A motion was made by Commissioner Nash and seconded by Commissioner Marshall to approve the minutes of November 13, 2007. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by Commissioner Hughes and seconded by Commissioner Walston to approve paying the bills as submitted by the County Auditor. All voted and none no. SEE ATTACHED

County Auditor Joyce Moore presented line item transfers from the departments that needed to transfer funds within their own budget. A motion was made by Commissioner Hughes and seconded by Commissioner Nash to approve the line item transfers as presented. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED

Commissioner Hughes motioned to approve the \$10,000 contract with Netdata for hardware maintenance. Commissioner Walston seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.

John Paul Feeley presented the commission appointments for Emergency Services Districts. Mr. Feeley stated the requirement for ESD budget approval by court had been repealed; however, fiscal reports are due in June of each year. Commissioner Marshall motioned to make appointments as presented with exception to ESD #3, which will be done at a later time. Commissioner Walston seconded the motion. All votes yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED

The County Auditor presented the bids received for workman's compensation insurance. Commissioner Marshall motioned to award the bid to Texas Association of Counties, being the lowest and best bid. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Walston. All voted yes and none no.

Laurie Honeycutt, representing TAC, offered a list of deductibles and premiums for liability insurance for all county officials. She pointed out the insurance does not cover suits such as officials vs. officials. She added there would be a savings premium for appx. \$3000 on the worker's compensation. Commissioner Nash motioned to approve purchasing liability for both the officials and law enforcement at the \$5000 deductible premium rate on both policies. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hughes. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED NOTES

John Paul Feeley presented the requirements by FEMA for county officials and first-line supervisors to have training classes required for **National Incident Management System** (NIMS). The training has to be completed in the fiscal year 2008. Mr. Feeley is certified to teach the classes and will coordinate this requirement. No action taken.

Lou Cloy presented an option of converting to an electronic means of research in the **law library** versus having the bound books with supplements. She stated the public could do research in the office of the criminal district attorney. She will research this further with the West Publishing Company. No action was taken.

Based upon the scoring by Commissioner Walston and Commissioner Nash, Commissioner Walston motioned to award Goodwin & Lassiter as the engineering firm, pending upon the recommendation of David Waxman & Associates, for the Disaster Round II/ non critical infrastructure project. Commissioner Nash seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.

Judge Blanchette acknowledged James White and his American Government students.



TEXAS ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES RISK MANAGEMENT POOL WORKERS' COMPENSATION COVERAGE

Preferred Package Discount

January 1, 2008 - 2009

The Texas Association of Counties Risk Management Pool has established a Preferred Liability-Property Package Discount for its Workers' Compensation Coverage. Effective January 1, 2008, all members of TAC's Risk Management Pool who carry Workers' Compensation coverage and also carry Liability or Property and Casualty will receive up to a 10% additional discount off their annual Worker's Compensation coverage contribution. Each eligible line of coverage, carried through TAC Risk Management Pool will earn an additional 2% discount off Workers' Compensation coverage charges. This additional discount is given after all other member discounts and experience modifiers have been applied to the manual Workers Compensation coverage contribution. Eligible coverages are Automobile Liability, General Liability, Public Officials Liability, Law Enforcement Liability and Property.

Texas Association of Counties Pooling Self-Insuring for Workers' Compensation, Liability and Property Coverage

Pooling results from an agreement among a group of counties or similar entities to jointly finance their losses. Members contribute funds (premiums) to the pool, which in turn pays losses, purchases reinsurance and handles administrative functions in a manner similar to what an insurance company does.

Background

In the middle 1970's, liability suits against counties and other governmental entities mushroomed. Plaintiffs found new basis for claims in laws such as the Civil Rights Act and for the first time Texas Counties were required to provide workers' compensation to their employees. The doctrine of "joint and several liability" was applied more widely by the courts. Under this doctrine, if two or more entities or individuals are responsible for an injury, and one is unable to pay, the other party must pay the entire claim, even when environmental factors were alleged. For example, an automobile accident could be partially attributed to imperfect road design, thus the county could be required to pay even though the more approximate cause was error on the part of the driver.

