Commissioner Nash delivered the invocation and led the pledge of allegiance to the Texas flag.

Members of the court had not received the court minutes by email. Therefore there was no action taken.

Commissioner Walston made a motion to approve the revised Local Prosecuting Agreement Contract with TX Health & Human Services Commission, as requested by Joe Smith. Commissioner Marshall seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED

A motion was made by **Commissioner Hughes** to approve the purchase of a used Sharp AR-M257 Digital Copier from Texas Imaging System for use in the **jail**. The cost is \$997.50 plus .007 per copy. **Commissioner Walston** seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED.

Sheriff Hennigan requested the purchase of a **Chevrolet Tahoe Police Package** through the buy-board with the addition of a towing package for \$600. Judge Blanchette as the chief budget officer has looked into availability of funds for this request. He found the revenues were down by 18 percent at this time; that the county has not had the revenue coming in that was anticipated. He recommended deferring this request for another quarter. Another option he found could be that the sheriff could use his discretionary funds to make the purchase with the county contributing to the difference. Commissioner Walston added that one of the prisoner's case was creating a large drain on the contingency fund. Judge Blanchette advised taking request such as these through the County Auditor so she can do some "homework" of finding funds for the request. A motion was made by **Judge Blanchette** to table this matter for further study. The motion was seconded by **Commissioner Walston**. All voted yes and none no.

Commissioner Nash made a motion to proclaim April as Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hughes. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED PROCLAMATION

**Judge Blanchette** motioned to proclaim April 10-16<sup>th</sup> as National Crime Victim's Rights Week. The motion was seconded by **Commissioner Walston**. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED PROCLAMATION

A motion was made by **Commissioner Walston** and seconded by **Commissioner Nash** to accept the resignation of Caroline Moore from the **Tyler County Emergency Service District #6 (Fred).** All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED

**Commissioner Walston** made a motion to appoint Douglas Miranda to serve the unexpired term of Caroline Moore, being from April 15<sup>th</sup> to December 31, 2011. **Commissioner Marshall** seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED

Lynnette Cruse, Tax Assessor/Collector reported that she would be able to get the **phone** system repaired for the tax office. No action was taken.

The County Treasurer, Sharon Fuller, voiced her concern about the clause in the depository bid that states if deposited funds drop below 7 million dollars the bank would institute bank charges and fees. Steve Ernest addressed this concern by stating that if the county moved money to another institution, the charges would be assessed. But if the reason was because of the economy that funds fell below 7 million, the bank would look at if differently. Joe Smith advised this needed to be made clear in the contract. A motion was made by **Commissioner Walston** to table action on the bank depository for further study. **Commissioner Nash** seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED.

A motion was made by **Commissioner Nash** to pay the **bills. Commissioner Walston** seconded the motion. Mrs. Skinner announced these bills include the payment for one Tahoe as approved in January 2011. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED

Line item transfers and budget amendments were not presented. No action was taken.

Due to the county receiving federal grants, an audit firm needs to keep up with the required reporting so the county does not lose the grant funding. Judge Blanchette recommended the court accept a local firm for the outside audit. Commissioner Walston remembered the local firm wanted more money for an audit performed in the past. Joe Smith clarified that it was because the information was not given to them and they had to go to each office which took longer. **Commissioner Hughes** motioned to accept Belt, Harris & Associates to perform the outside audit for 2010. The motion was seconded by **Judge Blanchette.** Commissioner Marshall expressed the firm that audits the county now had received awards of excellence, but he did not have a problem with Belt, Harris & Associates. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED

Commissioner Walston made a motion to accept all bids for road materials, culverts, bridge materials; and, cracked fuel oil to Bryan and Bryan. He explained it was cheaper for the commissioners to make purchases due to location. Commissioner Nash seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by **Commissioner Nash** to reject bids for **petroleum products**. **Commissioner Walston** seconded the motion. The bid price was 17 cents above rack price and the county currently pays 4 cents above rack price. All voted yes and none no.

A motion was made by **Commissioner Marshall** and seconded by **Commissioner Walston** to open the bids for a used articulating 4-wheel drive rubber tired wheel loader.
All voted yes and none no. Bids were received from ROMCO Equipment Co. and Doggett Machinery Services.

Joe Smith left the meeting at 9:30 a.m. Court took a 10 minutes recess. Court back in session at 9:44 a.m.:

Commissioner Marshall made a motion to award the bid to Doggett Machinery for the purchase of a used articulating 4-wheel drive rubber tired wheel loader for Road & Bridge #3, in the amount of \$115,000. Commissioner Hughes seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED BIDS.

A motion was made by **Commissioner Nash** and seconded by **Commissioner Marshall** to adopt the resolution supporting a feasibility study for the Gulf Coast Strategic Highway Coalition for US-190/I-10 Interregional Route. All voted yes and none no. SEE ATTACHED RESOLUTION

A motion was made by **Commissioner Marshall** and seconded by **Commissioner Nash** to table consideration of the appointment to the elected official position on the Tri-County Community Action Board, for further study. All voted yes and none no.

Judge Blanchette commended Dale Freeman on the job he had already done, in an interim status, for the county in the Emergency Management field. He then motioned to appoint Dale Freeman as the Emergency Management Coordinator. Commissioner Walston seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.

No action was taken to rescind the order prohibiting outdoor burning.

