RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Texas Department of Transportation has approved ROW CSJ No. 1237-01-024, relative to the bridge replacement on FM 1013 at Turkey Creek and subject to certain provisions, and;

WHEREAS, upon acceptance of the provisions provided by Tyler County, the Texas Department of Transportation will:

- 1. Designate the above referenced limits to a Farm to Market Road.
- 2. Provide advance planning including route studies, preparation of environmental documents and required public involvement, schematics and determination of right of way requirements.
- 3. Provide relocation assistance as may be determined to be eligible under the Relocation Assistance Program.

NOW THEREFORE Tyler County does agree to the following provisions:

- 1. Accept responsibility for any required environmental mitigation, including special biological studies, mitigations lands if needed, and/or special environmentally related design features.
- Provide one hundred percent of the right of way clear of obstructions and free of
 cost to the State with acquisition procedures to be in accordance with policies of
 the Texas Department of Transportation and with applicable Federal and State
 laws governing the acquisition policies for acquiring real property.
- 3. Provide one hundred percent of the cost of all utility adjustments as may be required in accordance with policies of the Texas Department of Transportation.
- 4. Continue to provide maintenance for all county roads within the above referenced limits until construction by the Texas Department of Transportation begins.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tyler County Commissioners' Court does approve and agree to the foregoing provisions.