Because use and application of these legal concepts by the courts caused an explosion of claims and attendant cost, most insurers elected to drop out of the municipal business. Those that remained raised their price to unacceptably high levels because of the uncertainty of the legal system. The result was a movement by governmental bodies to pool risks among related entities to compensate for the lack of affordable insurance and as an attempt by management to control cost. This "pooling" movement began in earnest in the late 1970's and accelerated through the 1980's, enabling public entities to do without commercial insurance entirely or at least eliminate it for lower cost risks and retain most of the liability exposure within the Pool.

Workers' compensation was the first type of risk to be pooled by County Government in Texas because the commercial market could not provide the needed insurance. Pooling did not begin for coverages such as Public Officials Errors and Omissions and Law Enforcement liability until a crisis in liability insurance availability was precipitated in the middle 1980's. Though initially only involved with workers' compensation, TAC, responding to member needs, began offering a full range of liability coverages. In the early 1990's this was again expanded to offer property coverage.

Benefits of TAC Sponsored Pooling

- Stability of year-to-year insurance cost.
- ♦ Liability for risks are transferred to the Pool, not retained by the members as may be the case with some other risk financing scheme or pools that allow members to be assessed additional cost.
- Risk transfer costs are reduced; that is, agent or broker fees and insurer overhead, are reduced or eliminated by replacing these functions with professional, in-house Pool managers and staff.
- ♦ Investment income is realized from investing money held for reserves for claims payment. This investment income directly lowers costs of coverage to Pool members.
- ♦ Entities with particularly bad loss experience can be excluded because they are identifiable and can be subjected to scrutiny and evaluation by their peers. If coverage is offered members with high losses will pay a higher cost, proportional to their losses.
- ♦ Each member has a voice, through its Board of Directors, in claims-making decisions and an opportunity to create a rating system to encourage activities pool members believe are important to them.
- Professional risk and claims management services are provided for entities too small to afford it on their own. Familiarity of the Fund manager and staff with pool members leads to better risk analysis, loss prevention, claims handling, and excess insurance placement.
- ◆ Spreading loss prevention costs over a broad base allows more complete programs of safety, training, and other loss prevention programs.
- The combined purchasing power of many entities leads to more effective purchase of reinsurance.

Pooling By the Members - for the Members

All coverages offered by TAC are managed by Board of Trustees composed exclusively of Texas elected or appointed county officials. These members have a fiduciary duty which they voluntarily and enthusiastically perform to provide pool members with a quality program and reasonable prices for their liability needs.

Legislative Authority for Pool Operation

During the special legislative session in 1986, Chapter 119, Local Government Code was enacted through the combined efforts of many county officials and the Texas Association of Counties. Chapter 119 created the County Government Liability Insurance Pool which TAC manages. Through this pool, counties are able to join together to self insure for general, automobile, public officials and law enforcement liability. In this manner, counties can avoid being caught in any future insurance crunch. During 1993, the Legislature amended Chapter 119 to make clear that any political subdivision could participate in the Pool.

Section 119.008 of Chapter 119, Local Government Code, states that coverage, when provided by the TAC Risk Management Pool, is not insurance for purposes of any statute of the State. Rather the fund provides coverage on a self insured basis, through an interlocal agreement (The Interlocal Cooperation Act - Chapter 791, Texas Government Code) which is not subject to competitive bidding requirements.

Authority for the Risk Management Pool's operation is detailed in Chapter 504 of the Texas Labor Code, Article 715C Vernon's Civil Statutes. Current legislative authority is continued in Chapter 2259, Government Code.

Reinsurance

Excess insurance is purchased by each fund to respond to losses once individual claims exceed a certain size. This is referred to as specific excess insurance. For the Workers' Compensation Coverage this is \$1,000,000 per claim and for the Public Officials/Law Enforcement coverages, reinsurance is provided above the pool's self-insured retention, up to the policy limit. For Property coverage, reinsurance, above the pool's self-insurance retention, is also procured.

Expense Savings

Expense savings are realized from reduced administrative expenses, more cost efficient loss control and safety programs and economies of scale due to group purchasing power. The investment income earned on the premium and loss (claims) reserve funds is another source of revenue to the Pool.