Eleanor Holderman and Mary Nell Rainey presented an update on the Tyler County Historical Commission. The historical commission, in conjunction with the Heritage Society, is doing a history of Tyler County in pictures, which is presently at the publishers. The royalties will be split 50/50. The historical commission will dedicate their portion to the courthouse restoration project. The books will cost \$ 21.95 and will be available in October. They announced the Hart-Mill Cemetery dedication will be April 30<sup>th</sup>.

The first quarter constable report was presented by Jim Zachary, Constable, Pct. #4. SEE ATTACHED REPORT

Commissioner Nash made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Walston seconded the motion. All voted yes and none no.

#### **GENERAL CONDITIONS:**

- 1. Parties. The Texas Health and Human Services Commission Office of Inspector General ("HHSC-OIG"), and Tyler County District Attorney, ("the Local Prosecuting Authority"), and Tyler County ("the County"), hereinafter referred to as "the parties", do hereby make and enter into this agreement ("Agreement"). This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties. The parties agree that, for the purposes of this Agreement, all references to "Health and Human Services Commission" or "HHSC" mean the administrative agency within the executive department of Texas state government established under Chapter 531, Texas Government Code or its designee. All references to "Health and Human Services Commission Office of Inspector General," "HHSC-OIG," or "OIG" mean the Office within HHSC as established in section 531.008(c) and described in 531.101, et seq, Texas Government Code.
- 2. Authority to enter Agreement. This Agreement is entered into as authorized under Texas Government Code § 531.039 and Texas Government Code § 41.004. HHSC-OIG is acting pursuant to a duly authorized delegation of contracting authority.
- 3. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. Unless otherwise mutually agreed in writing, venue for suit against HHSC-OIG will be in state District Court, Travis County, Texas.
- **4. Term.** The term of this Agreement becomes effective upon signatures of both parties, and continues until and unless revoked by the parties.
- **5. Purpose.** The purpose of the Local Prosecuting Authority Agreement is to establish the terms and conditions for the purpose of assisting to defray the costs of prosecutions, as authorized by Texas Government Code section 41.004(b) in the course of the referral of cases from HHSC-OIG to the Local Prosecuting Authority.

#### CONTRACTED COMPONENTS OF SERVICES:

#### 6. HHSC-OIG Responsibilities.

- A) OIG shall investigate allegations of fraud, waste, and abuse in the following programs: Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF), Food Stamps (FS), Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Medicaid, Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP).
- B) If OIG discovers criminal conduct may have been committed, OIG shall complete and submit written reports and relevant evidence to the Local Prosecuting Authority to facilitate its prosecutorial decision.
- C) OIG shall provide the necessary records and staff as resources to the Local Prosecuting Authority at such time cases are prosecuted.
- D) As provided for in 1 TAC 357.661, HHSC shall pay the County and the Local Prosecuting Attorney in which the Local Prosecuting Authority has jurisdiction, the following amounts in accordance with this Agreement:
  - 1) \$280 for each case in which a Defendant is sentenced following an uncontested plea in a court of appropriate jurisdiction.

2) \$678 for each case in which a verdict is rendered in favor or against a Defendant in a contested trial before a court of competent jurisdiction.

#### 7. Local Prosecuting Authority Responsibilities.

- A) The Local Prosecuting Authority shall review and evaluate cases referred by OIG for appropriate judicial action.
- B) The Local Prosecuting Authority shall prepare complaints, information or indictments in cases it accepts for prosecution.
- C) If community supervision is to be granted in a case, the Local Prosecuting Authority shall (to the extent it finds them to be appropriate in its sole legal and policy judgment) recommend the following actions be taken in addition to any other conditions of community supervision:
  - 1) The individual be disqualified from participation in the TANF, and SNAP program as provided in Section 6(b) of the Federal Food Stamp Act of 1977 and from participation in the WIC program as provided in Title 7 Code of Federal Regulations 246.9 and 246.12(u).
  - 2) The individual be ordered to make restitution to the Texas Health and Human Services Commission, Office of the Inspector General for the amount of benefits unlawfully obtained.
  - 3) Take appropriate action against individuals who fail to comply with court ordered restitution upon notification from the Department.
- D) The Local Prosecuting Authority shall make available at reasonable times and for reasonable periods, books, records, and supporting documents kept current by the Local Prosecuting Authority pertaining to this Agreement, for purposes of inspecting, monitoring, auditing, or evaluating by HHSC-OIG, its representatives, the U.S. Department of Agriculture, or the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.
- **8. Performance Measures.** The Parties shall use their best efforts to perform the responsibilities of this Agreement and the Parties agree:
  - A) Referrals of cases from OIG to the Local Prosecuting Authority shall be made as soon as practical after any investigation is completed.
  - B) The Local Prosecuting Authority shall utilize its own independent legal judgment in the manner which it conducts any criminal proceedings involving Defendants.

#### FINANCIAL REQUIREMENTS:

- 9. Conditions of Payment. All payments shall be made to the County and Local Prosecuting Authority after deducting any known previous overpayment made by HHSC-OIG. HHSC-OIG is not obligated to pay for unauthorized services or to pay more than is consistent with federal and state regulations and this agreement.
  - A) The rates listed in paragraph 6(D) above are set by the Code of Federal Regulations and shall be in effect until amended or modified by Congress, in which event HHSC shall notify the County and the Local Prosecuting Authority of such rates and the County and the Local Prosecuting Authority shall have thirty days to agree to the new rates or to terminate this Agreement.
  - B) Local Prosecuting Authority represents that it has sufficient resources to enable the Local Prosecuting Authority to carry out the terms of this Agreement.
  - C) The Local Prosecuting Authority shall recover only once for the services delivered under this Agreement.

