A. The Board will maintain the following policies:
 - 1. Fiscal Policy
 - 2. Maintain information on Foster Children
 - 3. Transportation Assistance Policy
- B. The Board may adopt and/or amend additional policies as needed.

ARTICLE IX - AMENDMENTS TO THE BY-LAWS

These By-Laws may be amended at any regular meeting of the Board by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the entire Board, provided that any proposed change be submitted in writing to the Board at the regular monthly meeting prior to a vote.

Dear Judge Owens:

Tyler County is a jurisdiction covered by Sec.5 of the Federal Voting Rights Act. As a result all election changes must be precleared by either the Attorney General of the United States or a three-judge panel of the United States District Court in D.C. In either instance the proposed change may "not have the purpose and [or] the effect of denying or abridging the right to vote on the count of race or color." 28 CFR51.13(e)

The Department of Justice strongly recommends community participation and input in the redistricting process and carefully considers this input in the preclearance process 51CFR57(c); 51CFR28(f). The primary purposes of the Citizens Advisory Committee are as follows:

- 1) The committee does not draft plans. It is the committee's function to review the drafting and to insure that it is done openly, fairly and subject to public scrutiny.
- 2) To help implement the "traditional redistricting principles" that the commissioners court sets out as being its guiding principles in the preparation of the plan and to suggest alternatives as to how these principles could be more effectively implemented.
- 3) To serve as a channel of communication between the commissioners court and those parts of the community that each member represents and to actively solicit advice and opinions from the community at large.
- 4) *To serve as objective channels of communication to the Department of Justice in regard to the preclearance process expressing opinions to the Civil Rights Division on any topic they deem pertinent to the process, whether substantive or procedural. To respond to whatever questions the Justice Department may have about the process.
- 5) To actively participate in public hearings after a plan has been drafted (but before

adoption) and to respond to questions from the public or the news media either about the process or the substantive components of the redistricting proposal.

- 6) Any other functions which the commissioners court may assign to the committee.

**Traditional Redistricting Criteria
Recognized by the United States Supreme Court**

- Criterion 1: Where possible, easily identifiable geographic boundaries should be followed.
- Criterion 2: Communities of interest should be maintained in a single district, where possible, and attempts should be made to avoid splitting neighborhoods.
- Criterion 3: To the extent possible, districts should be composed of whole voting precincts. Where this is not possible or practicable, districts should be drawn in a way that permits the creation of practical voting precincts and that ensures that adequate facilities for polling places exist in each precinct.

- Criterion 4: Although it is recognized that existing districts will have to be altered to reflect new population distribution, any districting plan should be based on existing districts to the extent possible.

- Criterion 5: Districts must be configured so that they are relatively equal in total population according to the 2000 federal census. In no event should the total deviation between the largest and the smallest district exceed ten percent.

- Criterion 6: The districts should be compact and composed of contiguous territory. Compactness may contain a functional, as well as a geographical dimension.

- Criterion 7: Consideration may be given to the preservation of incumbent-constituency relations by recognition of the residence of incumbents and their history in representing certain areas.

- Criterion 8 and 9: The plan should be narrowly tailored to avoid retrogression in the position of racial minorities as defined in the Voting Rights Act with respect to their effective exercise of the electoral franchise. The plan should not fragment a geographically compact minority community or pack minority voters in the presence of polarized voting so as to create liability under section 2 of the Voting Rights Act, 42, U.S.C. § 1973c.

Dear Judge Owens:

Now that we have the 2000 census in hand, our redistricting of the Tyler County Commissioners Court can commence with all deliberate speed. Keeping in mind that the Texas Legislature had until May 28, 2001 to reconfigure the House, Senate, Congressional, and Board of Education - all of which may and will affect the final structuring of our election precincts. But the Legislature was unable to accomplish this reconfiguration, so now either the Legislature, in special session, or the LRB will make the reconfiguration decisions. Thus, we continue to wait until the House, Senate, Congressional, and Board of Education reconfiguration decisions are made to finalize the structuring of our election precincts. Our tentative proposed schedule for Tyler County will be as follows:

- 1) Monday, June 11, 2001 a formal conference with the commissioners court and the Citizens Advisory Committee in unison. Mike will review the malapportionment evaluation of the commissioners' precincts and advise as to our obligations under "one person, one vote" if the deviation exceeds $\pm 10\%$. (*Avery v. Midland Co.*)
- 2) I will then give a brief overview of the governing legal principles under article V-18 of the Texas Constitution, the Equal Protection Clause of the 14th amendment, and our important obligations under the Federal Voting Rights Act.
- 3) At this juncton, after a short recess, I would like for the court (on the record) to outline the traditional redistricting criteria that should guide us in the preparation of the proposed plans.
- 4) I would then like to hear comments and suggestions from the Citizens Advisory Committee about how these traditional redistricting criteria should be implemented

from their point of view.

- 5) As soon as a plan or plans are available, a second meeting with the court and the committee will be combined with public hearings to review and refine the initial drafts and hopefully arrive at a consensus in regard to a proposed plan. The date of this meeting will depend upon how quickly we can "narrow the field" in regard to the proposed plans.
- 6) As soon as the state wide boundaries for House, Senate and Congressional are set either by the legislature, in special session, or LRB we will need a lengthy conference with the elections administrator in regard to any changes required or needed in regard to the election precinct structure.
- 7) The Texas election code article 42.032 specifies that changes in the election precinct boundaries should be adopted before October 1, 2001. Of course they do not have to be precleared by that date but the commissioners court should pass its formal resolution before October 1, 2001.
- 8) If changes in the existing structure of Justices of the Peace and Constables are contemplated, these changes must be a part of the process. They like all other electoral changes, must be submitted to and precleared by the Justice Department.
- 9) Section 5 submission to the Attorney General of the United States.