Actuarial Projections

The rate which claims are paid out for workers' compensation and liability claims can be estimated from industry average and from Pool experience. Workers' compensation claims are referred to as "long-tail" claims and may take up to 15 or more years to be totally paid and closed. Liability claims are also "long-tail" and frequently take seven or more years to be fully closed. Actuarial analysis of pool data is utilized to determine funding level required to provide the money to satisfy liabilities for these long-tail claims and to determine rates that must be charged to each member for Pool solvency.

Financial Management

Financial management of the pool is extremely important since the reserve for claims are held for many years. A 1% increase in the rate of return can make a big difference. The rate of return attained by TAC is a primary reason members enjoy such good pricing for their Pool participation.

Loss Prevention

A vital part of each pool's program is analysis of hazards for pool members and providing loss prevention expertise. The pool management is in a position to know the activities and hazards of the members better than anyone from the commercial insurance industry, and is in a position to develop and recommend loss prevention techniques suited to conditions of the membership.

Claims Management

Control of claims can be viewed as another aspect of loss prevention, at least as important as the others, and calls for professional staff overview. In-house adjusters at TAC oversee claims administrating companies that were selected on the basis of background, skills and their ability to provide cost effective claims adjusting services.

Safety Specialist - Ernesto Galindo

Personnel Assistance Services

Overview

The employer-employee relationship has become far more complex in recent decades because of legislation, court decisions, and a changing attitude in the workforce. Counties are finding that any adverse action is taken against an employee creates the potential for a lawsuit. In many cases, employment related lawsuits are lost, not because of what was done, but how it was done. Using good personnel and general management practices not only reduce the potential for such lawsuits, but can also form the basis for defense if one is filed.

Services

To assist counties in meeting the challenges of the today's employer-employee relationship, the Texas Association of Counties has assembled a team of human resource professionals to provide a wide range of services to counties in the various self insurance pools administered by the Association. Among the services offered are:

- **Technical Assistance** An Association human resource professional will be available to help with specific questions and problems.
- **Information Service** Information on regulations, statutes, and general management practices is promptly supplied to pool members.
- Special Projects Guidance and direct assistance in developing policy manuals, job descriptions, and other major projects is part of the overall services.
- On-site Training Training on a full spectrum of personnel and general management issues can be brought into the county.
- Video Library A lending library on key personnel and management issues is maintained for pool members.

Safety & Law Enforcement Liability Assistance Services

Overview

Since the inception of the Texas Association of Counties, The TAC board which is made up of elected county officials has expressed a high interest in improvement of safety in Texas Counties. This is of primary importance members of the various self-insurance funds which are owned by these pool members and administered by TAC Staff.

Through consistent pool-wide attention to liability and safety issues, we've found that pool

Through consistent pool-wide attention to liability and safety issues, we've found that pool members enjoy reduced Workers' Compensation rates and increased productivity, professionalism, and employee morale. Our services address preventive measures dealing with County liability and risk, focused heavily on employee safety.

Services

To help pool members with their safety and liability loss control efforts, TAC staff can provide the following services to pool members.

On-Site Assistance – the following activities are typical services we provide our pool members.

- Meetings and Presentations with Elected Officials/Department heads to establish support for Program
- Walk-Through Surveys and Hazard Identification
- Safety Program/Policy Reviews
- Accident Review and Analysis
- Goal Setting and Action Planning

On-Site Training – training from TAC is targeted primarily at the staff of member entities who administer the safety/loss control programs, however, for those members with limited resources, we can provide some direct training to employee. Topics TAC generally trains on include:

- Loss Control Committee Training
- Accident Investigation
- Hazard Communication
- Back Injury Prevention
- Hazard Identification and Inspections
- Ergonomics and Carpal Tunnel Syndrome
- Safety for Supervisors

Other Technical Assistance and Services

Other services offered through our safety representatives include:

- Assistance with policies
- General assistance with regulatory issues regarding safety and liabilities
- Consulting on safety operations, technical information, etc.
- Free safety video loan library for pool members.

Special Services Available (if needed)

Regulatory Assistance

- Free assistance as a "Professional Safety Source" in the event the County is involved in "Extra Hazardous Employer" situations with the Texas Workers' Compensation Commission.
- Free assistance with "Hazard Communication Program" as enforced by the Texas Department of Health.

