Judge Blanchette opened the hearing to receive comments regarding the **2013 proposed budget**. He announced the court was following the requirements for consideration of the budget cycle and adoption of a tax rate. He gave instructions as to those that may want to make public comments for or against the proposed budget.

The County Judge reported the following requirements have been met:

- The proposed budget had been filed with the County Clerk for public inspection in compliance with Local Government Code Section 111.006
- A public hearing had been set in compliance with Local Government Code Section 111.07
- Notice of the budget hearing has been made in compliance with LGC Section 111.0075

No one signed the sheet to make public comments.

Judge Blanchette stated the Act from 1987 was amended and revised in 2007 (LGC 111.008) and continued to read the action required by that section.

No changes were made to the proposed budget. A motion was made by **Commissioner Walston** and seconded by **Commissioner Marshall** to adopt the **budget for 2013**. Each member voted yes by a voice vote. None voted no.

This budget does not require more revenue from property tax. The court will be acting upon a tax rate, levied at the effective rate, at a later meeting, per Judge Blanchette.

A motion was made by Commissioner Marshall and seconded by Commissioner Nash to adjourn. All voted yes and none no.

The public hearing adjourned and 11:06. a.m.
