WHEREAS, the undersigned understand that their friends, neighbors, customers and constituents are forced through the lack of air service to hub facilities and high ticket prices to utilize airports as far as two (2) hours away from their homes and work places; and

WHEREAS, the current air service dilemma facing the Southeast Texas Regional Airport will give area businesses and residents significantly reduced service at increased prices; and

WHEREAS, Tyler County Commissioners' Court has met and discussed the particulars of the public-private partnership necessary to make the Small Community Air Service Development Pilot Program successful; and

WHEREAS, the Southeast Texas Regional Airport has the ability to serve a regional population base of 500,000, and already has recorded a yearly passenger enplanement figure of 100,000 passengers; and

WHEREAS, the Southeast Texas Regional Airport boast the ability to service up to six carriers immediately at its 45,000 sq. foot commercial terminal.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the undersigned individuals and organizations support Jefferson County and the Southeast Texas Regional Airport's efforts to garner support and funding through the federal government's "Small Community Air Service Development Pilot Program" to attempt to attract and maintain air service to the surrounding communities.