    The Local Prosecuting Authority shall not bill for or retain any additional compensation for such services from HHSC or any other entity.
  - D) HHSC-OIG shall pay the County and the Local Prosecuting Authority the service unit rate as indicated herein.

#### 10. Billing Process.

A) The Local Prosecuting Authority shall submit a Health and Human Services Commission State of Texas Purchase Voucher for payment. The Local Prosecuting Authority shall contact the local HHSC-OIG Case

Investigator for instructions on how to prepare and where to mail the voucher.

B) HHSC-OIG reserves the right to review any/all services for compliance with performance measures and adherence to agreed billing rates. OIG staff will make a determination on the sufficiency of the services. Upon final approval, OIG will authorize payment and process all necessary warrant requests.

#### 11. Accounting Records.

A) The Local Prosecuting Authority shall adhere to Generally Accepted Accounting Principles promulgated by the Financial Accounting Standards Advisory Board and follow Department fiscal management policies and procedures in maintaining financial records. (http://www.fasab.gov/accepted.html).

#### 12. Notifications.

The Local Prosecuting Authority shall:

- A) Maintain at all times at least one active electronic mail (email) address for the receipt of agreement-related communications from HHSC-OIG. It is the Local Prosecuting Authority's responsibility to monitor this email address for Agreement-related information.
- B) Maintain current licensure in good standing with the State Bar of Texas and maintain all necessary license requirements.
- C) Notify HHSC-OIG within ten (10) days of receiving notice of any change in the status of a professional license or board certification, and/or of a complaint that has been filed against his/her license, and/or that an investigation of his/her license or board certification has been initiated.
- D) Notify the HHSC Civil Rights Office of any civil rights complaints received relating to its performance under this Agreement. This notice must be delivered no more than ten (10) calendar days after receipt of a complaint. Notice provided pursuant to this section shall be directed to:

## 13. Agreement Contingencies.

- A) The undersigned Parties certify that: the services specified above are necessary and essential for activities that are properly within the statutory functions and programs of the HHSC-OIG; the proposed arrangements serve the interest of efficient and economical administration of state government; the services contracted for are not required by Section 21, Article XVI of the Constitution of Texas to be supplied under a contract awarded to the lowest responsible bidder; and, the selection and award of this contract was made on the basis of demonstrated competence and qualifications to perform the services for a fair and reasonable price.
- B) Limits on Compensation. This Agreement is expressly conditioned on the availability of appropriated funds. All compensation hereunder is contingent upon that availability.
- C) This Agreement is at all times contingent upon the availability and receipt by the Texas Legislature of appropriate funds; Enactment of superseding law or adoption of a superseding rule or policy; and, if funds for this Agreement become unavailable during any budget period, this Agreement may be immediately terminated or reduced by the HHSC-OIG in its sole determination. HHSC-OIG shall notify the Local Prosecuting Authority when it knows that funds for this Agreement will be reduced or eliminated. The Local Prosecuting Authority may terminate the Agreement based upon such notification. If the Local Prosecuting Authority terminates this Agreement based on HHSC-OIG's notice to reduce or eliminate funding, the Local Prosecuting Authority shall notify HHSC-OIG in writing of its intent to terminate the Agreement within fifteen (15) calendar days of receipt of HHSC-OIG's notification. The notice shall contain the actual date of termination and the Local Prosecuting Authority's date of termination shall not be less than ten (10) calendar days from HHSC-OIG's receipt of such notice and it shall not exceed ninety (90) calendar days from the date HHSC-OIG receives such notice.

- D) The Local Prosecuting Authority agrees to comply with state and federal anti-discrimination laws, including without limitation:
  - (1) Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. §2000d et seq.);
  - (2) Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. §794);
  - (3) Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. §12101 et seq.);
  - (4) Age Discrimination Act of 1975 (42 U.S.C. §§6101-6107);
  - (5) Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (20 U.S.C. §§1681-1688);
  - (6) Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996;
  - (7) Food Stamp Act of 1977 (7 U.S.C. §200 et seq.);
  - (8) The HHS agency's administrative rules, as set forth in the Texas Administrative Code, to the extent applicable to this Agreement; and
  - (9) Discovery of a disqualifying debt (state franchise tax, child support, or debt to HHSC or the State of Texas).

## 14. Agreement Changes, Amendments and Renewals.

A) Changes and Amendments. No change, modification, or amendment to the agreement will be effective until approved in writing by the Parties. This agreement together with any approved amendment(s) to this agreement shall be the controlling instrument in case of any dispute relating to the wording of any portion of the agreement or amendment. In the event of any conflict or contradiction between or among the agreement terms and attachments, the documents shall control in the following order of precedence: (1) The final executed Agreement and all amendments thereto; (2) The Agreement Exhibits or Attachments, and all amendments thereto.

#### B) Unilateral Amendments.

- i. HHSC-OIG reserves the right to make unilateral amendments to this agreement when necessary to:
  - a. Incorporate new or revised Federal, State, or Department laws, regulations, rules, or policies;
  - b. Update service level descriptions or unit rates; or
  - c. Comply with a court order or judgment.
- ii. The unilateral amendment shall be effective upon the Local Prosecuting Authority's receipt of a copy of the amendment signed by HHSC-OIG.

