



On September 16, 2011, the Commissioners Court, subject to the final approval by the Attorney General, Civil Rights Division, Department of Justice, under section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965 as reenacted in 2006, has adopted the plan to redistrict and redefine the Commissioners precincts as contained in this general description of boundary changes:

Out of Precinct 1, Precinct 2 now takes in the following: At 190 and FM 256 South travels FM 256 South to Big Cypress Creek, then South East on Big Cypress Creek to Timber Road 16, then North East to County Road 1050 to County Road 1020.

Out of Precinct 2, Precinct 3 now extends and follows East Bluff Street to Hwy 69 North, following 69 North to Pine Street, follows Pine Street approximately 1.16 miles for Electric ROW, then Northerly on Electric ROW approximately 0.18 mile, then Southeasterly approximately 469 feet, then East to Hwy 69 N.

No change in Precinct 4.

Out of Precinct 2, Precinct 1 extends from County Road 4250 and County Road 4252 West to Turkey Creek and up to Hwy 190 and FM 1746
