## 8. Please provide a brief description of your organization's history and the services it provides:

Tyler County Hospital, originally named Tyler County Memorial Hospital, was erected in 1950 by the people of Tyler County in memory of men and women of the county who served in the armed forces during World War II. The Hospital first opened in July 1950 and was administered and supported by the Baptist Churches until 1955. The Commissioners' Court of Tyler County in 1955, accepted the administrative responsibilities for the county and appointed a Board of Trustees to act as the governing board. As a result, the name of the institution was changed to Tyler County Hospital. The Commissioners' Court appoints the tax rate for the hospital district. A vocational school of nursing program was opened in 1954 and currently accepts 72 nursing students from neighboring counties as well as Tyler County. In 1965, the people of Tyler County voted in favor of establishing a hospital district and the name of the governing board was changed to The Board of Managers of Tyler County Hospital District. The district would later open a home health agency. In 1999, an assisted living center was opened. A rural health clinic was purchased in 2003 and now holds five physicians and one nurse practitioner. This clinic houses the only doctors in the county. Tyler County Hospital is owned by the county and is the only hospital in the county. It is a 49-bed facility with 25 acute care staffed beds, a 24 hour Level IV Trauma Emergency Center, A Laboratory Department, Radiology/Imaging Department, Respiratory Department, Outpatient Department and holds Outpatient Doctor Clinics for cardiology, neurology, optometry, urology and gynecology. We dedicate ourselves to creating and demonstrating compassion in action as well as providing on going services to meet the needs of the hurricane victims.

#### 9. What is the service area of your organization?

We serve Tyler, Polk, Jasper, Jefferson, Angelina and Hardin Counties on a regular basis. We also serve patients from other Texas counties as well as from other states in our emergency room, acute care hospital, rural health clinic, and assisted living facility.

## 10. Please briefly explain the services provided to Hurricane Rita victims effectively September 24, 2005 for which reimbursement is requested:

Tyler County Hospital continues to provide emergency health care services, acute care services, assisted living services, education & training services as well as rural health clinic services to Hurricane Rita victims. Patients are seen, stabilized, treated in the emergency room, acute care wing or transferred when needed to a higher level of care. Tyler County Hospital is requesting assistance for a continuation of services that are Health Related and Home Health, Information & Referral, Education and Training, Case Management and other hospital services. Our pharmacy required repair & renovation to continue to provide medications to hurricane victims who required inpatient services to maintain a favorable condition of health. The hospital has a vocational school of nursing which accepts 72 nursing students a year. The school is cramped with students. We want to renovate the school building to allow more students to continue their education in the future so they can maintain economic self support. Also, we want to continue providing education and training in health education and safety education to hurricane victims which will help them to become self sufficient. This will be provided through a Training Center. The addition of a building for training and education of Hurricane Rita affected individuals is requested. A need exists for training on diabetes, hypertension, nutrition, and obesity is needed in this country. The Rural Health Clinic has not been able to afford the technology needed for continual and ongoing services to the hurricane victims. Tyler County was designated as a disaster area and all county residents were victims. Tyler County is a Health Professional Shortage Area as well as a Medically Underserved Area. A physician is needed to continue serving Hurricane Rita victims. The entire county was designated a disaster area so all residents were impacted. These services are needed to meet the ongoing needs of its citizens. Attached is September 2006 article from Rural Roads entitled Treating Hurricane Evacuees by Tammy Houck Talbot.