Special Technical Assistance

- Workplace Ergonomic Evaluations
- Indoor Air Quality Evaluations
- Industrial Hygiene assistance such as basic level air contaminant sampling and noise sampling surveys.
- Driving simulator training program If high losses are identified in the area of vehicle accidents, TAC may opt to use this program enhance the ability of drivers in making proper decisions during driving operations.

Loss Control Resources and Educational Opportunities

- Regional Loss Control Workshops held annually in approximately 16 locations throughout Texas
- Regional Law Enforcement Workshops are provided throughout Texas and usually deal with liability and operational issues regarding your law enforcement agency or jail.
- County Management Institute TAC's three day professional development conference for county officials and employees.
- TAC Safety, Law Enforcement, and Personnel Video Loan Library See TAC Safety Resource Catalog. This includes payroll envelope stuffers, safety posters, and other information. Starting in year 2000, selected videos were approved for TCLEOSE training hours for Law Enforcement.

CLAIMS REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Property and Auto Physical Damage Coverage – These claims are handled to conclusion "in house" by a TAC adjuster. Outside independent field adjusters are sometimes assigned to make visual inspection of severe losses. Report property losses as soon as practical to the TAC claims department at 1-800-456-5974.

Auto Liability and General Liability Coverage – These claims should also be reported to the TAC claims department. AL and GL forms can be printed from the TAC Web site. Notification of a claim can be verbally reported. Most claims will be assigned to our current claims contractor, Sedgewick CMI Risk Managers for a complete review and resolution. Claims status questions can be answered by calling the contractor at 1-800-500-8595.

Public Officials and Law Enforcement Liability Coverage – TAC claims department at 1-800-456-5974 will also take verbal reports regarding this coverage. Any correspondence indicating a possible claim will be accepted as notice of a potential claim or lawsuit. Professional Claims Managers Inc. will be assigned to handle the file to conclusion. Questions regarding a particular case can be made to PCM at 1-800-557-0797.

Workers' Compensation – TAC's current third party administrator is JI Specialty Company in Austin. Claims should be reported directly to them at 1-800-752-6301. First reports of injury maybe mailed to P.O. Box 160120, Austin, TX 78716 or sent by fax to 1-888-853-8755. Electronic submission on the JI Web site will soon be available.

Under this agreement, political subdivisions create and contribute to a pool as an alternative to commercial insurance markets

RISK MANAGEMENT POOLWORKERS' COMPENSATION COVERAGE

- I. <u>PURPOSE</u> The Texas Association of Counties Risk Management Pool Workers' Compensation Coverage was established in 1974. As a Non-Profit and tax exempt program, the Fund is able to make workers' compensation coverage available to counties and county related entities at the lowest prudent cost. The Fund is governed by an eleven (11) member Board of Trustees made up of county officials.
- II. ENABLING LEGISLATION The Pool is designed to fully comply with Chapter 504 of the Texas Labor Code (formerly Article 8309h, Vernon's Annotated Civil Statutes as amended by the 73rd Regular Session of the Texas Legislature). This legislation authorizes local political subdivisions to contract with each other through an Interlocal Agreement to jointly self insure the payment of workers' compensation benefits.
- III. PARTICIPATION The Pool is the largest provider of workers' compensation coverage to Texas counties. Currently over 200 of the 254 Texas counties are members of the Pool. Over 100 county-related entities (appraisal districts, hospital districts, etc.) also belong to the Pool. The high participation is due to low premiums and excellent claim service.
- IV. WORKERS' COMPENSATION COVERAGES Participation in the Pool provides the member with the following coverages: Coverage A (Workers' Compensation) Meets the limits set by law. Coverage B (Employer Liability) \$1,000,000 per occurrence. United States Longshoreman & Harbor Workers' Coverage and all state coverage is also included. Coverage for volunteers, jurors, and election personnel is available upon request.
- V. <u>CLAIM SERVICE</u> The Pool has contracted with JI Special Risks Insurance Agency, Inc., in Austin, Texas to process claims. To assist members, the claims office can be reached by a TOLL-FREE number (1-800-541-5477). A report of claim activity is provided quarterly.
- VI. LOSS CONTROL The Pool has established a safety and loss control program to help members reduce injury to their employees. The safety and loss control program gives members the opportunity to have substantial control over their premiums. As opposed to an insurance company's safety program that has to be general enough to meet the needs of a wide range of policy holders, the Pools' safety and loss control program was specifically designed to meet the particular needs of county government. The safety program is offered at no additional cost.
- VII. <u>INVESTMENTS</u> Available funds are invested according to the investment policy adopted by the Risk Management Pool Board of Trustees.

