Rusty West, pastor of Hillister Assembly of God, delivered the invocation. Judge Blanchette led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioner Nash motioned to purchase a Cat.924 Loader through the "Buy Board"; and, to adopt the resolution concerning the purchase and financing of this equipment for Road & Bridge, Pct. #1. A down payment of \$50,000 will leave \$75,915 to be financed through Caterpillar Financial Services Corp. Commissioner Walston seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED RESOLUTION

Judge Blanchette motioned to approve the Commissioners Court minutes of January 4th, February 12, 21, 28, April 14, 18, 28, 29, and 30th on the consent agenda. Commissioner Walston seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by **Commissioner Walston** to approve the remaining items of the consent agenda; and, to table consideration of the County Auditor's report:

County Probation monthly reports

County Clerk monthly report

County Treasurer monthly report

County Treasurer monthly report

The motion was seconded by **Commissioner Nash**. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED REPORTS.

One proposal was received from a construction manager for the **JB Best building**, being from Timberline Construction in Lufkin. **Commissioner Nash** motioned to table consideration, for further study, until Friday, May 16th. **Commissioner Walston** seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.

Judge Weatherford, Justice of Peace, Pct. #1, reminded the court of legislation that passed increasing the jurisdiction of his court, thus increasing the workload. He requested his part-time position become a full time position. In order to review this with the County Auditor, Commissioner Walston motioned to table consideration until Friday, May 16th. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Marshall. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Nash motioned to approve paying for travel to the NetData User's conference held on April 1-3,2008, from the J.P. Technical Fund. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Marshall. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Walston motioned to table, until Friday, May 16th, consideration of selecting an engineering firm and grant administrator for the CDBG Water Project, until a committee could review and score the proposals. Commissioner Nash seconded this motion. All voted yes and none no. Commissioner Nash motioned to appoint the committee being: Commissioner Walston, Judge Blanchette and Trey Daywood, General Manager for Tyler County Water Supply Corp. Commissioner Marshall seconded the motion. All voted yes.

Laura Scyrkels, representative of Thompson Reuters, presented a cost savings of aprx. \$3000 for converting the **law library** from hardcopy books to an online service. Joe Smith wanted to keep the Vernon's Black Statutes in hardcopy at his office, in case of the computer being out of service. The yearly renewal cost would be at a 2% increase. **Commissioner Walston** motioned to approve the contract with Thompson Reuter for a combination of hardcopy/online service. **Commissioner Marshall** seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED CONTRACT.

Commissioner Marshall stated that due to 1) problems with road maintenance and, 2) cost of hiring a brick mason in event of county equipment damaging the mailbox, he motioned to decline permitting the constructing of brick mailboxes in front of residential or commercial property. Commissioner Walston added there was not enough right-of-way for county equipment to maneuver; therefore the brick structure would likely be damaged. Also, the State highway department does not allow this type of mailboxes. Joe Smith advised setting requirements and/or restrictions for mailboxes on county roads. Commissioner Marshall withdrew his motion and motioned to table consideration of this matter until Friday, May 16th. Commissioner Nash seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Marshall motioned to approve the Supplemental Agreement No. 1 to Easement No. DACW63-2-82-0744 Town Bluff Lake to keep drainage open. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Nash. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED.

Clint Sturrock, representing the Little League Board, reported the possibility of getting grant funding for waste management repairs to the facility at the Little League ball park. The park had damaged caused by Hurricane Rita, that had not been addressed. This funding would be through the 2008 Summer Youth and Senior Citizens Recovery SSBG Program. Clint stated the application would disclose the Little League being a private non-profit organization not owned by the county. Commissioner Nash motioned to approve the submission of a grant application, upon review of legal issues and approval by Joe Smith that Tyler County tax dollars would not be co-mingled with a private organization. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Walston. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED

Jerry Dean reported the County Auditor had not received a bid list nor specifications to mail out for bids for a control panel for the **Tyler County jail**. Therefore, no bids were received. Joe Smith stated the state prison might assist with this construction. No action was taken.

A motion was made by Judge Blanchette and seconded by Commissioner Nash to proclaim May 25-31st as "Hurricane Awareness Week". All voted yes and none no. Evonne Cooke with the American Red Cross reported the workshops she had planned to facilitate preparedness for disasters. SEE ATTACHED PROCLAMATION

Item #14- Executive session was not held. No discussion nor action was taken.

INFORMATIONAL REPORTS:

Shannon Chambers - County 4H was planning a benefit dance for Brandy Racy. She is a 4H member and her late sister, Mykee was a Clover Kid.

District Attorney- it was a possibility the 2008 Summer Youth Disaster Recovery SSBG grant could be used to for repairs caused by Hurricane Rita to the Rodeo Arena

County Clerk- the Ivanhoe incorporation measure failed in Saturdays election. Results were 184 for and 212 votes against. The City of Woodville had remitted \$450 for rental of the county's election equipment.