## 15. Provisions for Termination of Agreement and Dispute Resolution.

- A) If the Local Prosecuting Authority fails to provide services according to the terms and conditions of this agreement, HHSC-OIG may, upon written notice of default to the Local Prosecuting Authority, terminate all or any part of the agreement. Termination is cumulative of any other rights and remedies provided by law, agency regulations, or under this agreement excluding pending claims for work performed prior to the termination date.
- B) This agreement may be terminated at any time by mutual written consent. In addition, any party may terminate this agreement by giving thirty (30) calendar days written notice to the other parties. This agreement shall be terminated at the end of the thirty (30) calendar day notice period. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to prohibit immediate termination of the agreement pursuant to subsection A of this section, above.
- C) At the end of the agreement term or other agreement termination, the Local Prosecuting Authority shall in good faith and in reasonable cooperation with HHSC-OIG, aid in the transition to any new arrangement or provider of services, including the orderly transition of case files/reviews and all other documentation prepared by the Local Prosecuting Authority. The respective accrued interests or obligations incurred to date of termination must be settled equitably.
- D) Dispute Resolution.
  - i. The dispute resolution process provided for in Chapter 2260 of the Texas Government Code shall be used by HHSC-OIG and the parties to attempt to resolve any claim for breach of agreement.
  - ii. A Local Prosecuting Authority's claim for breach of this agreement that the parties cannot resolve in the ordinary course of business shall be submitted to the negotiation process provided in Texas Government Code §§ 2260.051-2260.056. To initiate the process, the Local Prosecuting Authority shall submit timely written notice to the agreement liaison described in Paragraph 9, supra, with a copy to the

- HHSC Executive Commissioner or his designee. Said notice shall specifically state that the provisions of Chapter 2260, subchapter B, Government Code, are being invoked. A copy of the notice shall also be given to all other representatives of HHSC-OIG and the Local Prosecuting Authority otherwise entitled to notice under this agreement.
- iii. Compliance by the Local Prosecuting Authority with subchapter B is a jurisdictional condition precedent to the filing of a contested case proceeding under Chapter 2260, subchapter C, of the Government Code. The contested case process provided in Chapter 2260, subchapter C, of the Government Code is the Local Prosecuting Authority's sole and exclusive process for seeking a remedy for any and all alleged breaches of agreement by HHSC-OIG if the parties are unable to resolve their disputes through negotiation or mediation.
- iv. Compliance with the contested case process provided in subchapter C is a condition precedent to seeking consent to sue from the Legislature under Chapter 107 of the Civil Practices and Remedies Code. Neither the execution of this agreement by HHSC-OIG nor any other conduct of any representative of HHSC or HHSC-OIG relating to the agreement shall be considered a waiver of sovereign immunity to suit.
- v. The submission, processing and resolution of the Local Prosecuting Authority's claim is governed by the administrative rules adopted by HHSC pursuant to Chapter 2260, Government Code, as currently effective, hereafter enacted or subsequently amended. The parties shall use the specific procedures set forth in 1 Texas Administrative Code Chapters and 394.
- vi. Neither the occurrence of an event nor the pendency of a claim constitutes grounds for the suspension of performance by the Local Prosecuting Authority, in whole or in part.
- 16. Use of Information. The Local Prosecuting Authority, pursuant to its responsibilities under this Agreement, may use or disclose information referred by HHSC-OIG in compliance with applicable statutes, rules and regulations governing the use and disclosure of information relating to cases handled under this Agreement. Such use or disclosure shall be by Local Prosecuting Authority personnel who are personally and directly engaged in, and only to the extent necessary for judicial or administrative proceeding participation or preparation, any investigation which may result in such proceeding or any grand jury proceeding, unless expressly authorized in writing in advance by HHSC-OIG.
  - A) It is expressly understood and agreed that no party waives, nor shall be deemed to have waived, any immunity or defense otherwise available to it under the law.
  - B) This Agreement is not intended, nor shall it be construed, to confer any benefits, rights, or remedies upon any person or entity not a party hereto.
- 17. Cooperation with HHSC and state administrative agencies. The Local Prosecuting Authority agrees to reasonably cooperate with and work with the State's contractors, subcontractors and third-party representatives as requested by HHSC or OIG. To the extent permitted by OIG's financial and personnel resources, OIG agrees to reasonably cooperate with Local Prosecuting Authority.

# TYLER COUNTY DEPOSITORY CONTRACT

2011

#### BANK DEPOSITORY CONTRACT

THIS DEPOSITORY CONTRACT is made and entered into on the date last herein written by and between TYLER COUNTY, TEXAS hereinafter called "DEPOSITOR", and First National Bank, a Texas banking association, organized under the laws of the United States and authorized by law to do banking business in Woodville, Texas and now conducting such business in said Woodville, Texas hereinafter called "BANK".

T.

DEPOSITOR, through action of its Commissioners' Court, hereby designates BANK as a depository for the period beginning 4/15/2011, and continuing through 5/30/2015.

II.

During the term of this depository contract, the DEPOSITOR will, through appropriate action of its Commissioners' Court, designate the officer, or officers, who singly or jointly will authorized to represent and act on behalf of the DEPOSITOR in any and all matters of every kind arising under this Depository Contract and to (a) execute and deliver to BANK an electronic fund or funds transfer agreement (and any addenda thereto), (b) appoint and designate, from time to time, a person or persons who may request withdrawals, orders for payment or transfers on behalf of DEPOSITOR in accordance with the electronic fund or funds transfer agreement and addenda and (c) make withdrawals or transfers by written instrument.