- VIII. <u>BOARD OF TRUSTEES</u> The Trustees control all aspects of the Pool on behalf of the participating members. The Trustees are responsible for authorizing expenditures, declaring dividends, providing annual audit, selecting service providers, etc. The Trustees are: Hon. FY 2008 (October 1, 2007—September 30, 2008) NIMS Compliance Objectives for States, Territories, Tribal Nations and Local Governments

Introduction

Homeland Security Presidential Directive 5 (HSPD-5) *Management of Domestic Incidents* called for the establishment of a single, comprehensive national incident management system. As a result, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security released the National Incident Management System (NIMS) in March 2004. NIMS provides a systematic, proactive approach guiding departments and agencies at all levels of government, the private sector, and nongovernmental organizations to work seamlessly to prepare for, prevent, respond to, recover from, and mitigate the effects of incidents, regardless of cause, size, location, or complexity, in order to reduce the loss of life, property, and harm to the environment. This consistency provides the foundation for implementation of the NIMS for all incidents, ranging from daily occurrences to incidents requiring a coordinated Federal response. The NIMS document, as revised in 2007, reflects contributions from stakeholders and lessons learned during recent incidents.

States and territories play an important role in ensuring effective NIMS implementation; not only must they implement NIMS within State and territory Departments and Agencies, but also ensure that the systems and processes are in place to communicate and support NIMS compliance at all jurisdictional levels. In some instances, when tribal nations or local government may not have the resources to implement all NIMS elements on their own, States and territories should support their efforts by encouraging them to cooperate with other localities in their regions and pool their resources to implement NIMS.

The long-term goal of NIMS is to provide a consistent framework for all aspects of emergency management and incident response. This framework should be sustainable, flexible, and scalable to meet changing incident needs and allow for integration of other resources from various partners through mutual aid agreements and/or assistance agreements.

FYs 2005-2007 NIMS Compliance Objectives

On September 8, 2004, a letter to the Nation's Governors detailed the initial steps that States, territories, tribal nations and local governments needed to take to implement NIMS. The activities, now objectives, outlined in that letter provide the foundation for current NIMS compliance. Since that time, the Incident Management Systems Division (IMSD) continues to expand on this foundation and add additional objectives—each developed to enhance the way incidents are managed at all levels of government.

Prior to Fiscal Year (FY) 2007, IMSD required States and territories to self-certify their NIMS compliance. Beginning in FY 2007, NIMS compliance was determined by State, territory, tribal nation and local government responses to performance-based "metrics". IMSD developed these compliance metrics from previously-required implementation objectives specified in the FY 2006 NIMS Implementation Matrix for States and Territories and the FY 2006 NIMS Implementation Matrix for Tribal Governments and Local Jurisdictions. Additionally, the NIMS Compliance Assistance Support Tool (NIMSCAST) has been expanded to incorporate these metrics as well as provide stakeholders with a way to collect and report data relating to NIMS implementation and compliance. IMSD will analyze this data to help shape the future of its NIMS compliance program.

NIMS Compliance in FY 2008

As we move into FY 2008, State, territory, tribal nations, and local governments will address specific compliance objectives, which will outline necessary actions to be accomplished in FY 2008. As with FY 2007 implementation activities, each objective will have corresponding metrics that address expected achievements for FY 2008 and out years. The FY 2008 metrics will clearly outline year end expectations, while out-year metrics will provide actions that can be implemented in FY08 or addressed in the future.

The out-year metrics will allow stakeholders to work within their current level of NIMS implementation and compliance and move ahead in implementation objectives. In FY 2008, there are 16 new NIMS Compliance Objectives for States and Territories and 15 new objectives for Tribal Nations and Local Governments.
