RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, water is a valuable natural resource, and;

WHEREAS, its proper use and protection is incumbent upon all citizens, we the undersigned adopt the following:

- 1) We encourage our state legislative elected official and local elected officials to plan a Groundwater Conservation District that is within the geographic boundaries of Tyler County that will protect local citizens water rights;
- 2) We encourage the development of a Groundwater Conservation District for Tyler County in order to maintain local control of this natural resource;
- 3) All water planning should be done with a minimum of a 50 year time period, and
- 4) Exemptions for wells for domestic and agricultural use must be upheld.

WHEREAS, the timeliness of the coordination between our local communities, local and state legislative elected officials, and the convening 77th Legislative session creates the need for efficient and swift coordination between interested parties.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Tyler County Commissioners' Court is in full support of moving forward with the exploration and coordination of a groundwater management district for Tyler County to be created through the Texas Legislature.