III.

BANK'S Application for Depository Contract is incorporated herein for all purposes; however, to the extent that any provision therein conflicts with any provision herein, this Depository Contract will control.

IV.

DEPOSITOR may arrange for time deposits, and BANK may accept and shall hold such deposits subject to payment in accordance with the terms of the deposit. In the event funds for a time deposit are withdrawn from a transaction or savings account, at maturity, BANK will deposit the principal amount of the time deposit and any accrued interest in the DEPOSITOR's account from which funds were withdrawn to establish the time deposit. Interest shall be calculated at the rate which BANK has bid for the particular denomination and time period of said deposit at competitive public bidding for said deposits. Time deposit maturities will not extend beyond the termination of this Agreement.

BANK will be compensated for any and all services rendered to DEPOSITOR under this Depository contract. BANK agrees to offset monthly service fees against its customary earnings credit for balances in DEPOSITOR's transaction accounts; provided, however that if there is insufficient earnings credit against which such fees may be offset. DEPOSITOR will be charged for such services monthly. BANK's Application and Bid for Depository Services, including all exhibits and addenda thereto, is incorporated herein by reference.

#### VI.

All funds on deposit with BANK to the credit of the DEPOSITOR shall be secured by collateral as provided for in the Public Fund Collateral Act (V.A.T.S. Art. 2529d). The total of the market value of the collateral (plus accrued interest or income to the extent it is not included in such market value obtained as provided herein) securing such deposits will be in amount at least equal to the amount of such deposits increased by the amount of any accrued interest and reduced to the extent that such deposits are insured by an agency or instrumentality of the United States government. The market value with respect to any securities (collateral) as of any date and priced on such date will be obtained from a primary dealer. BANK must receive notification of new deposits prior to 10:30 a.m. on the day deposits are actually received. Twenty-four (24) hours notice is necessary on deposits totaling in excess of \$3,000,000 during any banking business day. However, failure to give such notice does not excuse the BANK from properly securing these deposits in accordance with this agreement and the Public Funds Collateral Act within one (1) business day of the deposit.

#### VII.

BANK has heretofore or will immediately hereafter deliver to FHLB DALLAS or BANK ONE

(hereinafter "Trustee") collateral of the kind and character above mentioned of sufficient amount and market value to provide adequate collateral for the funds of DEPOSITOR deposited with BANK. Said collateral or substitute collateral, as hereinafter provided for, will be kept and retained by TRUSTEE in trust so long as the depository relationship between DEPOSITOR and BANK shall exist hereunder, and thereafter so long as deposits made by DEPOSITOR with BANK hereunder, or any portion thereof, shall have not been properly paid out by BANK to DEPOSITOR or on its order.

VIII.

The "Application to the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas and for the Holding of Securities in Joint Safekeeping" attached hereto is incorporated herein for all purposes, except that the provisions of this contract shall supplement, explain and clarify the provisions of said application as it relates to the relative rights of the parties to this agreement.

IX.

Should BANK fail at any time to pay and satisfy, when due, any check, draft, or voucher lawfully drawn against any deposit and the interest on such deposits, or in case BANK becomes insolvent or in any manner breaches its contract with DEPOSITOR, DEPOSITOR shall give written notice of such failure, insolvency or breach to BANK, and BANK shall have three (3) days to cure such failure, insolvency or breach. In the event BANK shall fail to cure such failure, insolvency or breach within three (3) days, the parties hereto authorize the TRUSTEE to surrender to DEPOSITOR the collateral held by the TRUSTEE upon receipt of a certificate whereby the DEPOSITOR, through its authorized representative, certifies that BANK has failed to perform its obligations under this contract, has other-wise breached this contract or has become insolvent. The BANK agrees and hereby instructs the TRUSTEE that a copy of this agreement attached to the certificate shall serve as the BANK's consent and approval of the release of the collateral to DEPOSITOR. The BANK agrees and is bound to provide any other approvals or consents the TRUSTEE may require in order to release the collateral to DEPOSITOR. The parties further agree that the DEPOSITOR may seek an order or declaration or order of a court of lawful jurisdiction in the event that the BANK does not comply with this provision or in the event the TRUSTEE refuses to surrender the collateral to the DEPOSITOR, with all costs and attorney's fees incurred by DEPOSITOR to be reimbursed by BANK. DEPOSITOR may sell all or any part of such collateral and out of the proceeds thereof, pay DEPOSITOR all damages and losses sustained by it, together with all expenses of any and every kind incurred by it on account of such failure or insolvency, or sale, accounting to BANK for the remainder, if any, of said proceeds or collateral remaining unsold.

X.

Any sale of such collateral, or any part thereof, made by DEPOSITOR hereunder may be either at public or private sale; provided, however, it shall give both TRUSTEE and BANK ten (10) days notice of the time and place where such sale shall take place, and such sale shall be to the highest bidder therefore for cash. DEPOSITOR and BANK shall have the right to bid at such sale.

XI.

