A RESOLUTION Acceptance of ARP Funds The County of Tyler

Whereas, the County of Tyler, Texas (hereinafter referred to as "County") has been provided American Rescue Plan funds (SLFRF funding through the U. S. Treasury Department from the ARP Act 2021 Coronavirus Local Recovery Fund.

Whereas, the Act makes provision for an election as per U.S. Treasury regulations. The final rule offers a standard allowance for revenue loss of \$10 million or less, allowing recipients to select between a standard amount of revenue loss or complete a full revenue loss calculation. Recipients that select the standard allowance may use that amount. (The final rule takes effect on April 1, 2022. Until that time, the interim final rule remains in effect; funds used consistently with the IFR while it is in effect are in compliance with the SLFRF program.

Whereas, the County of Tyler, in consideration for the receipt and acceptance of federal funding, agrees to comply with all federal rules and regulations including those rules and regulations of a local, state, and federal nature.

Whereas, the County of Tyler, in accordance with the Act does hereby agree to track such ARP funds for audit purposes and reports.

Whereas, the funding associated with the Program will be based on a funding allocation to the County.

Whereas, no payments for debt service and replacements of rainy day funds; no satisfaction of settlements and judgements; no uses that contravene or violate the American Rescue Plan Act, Uniform Guidance conflicts of interest requirements, and other federal, state, and local laws and regulations shall be incurred.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF TYLER, TEXAS, THAT THE COUNTY OF TYLER ADOPTS/AFFIRMS THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. The County of Tyler does hereby complete its election by vote of the County Commissioners to accept the ARP Funding as a standard allowance for the general fund. Due to Coronavirus SARS-2-2019 and its variants as identified by the CDC. The County will not displace local funds with said ARP funds. Should the County do a Project at a later date, the County will follow the ARP requirements as to federal law, including NEPA, Davis-Bacon and related laws, Equal Opportunity requirements, the use of an engineer as required by Texas law, bid requirements and such other state, local, and federal laws that may apply.
- 2. Under the SLFRF program, funds must be used for costs incurred on or after March 3, 2021. Further funds must be obligated by December 31, 2024, and expended by

December 31, 2026. This time period, during which recipients can expend SLFRF funds, is the "period of performance."