County Judge- read a thank you note from the Beaumont Convention Visitors Bureau. He had also received correspondence from Sue Wood concerning the intersection of hwy 92 and Hwy 190. Commissioner Nash reported he had talked to the Highway Department engineer about the intersection. Judge Blanchette thanked Commissioner Marshall for the work he had done to the County Airport.

Commissioner Marshall- inquiry concerning the "round II" grant money for county bridges

A motion was made by Commissioner Walston that the meeting adjourn. Commissioner Marshall seconded the motion. All voted yes

LESSEE'S AUTHORIZING RESOLUTION

Whereas, Tyler County, TX (the "Governmental Entity"), a body politic and corporate duly organized and existing as a political subdivision, municipal corporation or similar public entity of the State of Texas (the "State"), is authorized by the laws of the State to purchase, acquire and lease personal property for the benefit of the Governmental Entity and its inhabitants and to enter into contracts with respect thereto; and

Whereas, in order to acquire such equipment, the Governmental Entity proposes to enter into a lease-purchase transaction pursuant to that certain Governmental Equipment Lease-Purchase Agreement (the "Agreement") with Caterpillar Financial Services Corporation, the form of which has been presented to the governing body of the Governmental Entity at this meeting:

Now, Therefore, Be It And It Is Hereby Resolved:

Section 1. Approval of Documents. The form, terms and provisions of the Agreement and all other schedules and exhibits attached thereto are hereby approved in substantially the form presented at this meeting, with such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by counsel of the Governmental Entity or other members of the governing body of the Governmental Entity executing the same, the execution of such documents being conclusive evidence of such approval; and the persons holding the titles listed below or any other officer of the Governmental Entity who shall have the power to execute contracts on its behalf are hereby authorized and directed to execute, acknowledge, countersign and deliver the Agreement and all exhibits attached thereto, and the Secretary/Clerk of the Governmental Entity is hereby authorized to attest to the foregoing and affix the seal of the Governmental Entity to such documents.

Section 2. Other Actions Authorized. The officers and employees of the Governmental Entity shall take all action necessary or reasonably required by the parties to the Agreement to carry out, give effect to and consummate the transactions contemplated thereby and to take all action necessary in conformity therewith, including, without limitation, the execution and delivery of any closing and other documents required to be delivered in connection with the Agreement.

Section 3. No General Liability. Nothing contained in this Resolution, the Agreement, or any other instrument shall be construed with respect to the Governmental Entity as incurring a pecuniary liability or charge upon the general credit of the Governmental Entity or against its taxing power, nor shall the breach of any agreement contained in this Resolution, the Agreement, or any other instrument or document executed in connection therewith impose any pecuniary liability upon the Governmental Entity or any charge upon its general credit or against its taxing power, except to the extent that the payments payable under the Agreement are special limited obligations of the Governmental Entity as provided in the Agreement.

SUPPLEMENTAL AGRESMENT NO. 1 TO EASIMENT NO. DACW63-2-82-0744 TOWN BLUFF LAKE, TEXAS

This Supplemental Agreement No. 1 to Easement No. DACW63-2-82-0744, made and entered into by and between the Secretary of the Army and Tyler County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, 300 West Bluff, Woodville, TX 75979, hereinafter referred to as Grantee:

WITHESSETE:

whereas, on 28 June 1982, Secretary of the Army granted to Tyler County, a political subdivision of the State of Texas, the above mentioned Easement at Town Bluff Lake, Tyler County, Texas, as more specifically described in said easement; and

WHEREAS, Grantee has requested an amendment to the existing easement to include three drainage ditches and maintenance of these ditches.

MCW, THEREFORE, Easement No. DACW63-2-82-0744 is hereby amended in the following respects only:

1. Delete from the Granting Clause of the original easement the following words, "hereinafter designated as the grantee, an easement for a right-of-way for a road, or street over, across, in, and upon lands of the United States," and substitute in lieu thereof, hereinafter designated as the grantee, an easement for a right of way for a road or street, with three drainage ditches approximately 250 yards in length, 10 feet wide and 3 feet deep, and the necessary maintenance of these structures, containing approximately 0.4 acres, hereinafter referred to as the facilities, over, across, in and upon the lands of the United States as identified as Tracts B-138 and B-113 and as shown in Exhibit A, attached hereto and made a part hereof, hereinafter referred to as the premises.

- Add Clause #13 titled "Added Conditions" to the original easement with the following words;
 - a. Trench excavations must be monitored by Corps of Engineers personnel.
 - b. If cultural resources are found, work must stop at that location and the district archaeologist must be notified at 817/886-1573.
 - a. All work must be coordinated with the Town Bluff Lake office prior to construction activities at 409/429-3491.

EXCEPT for the revisions above, the terms and conditions of the easement shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.