If BANK shall desire to sell or otherwise dispose of any one or more of said securities so deposited with TRUSTEE, it may substitute for any one or more of such securities other securities of the same market value and the character authorized herein and by the Public Funds Collateral Act. Such right of substitution shall remain in full force and may be exercised by BANK as often as it may desire; provided, however, that the aggregate

market value of all collateral pledged hereunder, shall be at least equal to the amount of collateral required hereunder and by the Public Funds Collateral Act and other applicable law. If at any time the aggregate market value of such collateral so deposited with TRUSTEE be less than the total sum of the DEPOSITOR's funds on deposit with said BANK, BANK shall immediately deposit with the TRUSTEE such additional collateral as may be necessary to cause the market value of such collateral to equal the total amount of required collateral. BANK shall be entitled to income on securities held by TRUSTEE, unless there is sufficient collateral on deposit with the trustee to cover the public funds as required by law at the time the request is made. Approval of the DEPOSITOR will be required in this circumstance and if the collateral deficiency is not seasonably cured and the DEPOSITOR's consent is not given, the income becomes collateral for public funds to the extent of the collateral deficiency, and DEPOSITOR is authorized to instruct TRUSTEE in writing not to deliver or credit said income to BANK.

#### XII.

It is the intention and desire of the parties to this agreement that the TRUSTEE will promptly forward to DEPOSITOR copies of safekeeping or trust receipts covering all such collateral held as collateral for DEPOSITOR's funds and/or public funds including substitute collateral as provided for herein.

#### XIII.

If at any time the collateral in the hands of TRUSTEE shall have a market value in excess of the sum of balances due DEPOSITOR by BANK, the DEPOSITOR shall authorize the withdrawal of a specified amount of collateral in writing to the TRUSTEE upon written request by BANK.

#### XIV.

Either DEPOSITOR or BANK shall have the right to terminate this Agreement prior to the expiration date by advance written notice to the other of its election to do so, and this Agreement shall be void from and after the expiration of ninety (90) days after the receipt of such notice, provided all provisions of this agreement have been fulfilled.

#### XV.

When the relationship of DEPOSITOR and BANK shall have ceased to exist between DEPOSITOR and BANK, and when BANK shall have properly paid out all deposits of DEPOSITOR, it shall be the duty of DEPOSITOR to give TRUSTEE certificate to that effect and, if all obligations under this agreement and applicable law have been fulfilled, to give the TRUSTEE written approval to redeliver the collateral in its possession to BANK.

This contract is subject to, and incorporates, the current laws governing the relationships between counties, depositories and custodians/trustees and related entities as established by the Texas Local Government Code and the Vernons Annotated Texas Civil Statutes and any amendments or revisions thereto. BANK warrants and represents that it shall comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations which govern or apply to this contract.

#### XVII.

This agreement is entered into and is performable in Woodville, Tyler County, Texas, and the venue of any legal actions or proceeding arising out of or related to this contract, or out of any disputes between the parties concerning the subject matter of this contract or arising out of the violation or application of any law governing the subject matter of this agreement (including but not limited to the Public Funds Collateral Act, Art. 2529d) is placed by agreement of the parties in Woodville, Tyler County, Texas.

All notices, demands, or other writings may be delivered by any party hereto to the other, by United States Mail or other reliable courier at the following addresses:

BANK represents that the collateral pledged to DEPOSITOR is not otherwise assigned, pledged or encumbered and that no lien, or security interests exist other than the security interest held by the DEPOSITOR pursuant to this agreement. Possession of the collateral by the TRUSTEE is intended as perfection of DEPOSITOR's security interest therein. BANK warrants that the collateral (in the form and amount required by law) is held by the TRUSTEE for the benefit of DEPOSITOR and as security for DEPOSITOR's funds.

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# Engagement Letter – Single Audit

We are pleased to confirm our understanding of the services we are to provide Tyler County, Texas (the "County") for the year ended December 31, 2010 with two optional one-year subsequent terms. We will audit the financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information, which collectively comprise the basic financial statements, of the County as of and for the year ended December 31, 2010 with two optional one-year subsequent terms.

Accounting standards generally accepted in the United States provide for certain Required Supplementary Information (RSI), such as Management's Discussion and Analysis (MD&A), to accompany the County's basic financial statements.

As part of our engagement, we will apply certain limited procedures to the County's RSI. These limited procedures will consist principally of inquiries of management regarding the methods of measurement and presentation, which management is responsible for affirming to us in its representation letter. The following RSI is required by generally accepted accounting principles and will be subjected to certain limited procedures, but will not be audited:

- 1. Management's Discussion and Analysis
- 2. Budgetary Comparison Schedules

We will subject the following supplementary information to the auditing procedures applied in our audit of the basic financial statements and will provide an opinion on it in relation to the basic financial statements.

1. Combining and individual fund financial statements

In addition to these services -

- 1. We will also provide routine advisory services through phone calls, conferences or otherwise in connection with incidental matters arising during the year. We encourage open lines of communication throughout the year as part of our services.
- 2. We will draft the financial statements, including the Management's Discussion and Analysis with input from management.

- 3. We will print and bind the financial reports for the County, and provide an electronic PDF copy via email and/or CD of all reports.
- 4. We will handle normal correspondence from grantor, regulatory, or oversight agencies related to the audit.
- 5. We will perform procedures to comply with the Public Funds Investment Act (Chapter 2256 local government code).
- 6. We will make your comprehensive annual financial report conveniently accessible on our website for affiliated organizations to view provided that they accept the legal disclaimer notification.

#### **Audit Objectives**

The objective of our audit is the expression of an opinion as to whether your financial statements are fairly presented, in all material respects, in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles and to report on the fairness of the additional information referred to in the first paragraph when considered in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole. The objective also includes reporting on the following:

- Internal control related to the financial statements and compliance with laws, regulations, and the provisions of contracts or grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a material effect on the financial statements in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*.
- Internal control related to major programs and an opinion (or disclaimer of opinion) on compliance with laws, regulations, and the provisions of contracts or grant agreements that could have a direct and material effect on each major program in accordance with the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996 and OMB Circular A-133, Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations.

The reports on internal control and compliance will each include a statement that the report is intended for the information and use of the audit committee, management, specific legislative or regulatory bodies, federal awarding agencies, and if applicable, pass-through entities and is not intended to be and should not be used by anyone other than these specified parties.

Our audit will be conducted in accordance with U.S. generally accepted auditing standards; the standards for financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States; the Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996; and the provisions of OMB Circular A-133, and will include tests of accounting records, a determination of major program(s) in accordance with Circular A-133, and other procedures we consider necessary to enable us to express such an opinion and to render the required reports. If our opinion on the financial statements or the Single Audit compliance opinion is other than unqualified, we will fully discuss the reasons with you in advance. If, for any reason, we are unable to complete the audit or are unable to form or have not formed an opinion, we may decline to express an opinion or to issue a report as a result of this engagement.

#### **Management Responsibilities**

Management is responsible for establishing and maintaining internal controls, including monitoring ongoing activities; for the selection and application of accounting principles; for the fair presentation in the financial statements of the respective financial position of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the County and the respective changes in financial position and, where applicable, cash f lows in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles; and for federal award program compliance with applicable laws and regulations and the provisions of contracts and grant agreements. Management is responsible for the basic financial statements and all accompanying information as well as all representations contained therein.

You are responsible for management decisions and functions. As part of the audit, we will prepare a draft of your financial statements, schedule of expenditures of federal awards, and related notes. In accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, you will be required to review and approve those financial statements prior to their issuance and have a responsibility to be in a position in fact and appearance to make an informed judgment on those financial statements. Further, you are required to designate a qualified management-level individual to be responsible and accountable for overseeing our services.

Management is responsible for making all financial records and related information available to us, including identifying significant vendor relationships in which the vendor has the responsibility for program compliance and for the accuracy and completeness of that information. Management's responsibilities include adjusting the financial statements to correct material misstatements and for confirming to us in the representation letter that the effects of any uncorrected misstatements aggregated by us during the current engagement and pertaining to the latest period presented are immaterial, both individually and in the aggregate, to the financial statements taken as a whole.

You are responsible for the design and implementation of programs and controls to prevent and detect fraud, and for informing us about all known or suspected fraud or illegal acts affecting the government involving (1) management, (2) employees who have significant roles in internal control, and (3) others where the fraud or illegal acts could have a material effect on the financial statements. Your responsibilities include informing us of your knowledge of any allegations of fraud or suspected fraud affecting the government received in communications from employees, former employees, grantors, regulators, or others. In addition, you are responsible for identifying and ensuring that the entity complies with applicable laws, regulations, contracts, agreements, and grants.. Additionally, as required by OMB Circular A-133, it is management's responsibility to follow up and take corrective action on reported audit findings and to prepare a summary schedule of prior audit findings and a corrective action plan. The summary schedule of prior audit findings should be available for our review prior to the beginning of our audit fieldwork.

Management is responsible for establishment and maintenance of a process for tracking the status of audit findings and recommendations. Management is also responsible for identifying for us previous audits of other engagements or studies related to the objectives discussed in the Audit Objectives section of this letter. This responsibility includes relaying to us corrective actions taken to address significant findings and recommendations resulting from those audits or other engagements or studies. You are also responsible for providing management's views on our current findings, conclusions, and recommendations, as well as your planned corrective actions, and the timing and format related thereto.

#### Audit Procedures - General

An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements; therefore, our audit will involve judgment about the number of transactions to be examined and the areas to be tested. We will plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable rather than absolute assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement, whether from (1) errors, (2) fraudulent financial reporting, (3) misappropriation of assets, or (4) violations of laws or governmental regulations that are attributable to the entity or to acts by management or employees acting on behalf of the entity. Because the determination of abuse is subjective Government Auditing Standards do not expect auditors to provide reasonable assurance of detecting abuse.

Because an audit is designed to provide reasonable, but not absolute assurance and because we will not perform a detailed examination of all transactions, there is a risk that material misstatements or noncompliance may exist and not be detected by us. In addition, an audit is not designed to detect immaterial misstatements or violations of laws or governmental regulations that do not have a direct and material effect on the financial statements or major programs. However, we will inform you of any material errors and any fraudulent financial reporting or misappropriation of assets that comes to our attention. Our responsibility as auditors is limited to the period covered by our audit and does not extend to any later periods for which we are not engaged as auditors.

Our procedures will include tests of documentary evidence supporting the transactions recorded in the accounts, and may include tests of the physical existence of inventories, and direct confirmation of receivables and certain other assets and liabilities by correspondence with selected individuals, creditors, and financial institutions. We will request written representations from your attorneys as part of the engagement, and they may bill you for responding to this inquiry. At the conclusion of our audit, we will also require certain written representations from you about the financial statements and related matters.

#### **Audit Procedures – Internal Controls**

Our audit will include obtaining an understanding of the entity and its environment, including internal control, sufficient to assess the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements and to design the nature, timing, and extent of further audit procedures. Tests of controls may be performed to test the effectiveness of certain controls that we consider relevant to preventing and detecting errors and fraud that are material to the financial statements and to preventing and detecting misstatements resulting from illegal acts and other noncompliance matters that have a direct and material effect on the financial statements. Our tests, if performed, will be less in scope than would be necessary to render an opinion on internal control and, accordingly, no opinion will be expressed in our report on internal control issued pursuant to *Government Auditing Standards*.

As required by OMB Circular A-133, we will perform tests of controls to evaluate the effectiveness of the design and operation of controls that we consider relevant to preventing or detecting material noncompliance with compliance requirements applicable to each major federal award program. However, our tests will be less in scope than would be necessary to render an opinion on those controls and, accordingly, no opinion will be expressed in our report on internal control issued pursuant to OMB Circular A-133.

An audit is not designed to provide assurance on internal control or to identify significant deficiencies. However, during the audit, we will communicate to management and those charged with governance

internal control related matters that are required to be communicated under professional standards, Government Auditing Standards and OMB Circular A-133.

#### Audit Procedures - Compliance

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement, we will perform tests of the County's compliance with applicable laws and regulations and the provisions of contracts and agreements, including grant agreements. However, the objective of those procedures will not be to provide an opinion on overall compliance and we will not express such an opinion in our report on compliance issued pursuant to *Government Auditing Standards*.

OMB Circular A-133 requires that we also plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the auditee has complied with applicable laws and regulations and the provisions of contracts and grant agreements applicable to major programs. Our procedures will consist of test of transactions and other applicable procedures described in the *OMB Circular A-133 Compliance Supplement* for the types of compliance requirements that could have a direct and material effect on each of the County's major programs. The purpose of those procedures will be to express an opinion on the County's compliance with requirements applicable to each of its major programs in our report on compliance issued pursuant to OMB Circular A-133.

#### Audit Administration, Fees, and Other

We understand that your employees will prepare all cash, accounts receivable, or other confirmations we request and will locate any invoices selected by us for testing.

At the conclusion of the engagement, we will complete the appropriate sections of and sign the Data Collection Form that summarizes our audit findings. We will provide copies of our reports to the County; however, it is management's responsibility to submit the reporting package (including financial statements, schedule of expenditures of federal awards, summary schedule of prior audit findings, auditors' reports, and a corrective action plan) along with the Data Collection Form to the designated federal clearinghouse and, if appropriate, to pass-through entities. The Data Collection Form and the reporting package must be submitted within the earlier of 30 days after receipt of the auditors' reports or nine months after the end of the audit period, unless a longer period is agreed to in advance by the cognizant or oversight agency for audits. At the conclusion of the engagement, we will provide information to management as to where the reporting packages should be submitted and the number to submit.

The audit documentation for this engagement is the property of Belt Harris Pechacek, LLLP and constitutes confidential information. However, pursuant to authority given by law or regulation, we may be requested to make certain audit documentation available to Oversight Agency for Audit or its designee, a federal agency providing direct or indirect funding, or the U.S. Government Accountability Office for purposes of a quality review of the audit, to resolve audit findings, or to carry out oversight responsibilities. We will notify you of any such request. If requested, access to such audit documentation will be provided under the supervision of Robert Belt. Furthermore, upon request, we may provide copies of selected audit documentation to the aforementioned parties. These parties may intend or decide to distribute the copies or information contained therein to others, including other governmental agencies.

The audit documentation for this engagement will be retained for a minimum of five years after the report release or for any additional period requested by the Oversight Agency for Audit. If we are aware that a federal awarding agency, pass-through entity, or auditee is contesting and audit finding, we will contact the party(ies) contesting the audit finding for guidance prior to destroying the audit documentation.

Fees for our services are based on the actual time spent at our standard hourly rates, plus travel and other out-of-pocket costs such as report production, typing, postage, etc. Our standard hourly rates vary according to the degree of responsibility involved and the experience level of the personnel assigned to your audit. The time estimates used to project our fees are based on anticipated cooperation from your personnel and management fulfilling its responsibility, as discussed previously. Our time budget for this engagement does not include addressing matters related to managements' responsibilities, such as modifications to the County's financial information, additional procedures related to alleged noncompliance with laws and regulations and similar improprieties, the County's lack of preparation for the audit, and similar matters. Such time requirements have not been included in the estimate and would be billed in addition to the fees quoted at our standard hourly rates and actual costs incurred, including legal consultations, if necessary. We will notify the appropriate party when such conditions are encountered, such as identifying schedules not prepared, out-of-balance accounts, alleged violations, etc. When possible, we will provide management with options for alleviating the conditions. If it appears the item will not be addressed by the County, we may perform procedures to address incidental matters to facilitate timely completion of the audit. To the extent possible, we will obtain approval before performing additional work for matters considered significant to the original proposed fee. Due to the nature of our work, such approval may not always be possible (i.e., we may be legally compelled by subpoena or similar request to expend additional time and incur other expenses to handle matters arising from this engagement).

Whereas, the geographic triangle in the center of Texas between Houston/Galveston and Dallas/Fort Worth and Austin/San Antonio is expected to see a substantial percentage of this population growth; and

Whereas, the US-190/I-10 interregional route has the potential to answer a significant need for transportation capacity to serve population and commercial growth in this geographic triangle in the center of Texas; and


